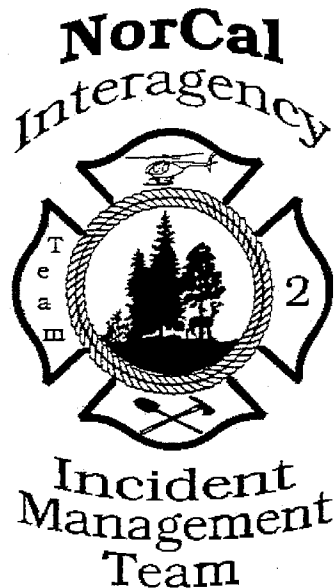

Efforts will be made to eliminate the spread of the fire onto private property where feasible and to minimize the fire effects across the landscape through the application of a well-planned fire suppression response.

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Little changes in overall conditions as a northwest flow aloft remains in place. Valley inversions will keep smoke in some of the deeper valleys, but with afternoon heating most areas especially over the western half of the fire will see the inversion lift. It's **possible** that little mixing will occur over the eastern half of the fire keeping temperatures slightly lower along with higher humidity values. Winds will generally be terrain driven with upslope/upvalley 3 to 7 mph in the valleys and north to northeast winds 5 to 10 mph on the ridges. Near the junction of the Klamath River and Scott Rivers winds will be west around 10 mph in the afternoon.

WEATHER TODAY (MONDAY): Sunny with a few clouds in the afternoon. Areas of smoke. Inversions lifting during the afternoon. Higher RH and lower Temps can be expected under thicker smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES / MIN RELATIVE HUMIDITY:

Valleys: 79 to 84 degrees / 22 to 28%
Ridges: 66 to 72 degrees / 28 to 38%

20 FOOT WINDS:

Slope/Valley: North 3 to 5 mph through 0900 then upslope/upvalley 3 to 7 mph through the afternoon. West up to 10 mph near the Klamath River in the afternoon.
Ridges: North to northeast 5 to 10 mph. Gusts up to 15 mph.

HAINES....4 (Low) CWR ($\geq 0.10''$)....0% LAL....1

WEATHER TONIGHT (MONDAY NIGHT): Mostly clear and a few degrees warmer. Inversions developing by 2200. RH recovers down about 10-15% in the valleys and about 10-20% ridges.

MIN TEMPERATURES / MAX RELATIVE HUMIDITY

Valleys: 42 to 47 degrees / 70 to 80%
Ridges: 43 to 48 degrees / 60 to 70%

20 FOOT WINDS:

Slope/Valley: North 3 to 6 mph through 2000 then downslope/downvalley 3 to 5 mph. West winds up to 10 mph along the Klamath in the evening.
Ridges: North to northeast 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 10 mph.

HAINES....4 (Low) CWR ($\geq 0.10''$)....0% LAL....1

TUESDAY: Mostly sunny. Smoke in the valleys. Inversions lifting by mid afternoon. Upvalley/upslope 3-6 mph. Ridgetop winds north to northeast 5-10 mph gusts up to 20 mph in the afternoon. Highs 65-80. Min RH: 25-35%.

OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY: High pressure will start to build off the west coast and work inland beginning Wednesday. This will lead to warmer temperatures along with humidity values in the 20 to 30 percent range. Winds will remain terrain driven, but some of the lower East-West valleys could see some increase in afternoon west winds as the interior valleys continue to warm. Highs 75 to 85 degrees Wednesday warming to 80-90 Thursday. Min RH 18-28%. Upslope/Upvalley 3-7 mph. Ridges: North 4-8 mph with occasional gusts to 15 mph.

WEATHER SUMMARY: *** See attached Fire Weather Forecast***

Discussion: Northwest flow aloft will remain over the fire area today.

Weather: Sunny with a few clouds in the afternoon. Areas of smoke. Inversions lifting during the afternoon.

Max Temp: 79-84° in the valleys; 66-72° on ridges

Min RH: 22-28% in the valleys; 28-38% on ridges

Winds (20 foot):

Slope/Valley: North 3-5 mph through 0900, then upslope/upvalley 3-7 mph through the afternoon. West up to 10 mph near the Klamath River in the afternoon.

Ridges: North to northeast 5-10 mph. Gusts up to 15 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

Seasonal temperatures and relative humidity, along with light winds, will reduce the threat for extreme fire behavior.

Energy Release Components are at very high levels for this time of year. September 4 ERC was 73.

Live fuel moistures are near critical levels with Manzanita at 86-94%; Ceanothus at 78-87%; 1000-hr fuels are at 5-6%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

Expect the fire behavior to be low to moderate until mid to late afternoon. Fire spread will be primarily backing and flanking with occasional torching and short uphill runs during the early portion of the operational period. Expect the possibility of moderate fire behavior late afternoon into the evening, especially in the lower elevations of the Klamath drainage.

Timber fuel types: potential worst-case surface fire spread will be 5-10 chains/hour with flame length 4 to 6 feet. Torching trees and short duration crown runs are possible, with spotting distances up to 2/10 of a mile which can increase spread distances significantly. Probability of ignition will be 60-70% at the height of the burn period.

Brush areas: potential worst-case surface fire spread will be 20-30 chains/hour with flame length 4 to 8 feet. Occasional short duration crown runs should be expected with spotting to 2/10 mile which could increase total spread distance significantly. Probability of ignition 60-70%.

The primary area of concern is the southern fire perimeter located on the north side of the Klamath River (Div U and Y).

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations may be limited much of the day due to poor visibility caused by smoke, especially on the south side.

Sunrise: 06:43

Sunset: 19:39

SAFETY

- Post lookouts to observe fire behavior changes and notify all personnel and adjoining forces when they occur.
- Evaluate safety zones and escape routes and continue to evaluate as weather and fire behavior conditions change throughout the shift.

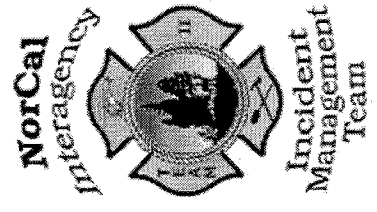
