... UNSEASONABLY COOL WITH WETTING RAIN AT TIMES THROUGH FRIDAY ...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A strong and unseasonably cool trough of low pressure will bring chilly and unsettled weather through Friday. Mainly clear skies last night likely allowed drainage inversions to develop, with some smoke settling down into the Dillon and Swillup Creek drainages and tributaries. Inversions should break by midday. Meanwhile, a reinforcing cold front will approach the coast, with an increasing chance of showers today (Wednesday) through tonight. Another disturbance will spread more widespread showers across Northern California Thursday. A stray thunderstorm or two may impact the area Wednesday or Thursday, but the number of lightning strikes should be limited. Clouds and showers decrease Friday, then a transition to much warmer and drier weather is likely over the weekend.

TODAY (Wednesday): Partly cloudy, then increasing clouds. A chance of showers with a slight chance of a thunderstorm in the afternoon.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

The most active portion of the fire is on the south and it continues to back slowly toward Hwy 96. Fire at the Division C/D break (SE portion of Section 9 of Swillup Creek) is of concern with possible eddying winds near the confluence of the drainages and topography changes.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

Division B: Pockets of heat will continue to burn down. Fire weakened snags, burned out stump holes, and deep ash where heavies were consumed along with dirty burn conditions exist.

Division C: Fire is holding in Swillup Creek. Look for fire weakened snags, stump holes, and ash where heavies have burned down. Should a fire become established on the east side of Swillup, expect low rates of spread comparable to the open timber listed above.

Division D: Fire is most active in Division D. Minimal short distance rollout may occur as pockets burn out and fire backs down toward Hwy 96. Surface winds will draw smoke upslope/upcanyon then mix with the upper level west winds, bending the smoke column to the east shading Swillup Creek. The Division C/D break continues to be an area of concern for spotting across Swillup Creek. If the fire crosses Swillup Creek expect low rates of spread (< 3 chains per hour). In the southwest, the fire is backing in steep terrain. Minimal fire activity is expected in this area.

Division A, H, I, Z: No fire activity expected.

AIR OPERATIONS

Valley inversions until late morning. Visibility after the inversions lift will be similar to yesterday. Transport winds from the West at 10-15 mph. Sunrise: 05:38 Sunset: 20:50



SAFETY
