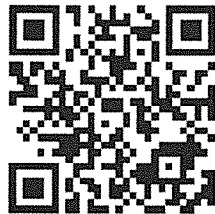



WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will persist over California and the eastern Pacific on Tuesday and will keep the thermal trough over the area. This will cause continued hot and dry conditions. Skies will be cloud free, but smoky. There will be an inversion that around 3000 feet that is not likely to break. Therefore, although Haines Index will be 5, this is not expected to affect the fire.

WEATHER FORECAST for Tuesday:

WEATHER: Clear, but smoky.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES: 86 – 92 degrees mid-slopes/valleys...80 – 85 degrees ridges.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 15 – 25 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – Easterly 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the morning becoming westerly 4 to 9 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Downvalley 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph becoming upslope/upvalley 3 to 8 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 5 (moderate).

STABILITY/INVERSION: Mixing height 3000 feet msl. Inversion may not break.

OUTLOOK for Tuesday Night: Clear, but smoky. Low temperatures 62 – 73 degrees and maximum relative humidity 30 – 60%. East winds 8 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph. Haines Index: 5. Thermal belt 3000 – 4000 feet msl.

OUTLOOK for Wednesday: Clear, but smoky. Highs temperatures 77 – 90 degrees and minimum relative humidity 20 – 30%. Easterly winds 4 to 8 mph in the early morning, shifting westerly by afternoon. Mixing height: 3000 feet msl. Haines Index: 5.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Warm and dry conditions will persist through next weekend. However, a low pressure trough to the north will bring better onshore flow Wednesday through Friday, bringing slightly cooler temperatures and higher humidity. High pressure will rebuild Saturday and Sunday.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Continued warming and drying brings excellent burning conditions. Inversion may delay the start to the burn period. Expect low to moderate activity under the inversion. Be aware of indicators that the inversion is lifting...air becoming clear and fire activity increasing. Once the inversion lifts, conditions are present to allow for a significant increase in activity. Steepening slopes above 35% will also provide an uptick in activity due to convection. Spotting becomes a concern as brush understory becomes involved.

With line construction in incomplete burns, be positive that you are exposing the black edge and getting all the hot ash and embers inside your line.

SPECIFIC:

Timber Understory: Fire behavior in the Understory models could begin early. Warmer and drier conditions will expand the burn window, once the inversion lifts. Expect more involvement of the understory brush and shrubs with increased intensity.

ROS: 10-16 ch/hr.

FL: 8-11 ft.

Timber Litter: Timber Litter fire behavior may be active early. Increased consumption of heavier fuels and understory may provide additional material for spots and roll out. Stay aware of rollout and upslope runs through incomplete burns.

ROS: 7-13 ch/hr.

FL: 4-5 ft.

Spotting becomes a concern with improved burn conditions. Know where your smoke is going and check for fallout.



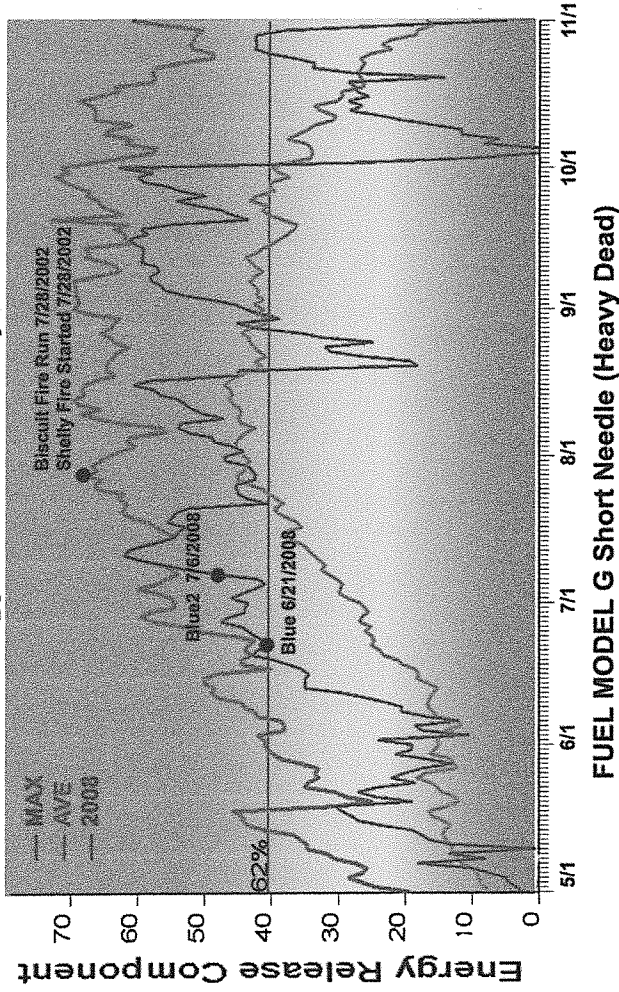
Strong winds early may hamper aircraft. Strong winds may limit effectiveness of aerial assets.

SAFETY

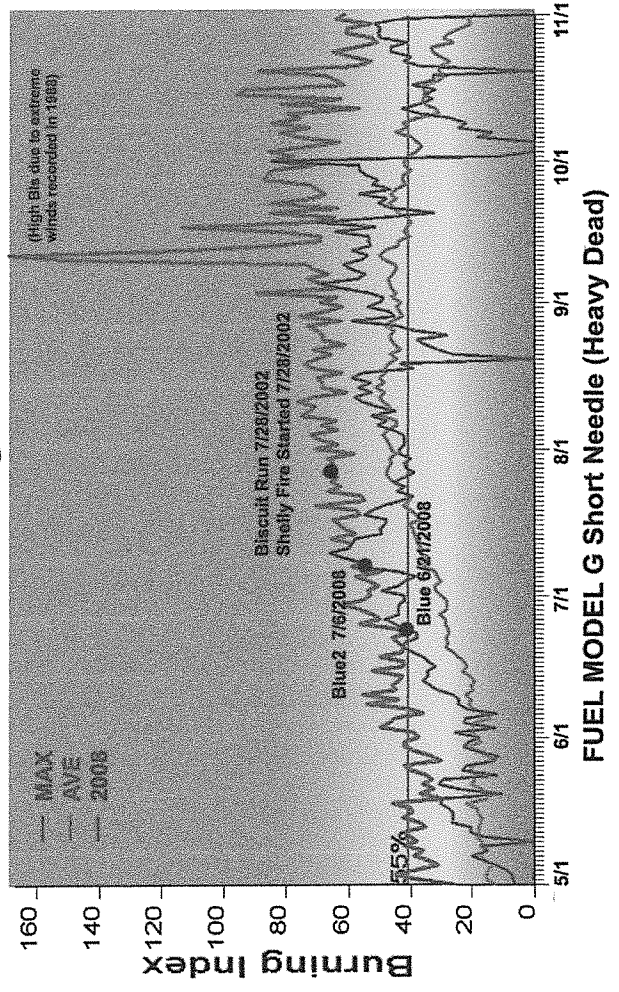
Inversion breaks can lead to sudden increases in fire behavior. Pay attention to weather readings and other indicators that the inversion may be lifting or breaking.

Local Thresholds - WATCHOUT:

Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior: 20' Windspeed over 8 mph; RH less than 33%; Temperature over 83; 1000-hour Fuel Moisture less than 14. Large fires become more frequent when BI exceeds 41 and when ERC exceeds 41.

Graph Interpretation, Energy Release Component:

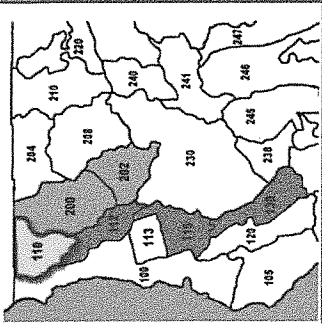
Maximum = Highest ERC by day for 1979-2010

62% = 62nd Percentile means 62% of all days observed had an ERC below 41.

PAST EXPERIENCE / LOCAL KNOWLEDGE:

- On July 27, 2002, the Sour Biscuit fire doubled in size to approx. 7,000 ac and burned onto the SRF. On July 28 it doubled again to 15000+ ac. Also, on July 28th, the Shelley fire started. On that day ERC = 68, BI = 63, and 1000FM = 11.
- Wildfires become a problem @ 50 acres on the Six Rivers NF due to topography, fuels, and accessibility ('Large fires' = 50 acres).
- This area is ocean-influenced, expect abrupt changes in weather.
- Watch out for East wind events which greatly influence fire activity and are a common contributor to large fires.
- Average slope is 65-70%, Fires are topography-driven.
- Other Watchouts not related to weather: Heavy brush component; small fires will offer high resistance to control and exhaust crews quickly. Poison Oak prevalent in area.

Graph Interpretation, Burning Index:



Maximum = Highest BI by day for 1979-2009

Fire Order of the Day –Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.

- ❖ **Hazard Trees** – Keep a good situational awareness up when working in heavily timbered areas. Post lookouts where needed and conduct risk analysis when engaging in these types of situations, consult IRPG P22.
- ❖ **Complacency** - THE WORD OF THE DAY IS: **Transition**. There is a new team taking over the incident. Don't take things for granted. If it doesn't look, feel or sound right, ask the question.
- ❖ **Travel** - Windy roads, narrow roads. Keep speeds slow, slow or stop if you encounter poor visibility due to dust. Keep good spacing between vehicles. Watch for weak shoulder on dirt roads.
- ❖ **Medical emergencies** - Ensure at all times that you have adequate communications so you can activate and run a IWL.



In time the practice catches you, many times with fatal consequences. Please do not do this, NEVER deviate from LCES, Fire Orders or watch outs.
