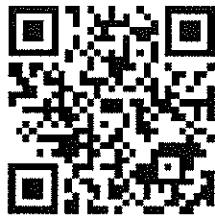

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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** High pressure will be suppressed by a northern stream trough on Wednesday and Thursday, and the thermal trough will shift eastward. This will allow for a better onshore flow that will moderate temperatures and increase humidity slightly. However, the inversion will remain in place through Thursday, and smoke will likely remain a problem. Although Haines Index is 5, plumes will need to break the inversion before they are affected by the unstable air aloft.

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**WEATHER FORECAST for Wednesday:**

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy and smoky.

**MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES:** 77 – 87 degrees.

**MINIMUM HUMIDITY:** 20 – 27 percent.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Easterly 3 to 7 mph becoming westerly 4 to 9 mph in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Downslope/downvalley 2 to 5 mph becoming upslope/upvalley 3 to 8 mph.

**HAINES INDEX:** 5 (moderate).

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Mixing height 3000 feet msl. Inversion may not break.

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**OUTLOOK for Wednesday Night:** Partly cloudy and smoky. Low temperatures 58 – 65 degrees and maximum relative humidity 45 – 85%. Northeast winds 6 to 11 mph. Haines Index: 5. Thermal belt 3000 - 5000 feet msl.


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**OUTLOOK for Thursday:** Partly cloudy and smoky. Highs temperatures 75 – 85 degrees and minimum relative humidity 20 – 30%. Northeast winds 4 to 9 mph in the morning becoming northwest in the afternoon. Mixing height: 3000 feet msl. Haines Index: 5.

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**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Warm and dry conditions will persist through the weekend. However, a low pressure trough to the north will bring better onshore flow through Friday, bringing slightly cooler temperatures and higher humidity. The inversion is also expected to lift on Friday. High pressure will rebuild Saturday.

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

##### GENERAL:

The Fires main influence has been fuel and topography dominated...driven by dead and down fuels. Fuels burning consist of Shrubs and Timber/Heavy Down (FM 4, 10). Large dense stands of mixed Conifer are dominant throughout. Live Fuel Moisture is estimated @ 90%. 1000 hr fuels are @ 10%. Headfire has displayed ROS @ 10-16 chains/hr with flame lengths of 8-12 feet. Single/group tree torching has occurred. Short crown fire spread has occurred on the Coon fire with inversion lifting and a Haines of 5. Heavy fuels are holding large amounts of heat. ERC is predicted @ 60 today (down 2) and BI is predicted @ 61 (up 3)

.....Local threshold for large growth: 20' winds over 8 mph, RH less than 33%, Temps over 83\*, 1000 hr FM less than 14%, BI/ERC exceeds 41 (refer to Pocket Card in IAP).

Scattered Tree Mortality is under 5%.

Probability of Ignition (shaded) will be 70% into receptive fuels for the better part of the operational period.

### SPECIFIC

##### All Divisions:

The Fires will continue to display moderate surface fire intensity with the possibility of single/group torching when inversion lifts and ventilation occurs. The forecasted weather will remain in a period of warmer temperatures and lower humidity...which have dried fuels even further from the previous days. Lighter fuels (1 hr and 10 hr) will continue to lose moisture and burn more readily. Heavy fuels will continue to hold heat until extinguished or consumed. Roll-out of burning material remains high and has led to the growth of the Fires. The potential for single tree torching will remain a threat due to surface fire that has dried aerial fuels. Increased fire activity will occur in the afternoon as solar heating and lifting of inversion becomes a factor. The Fires will have the ability to make uphill runs as slope and winds become into alignment. Be particularly cautious on South, Southwest and Southeast slopes coupled with any southerly wind component. Direct attack along flanks with hose lines and hand crews are favorable. We could see spotting distance of up to ¼ mile at the ridges.

**Coon Fire:** will continue to back and flank towards the South Fork Smith river...west/south and southeast towards Gordon creek. Heads up on fire stacking up and moving with head fire with slope reversal.

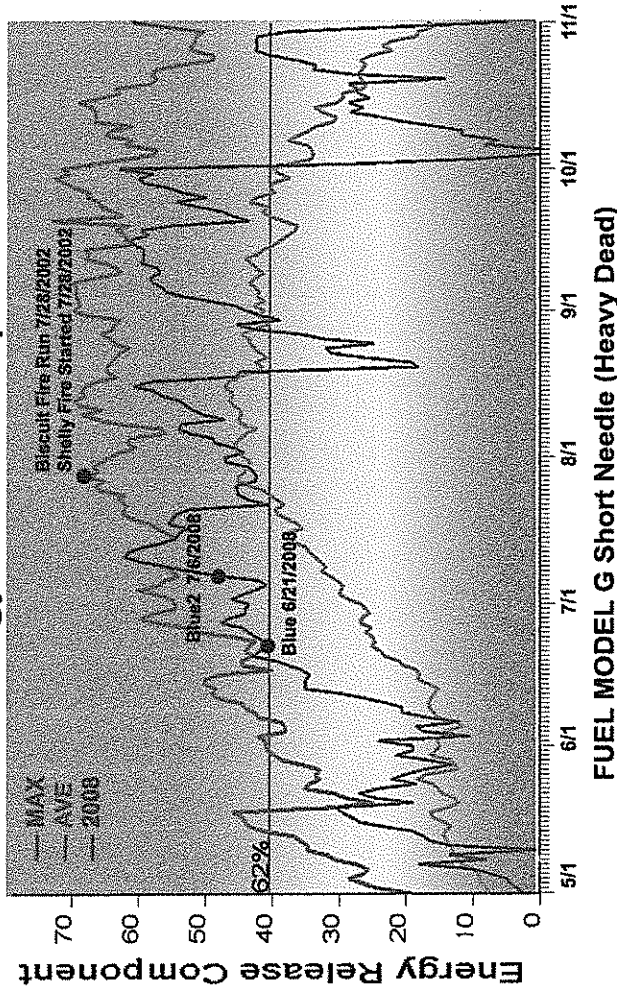
##### AIR OPERATIONS:

Air support may be limited due to inversion and/or gusty winds.

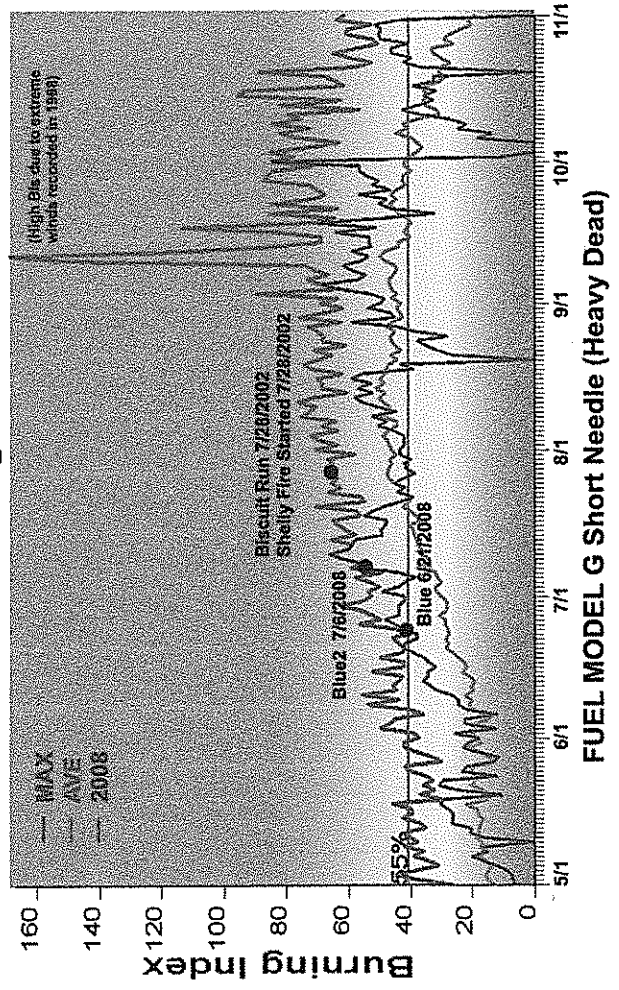
### SAFETY

### Local Thresholds - WATCHOUT:

Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior: 20' Windspeed over 8 mph; RH less than 33%; Temperature over 83; 1000-hour Fuel Moisture less than 14. Large fires become more frequent when BI exceeds 41 and when ERC exceeds 41.

Average = Shows Peak Fire Season

62% = 62nd Percentile means 62% of all days observed had an ERC below 41.

### PAST EXPERIENCE / LOCAL KNOWLEDGE:

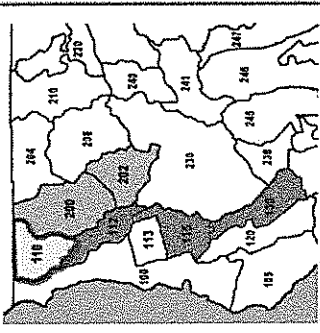
- On July 27, 2002, the Sour Biscuit fire doubled in size to approx. 7,000 ac and burned onto the SRF. On July 28 it doubled again to 15000+ ac. Also, on July 28th, the Shelley fire started. On that day ERC = 68, BI = 63, and 1000FM = 11.
- Wildfires become a problem @ 50 acres on the Six Rivers NF due to topography, fuels, and accessibility ("Large fires" = 50 acres).
- This area is ocean-influenced, expect abrupt changes in weather.
- Watch out for East wind events which greatly influence fire activity and are a common contributor to large fires.
- Average slope is 65-70%, Fires are topography-driven.
- Other Watchouts not related to weather: Heavy brush component; small fires will offer high resistance to control and exhaust crews quickly. Poison Oak prevalent in area.



## ***SAFETY MESSAGE:***

The National Preparedness Level is now PL-5 due to high fire activity in multiple geographical areas and heavy commitment of resources to wildfire suppression activities. During this time we must remain mindful of our safety practices and risk management efforts.

Analysis of past data is the foundation for almost all risk management. Over the past 100 years, over 90% of the wildland firefighter fatalities can be attributed to one of the following five causes:

- Medical Emergencies/ Heart Attacks
- Vehicle Accidents/ Driving
- Low Level Flight Operations/ Aviation
- Burnovers/ Entrapments
- Hazard Trees/ Falling Snags


Many in the firefighting community have been engaged in initial attack and/or large fire activities for many weeks. We must watch for the effects of cumulative fatigue. We need to remind our folks to get the rest they need to stay hydrated and take in good nutrition.

Our roles as managers and leaders is to make sure our wildland firefighters train for, understand, and utilize the risk management process when involved in wildfire operations.

Having experienced 10 fatalities in the fire community to date in 2015, NMAC is encouraging leaders, managers, and everyone in the fire community to maintain a vigilant focus on risk management efforts during this period of high fire activity.

- Make everyday a training day. This can be achieved through the Six Minutes for Safety Program. (<http://www.wildfirelessons.net/6minutesforsafety>)
- Take 5 at 2. Take five minutes each day at 1400 to review the values at risk and the risk exposure we are placing on our firefighters.
- Actively monitor and manage firefighter fatigue and overall health and wellness.
- Limit driving time where possible. Change drivers to reduce driver fatigue

The primary causes of fatalities and serious accidents have not changed. There is a high probability that most future fatalities will continue to share these five basic causes. If we can “predict” the causes of our future accidents, then we can “prevent” them. Encourage proactive efforts and sound risk management on this assignment and throughout this fire season.

**Our hazards:** Driving, steep terrain, rolling debris and rocks, fire behavior, hazard trees including root rot in green trees, poison oak, bees, hornets and smoky conditions. See 215A Safety Officer: Tom Zeulner SOF2 805-440-5252

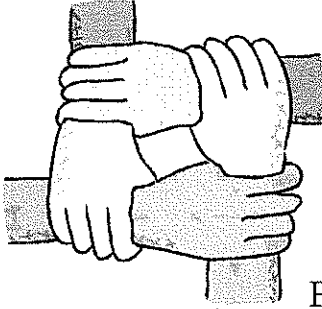

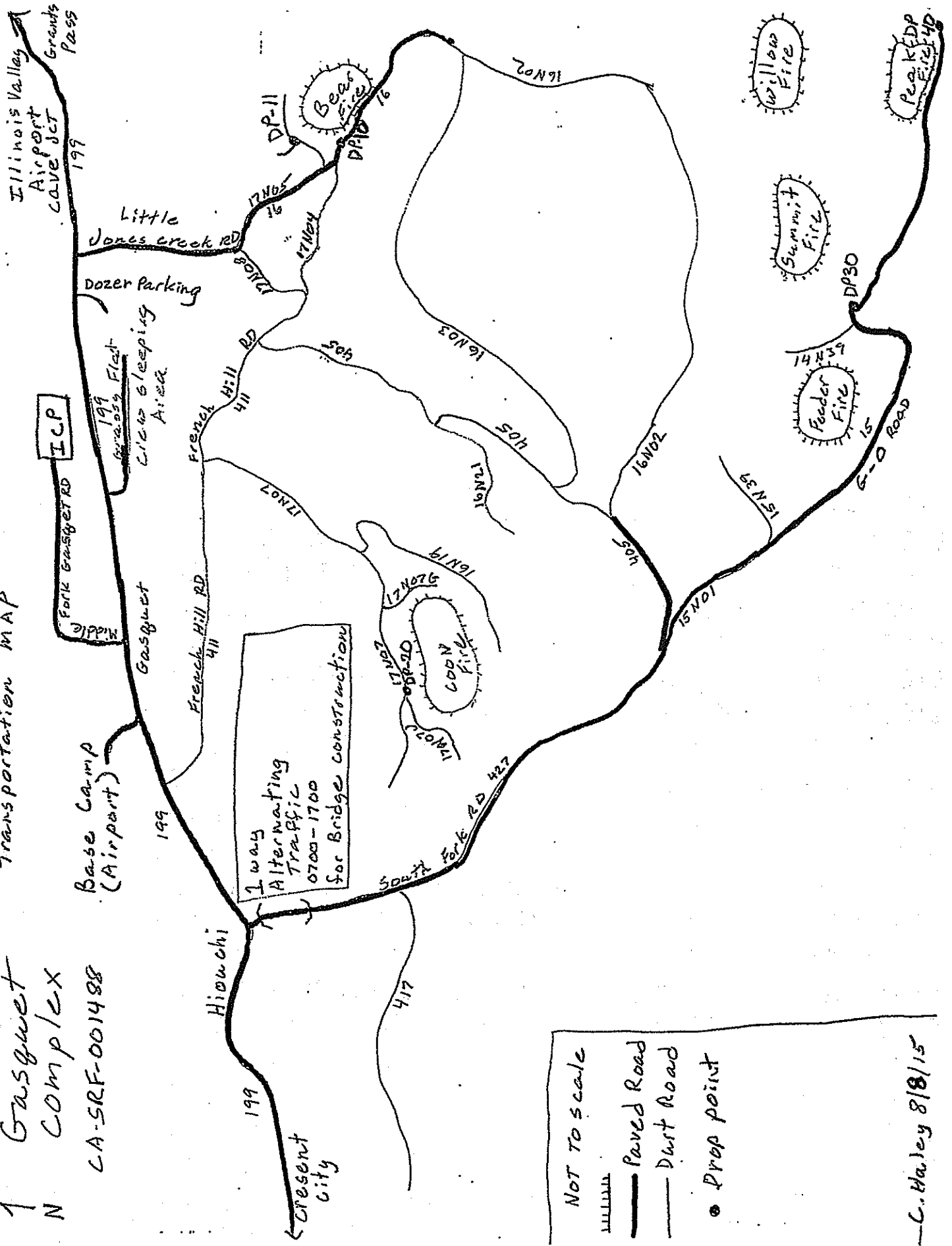

Transportation MAP



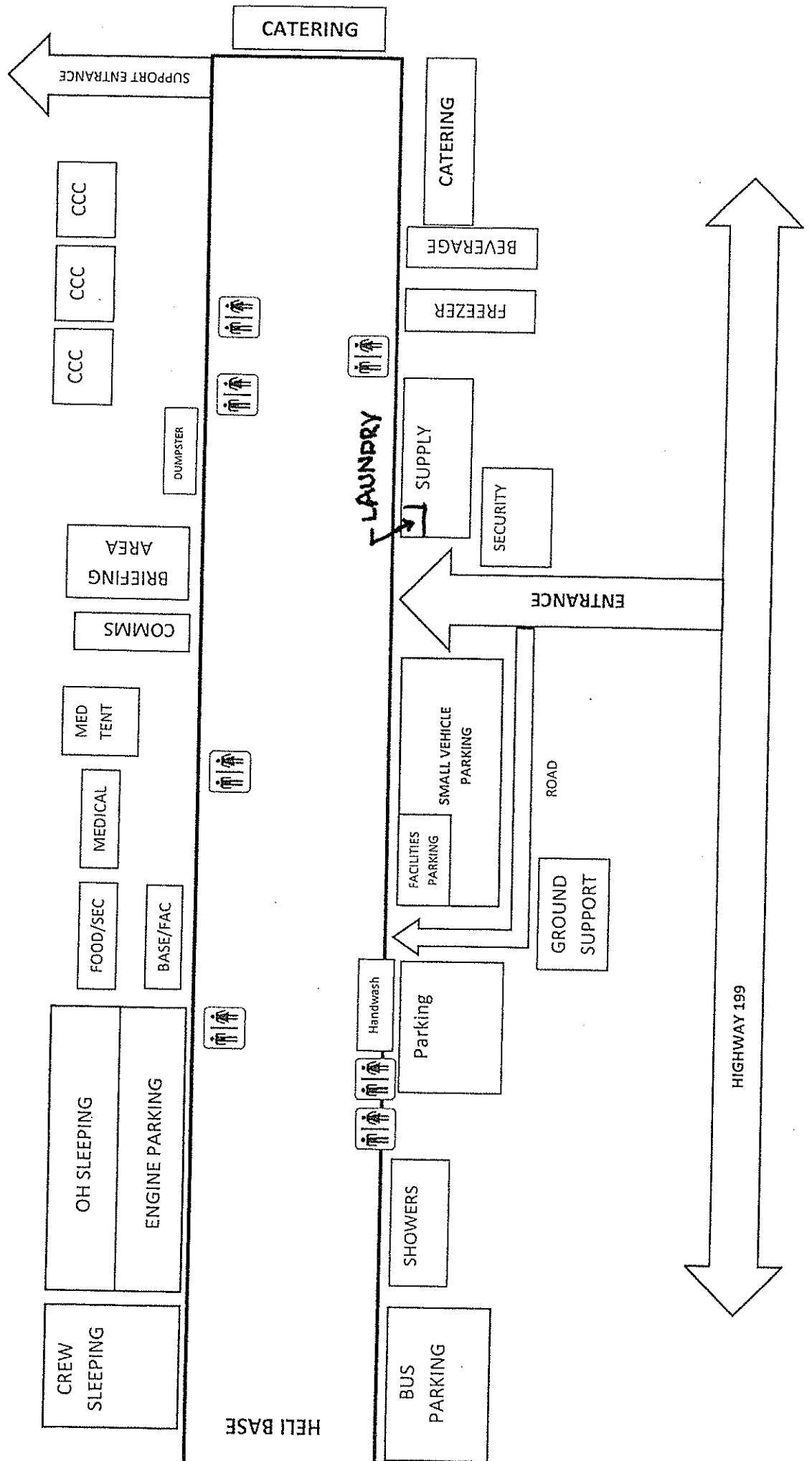
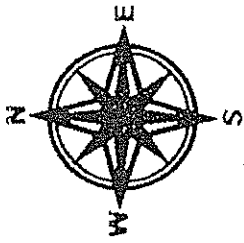
