**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Southwest flow will continue this week with low pressure parked off the coast. Conditions over the fire today will be similar to the past two days with seasonable temperatures and humidity and moderate ridgetop winds. Dry air aloft will remain tonight with ridges and upper slopes again dropping after midnight while the lower slopes and valleys see excellent recovery from the marine influence.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

The Fires main influence has been fuel and topography dominated...driven by dead and down fuels. Fuels burning consist of Shrubs, Timber Litter and Heavy Dead/Down (FM 4, 9, 10). Large dense stands of mixed Conifer are dominant throughout. Live Fuel Moisture is estimated @ 90%. 1000 hr fuels are @ 10%. Headfire has displayed ROS @ 10-16 chains/hr with flame lengths of 8-12 feet. Single/group tree torching has occurred. Short crown fire spread has occurred on the Coon/Bear fire with inversion lifting and a Haines of 5. Heavy fuels are holding large amounts of heat.

ERC is predicted @ 66 today (down 1) and BI is predicted @ 66 (up 13)

.....Local threshold for large growth: 20' winds over 8 mph, RH less than 33%, Temps over 83\*, 1000 hr FM less than 14%, BI/ERC exceeds 41 (refer to Pocket Card in IAP).

Scattered Tree Mortality is around 10%.

Probability of Ignition (shaded) will be 70% into receptive fuels for the better part of the operational period.

#### SPECIFIC

#### All Divisions:

The Fires will continue to display moderate surface fire intensity with the possibility of single/group torching when inversion lifts and ventilation occurs. The forecasted weather will trend towards cooler temps and higher RH's...heavier fuels have dried and will need multiple days to raise fuel moisture levels. Cloud/Smoke cover will shade fuels and decrease solar radiation...shortening burn period...good opportunity to improve and hold lines. Heavy fuels will continue to hold heat until extinguished or consumed. Roll-out of burning material remains high and has led to the growth of the Fires. The potential for single tree torching will remain a threat due to surface fire that has dried aerial fuels. The Fires will have the ability to make uphill runs as slope and winds become into alignment. Be particularly cautious on South, Southwest and Southeast slopes coupled with any southerly wind component. Direct attack along flanks with hose lines and hand crews are favorable. We could see spotting distance of up to ¼ mile at the ridges.

**Coon Fire:** will continue to back and flank towards the South Fork Smith river and Southeast towards Gordon creek. Heads up on fire stacking up and moving with head fire with slope reversal.

**Bear Fire:** will continue to back/flank with uphill runs North towards Siskiyou Fork, West towards Twin Peak, and W-SW toward Bear Mountain.

\*\*\*Heads-up\*\*\*: if visibility improves and skies clear early...fire activity will increase sooner than yesterday.

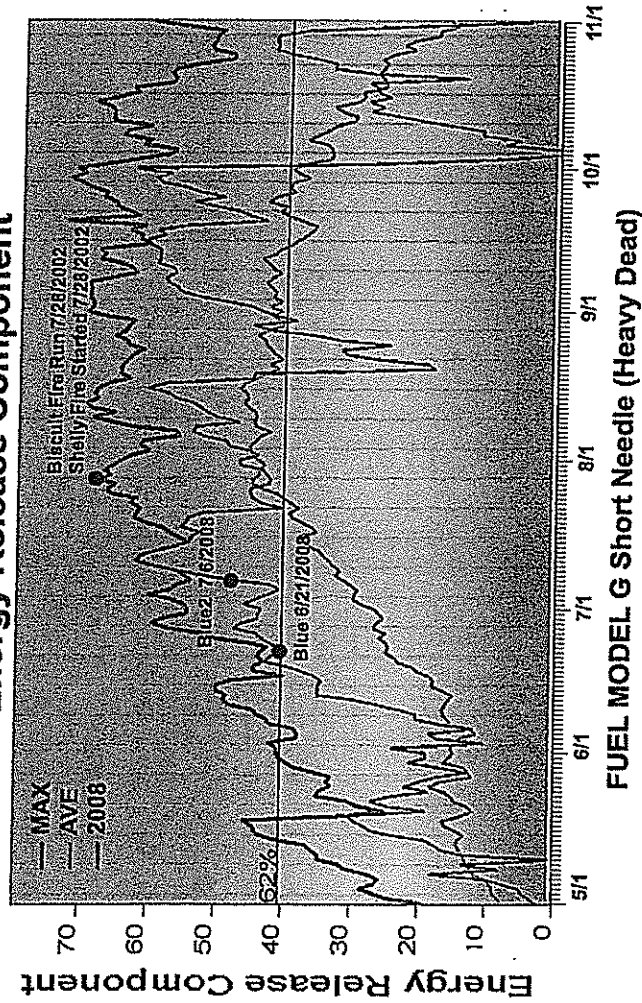

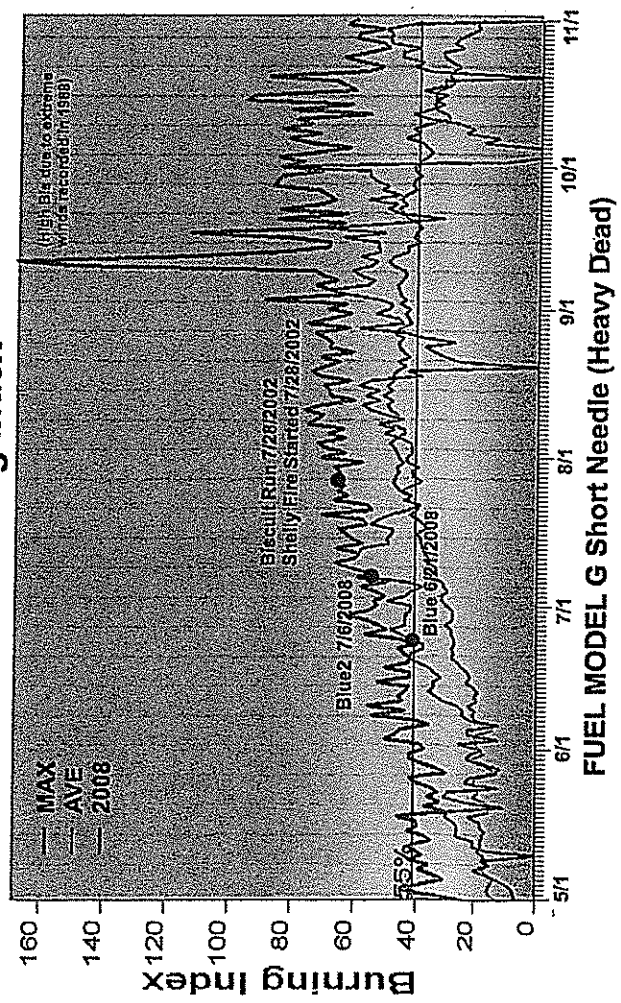

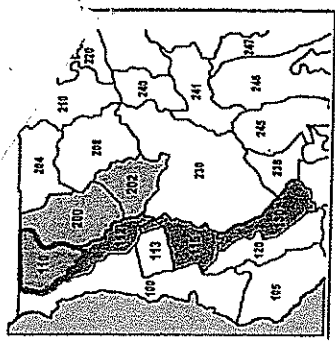
Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior: 20' Windspeed over 8 mph; RH less than 33%; Temperature over 83; 1000-hour Fuel Moisture less than 14. Large fires become more frequent when BI exceeds 41 and when ERC exceeds 41.

 62% = 62nd Percentile means 62% of all days observed had an ERC below 41.



### PAST EXPERIENCE / LOCAL KNOWLEDGE:

- On July 27, 2002, the Sour Biscuit fire doubled in size to approx. 7,000 ac and burned onto the SRF. On July 28 it doubled again to 15000+ ac. Also, on July 28th, the Shelley fire started. On that day ERC = 68, BI = 63, and 1000FM = 11.
- Wildfires become a problem @ 50 acres on the Six Rivers NF due to topography, fuels, and accessibility ("Large fires" = 50 acres).
- This area is ocean-influenced, expect abrupt changes in weather.
- Watch out for East wind events which greatly influence fire activity and are a common contributor to large fires.
- Average slope is 65-70%, Fires are topography-driven.
- Other Watchouts not related to weather: Heavy brush component; small fires will offer high resistance to control and exhaust crews quickly. Poison Oak prevalent in area.

 55% = 55th Percentile means 55% of all days observed had a BI below 41.




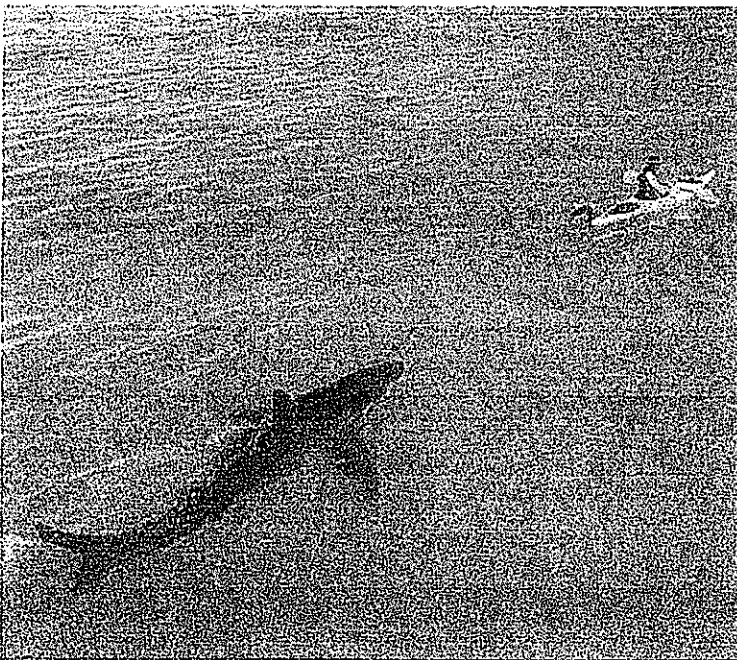



## **In Today's Medical Minute**

Dehydration:

Did you know the human body can only exist for 5-7 days without water? It's time to take dehydration seriously. What exactly does dehydration mean? Medically, dehydration is a serious and potentially life-threatening condition in which the body contains an insufficient volume of water for normal functioning. To operate efficiently, most people say the body requires about eight large glasses of water per day, based on an estimate of fluid loss during a normal day. Even more water is needed during hot weather, periods of illness, and any type of exercising.

Dehydration can lead to serious complications, including:

- **Heat Injuries:** Poor fluid intake when working or exercising vigorously may lead to heat injuries, ranging in severity from mild heat cramps to heat exhaustion or potentially life-threatening heatstroke.
- **Seizures:** Electrolytes such as potassium and sodium help carry electrical signals from cell to cell. Out of balance, the normal electrical messages can become mixed up and lead to seizures.
- **Low blood volume:** This is known as hypovolemic shock and is the most serious and sometimes, life threatening complication of dehydration. When your volume (pressure) drops due to lack of fluid, so does the oxygen levels throughout the body.

**HEALTH, READINESS, AND CAPABILITY MUST BE CONSIDERED PRIOR TO ASSIGNING INCIDENT PERSONNEL TO BACK TO BACK ASSIGNMENTS. THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF INCIDENT PERSONNEL AND RESOURCES WILL NOT BE COMPROMISED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.**

### Federal employees, Local and out of state cooperating agencies

1. Obtain written approval from DIVS for extension or crew swap
2. Obtain written approval from home unit supervisor
3. See Resources Unit at ICP 4-5 days prior to 14<sup>th</sup> working day
4. If approved to extend, obtain extension form from DMOB
  - Extension options:
    - i. Extend to 21 days (exclusive of travel to and from incident. Time spent in staging and preposition status count towards the 21 day assignment.)
    - ii. Extend to 30 days. Inclusive of mandatory days off and exclusive of travel. (must have 2 days R&R between day 15-21)
5. For crew swap, bring 213 (general message) to DMOB with Operations signature, method of travel, names of all personnel (as it appears on their driver's license) that are replacing existing crew, and home dispatch unit contact information.
  - Note crew swap on time documents and provide to finance
  - Replacement crew **must** arrive on 14<sup>th</sup> day of the existing crews work assignment and be available to work the following day

### Private contractors

Obtain written approval from Operations on 213 (general message) and bring to Resources Unit.

- After working 14 days you must take at least 2 days R&R unpaid and can return to incident for an additional 14 day assignment.
- At any time between day 1-14 you can swap personnel and provide information of new crew members to Check-In and Finance.

### Water Treatment for Port Orford Cedar Infection

- Treat water from **all** water sources as follows:
  - 1 gal bleach to 1000 gal water
- Do **NOT** use bleach-treated water to make retardant

### Dozer Usage

- All new dozer lines or safety zones need to have archeological surveys prior to ground disturbance
- Where possible, dozer lines should use existing roads or skid trails

Please stay on roads or already disturbed sites

Do not drive in meadow areas

Limit snag falling if not needed for safety or line protection

Fish screens need to be used for water withdrawal

Weed washing station is located at the fuel station. Weed washing is required upon arrival and demobilization for all vehicles travelling to the fire areas.

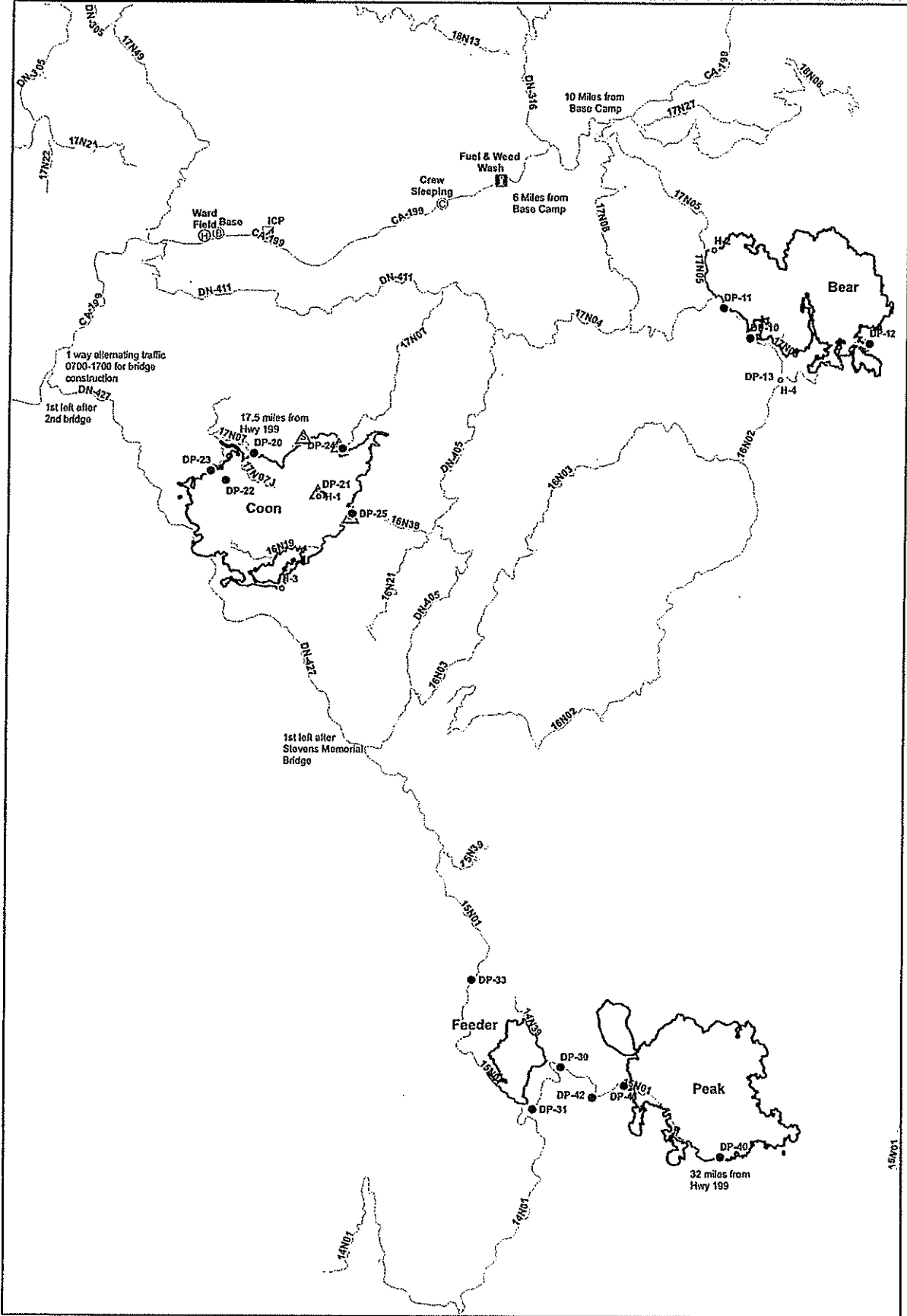
