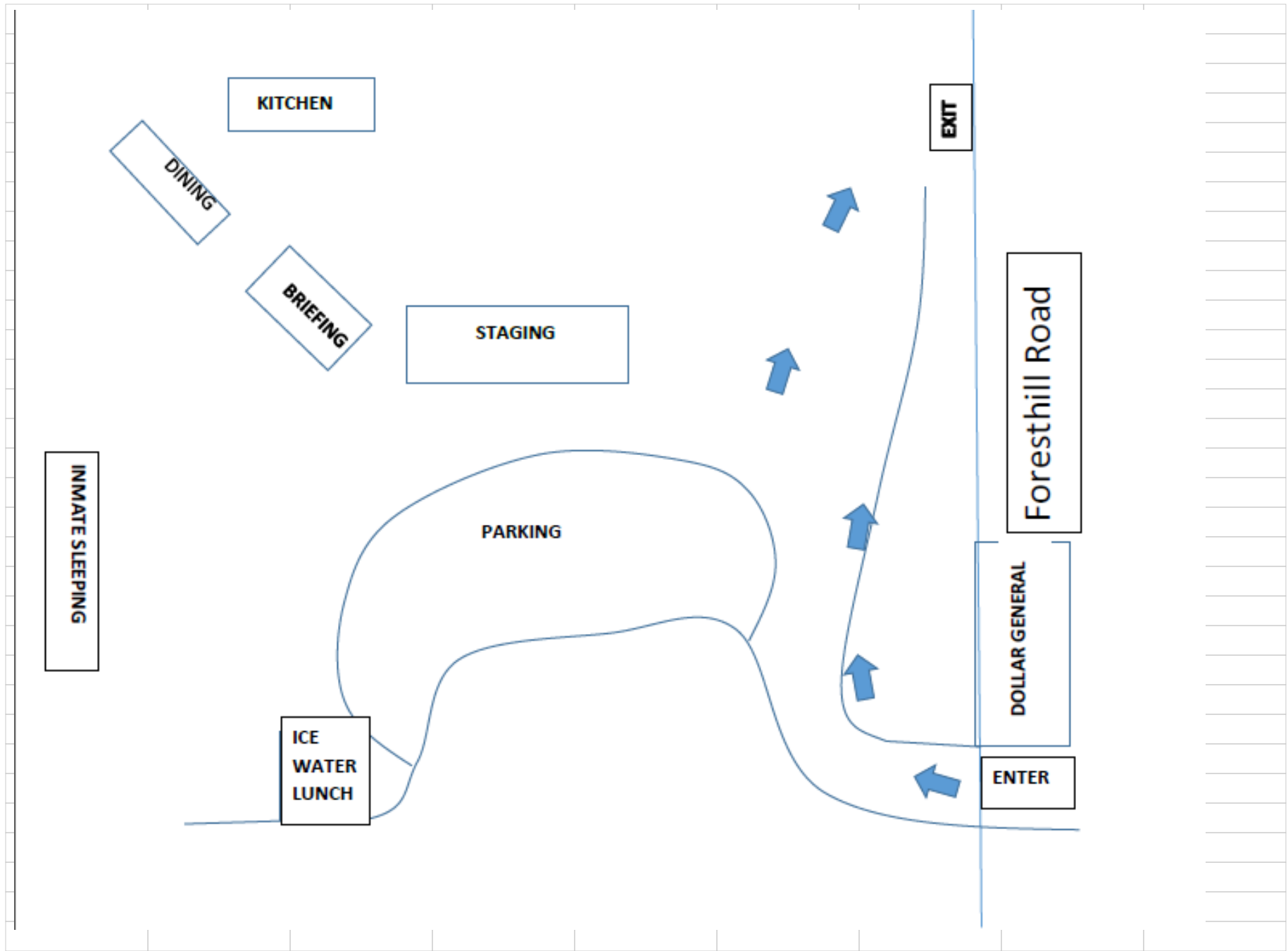

PG&E in the area.</p> <p>Maintain attentiveness; Review and practice your 10's and 18's.</p> <p>Drive with your headlights on at all times, follow all speed limits and traffic laws.</p> <p>Be cautious of fire weakened or partially burnt hazard trees, identify and isolate.</p> <p>Post enough lookouts to have a good vantage of the entire hazard area.</p> <p>Watch your footing on the fire line, maintain adequate crew spacing.</p> <p>Beware of steep terrain on portions of the fire.</p> <p>Brief your crews on all the components of the IAP.</p> <p>Ensure firefighters have good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones.</p> <p>Practice LCES Lookout(L),Communication(C), Escape routes(E) and Safety zone(S)</p>

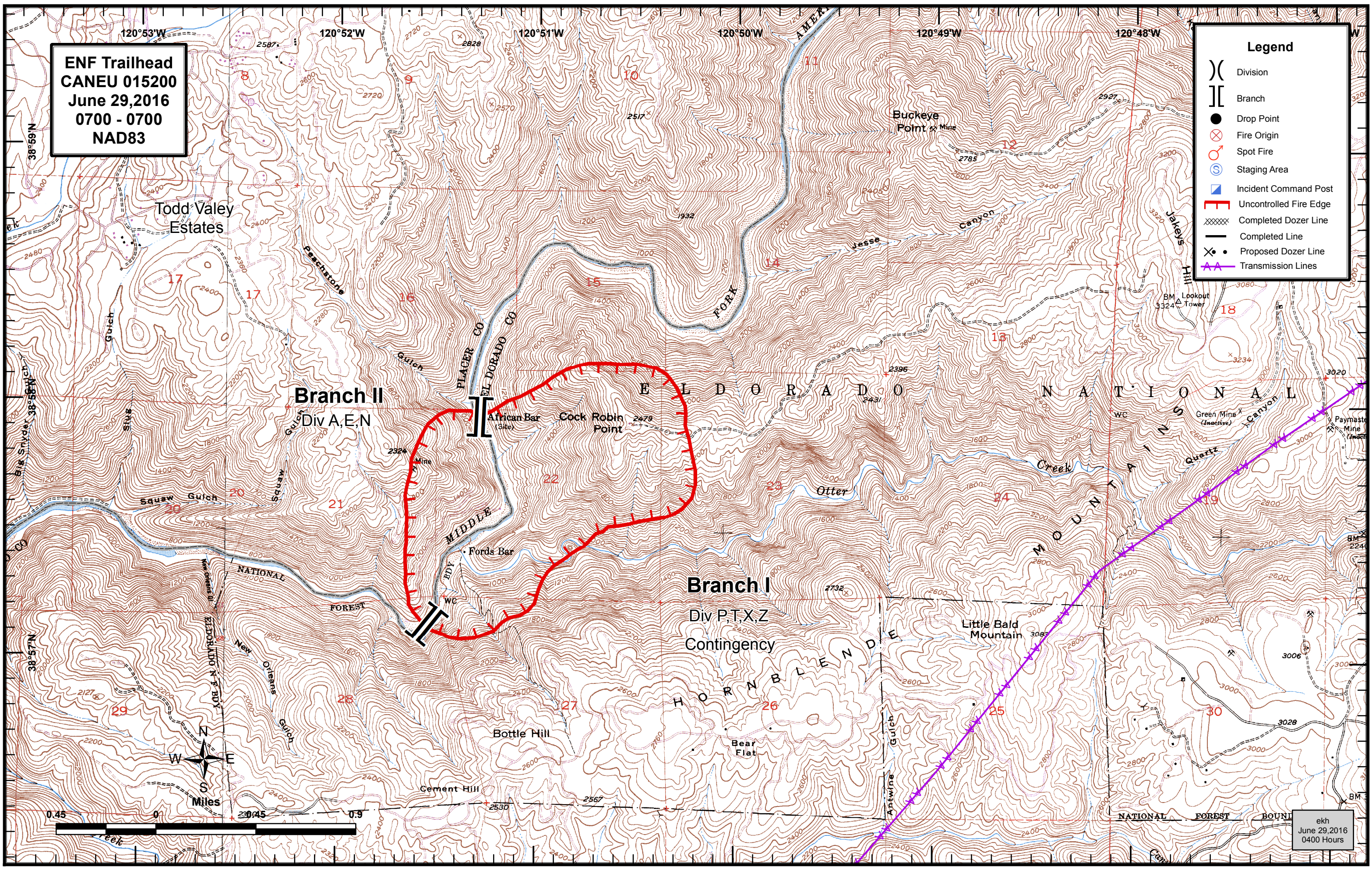
DIV		MITIGATIONS / WARNINGS / REMEDIES
ALL	FIRE BEHAVIOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Monitor current weather conditions and forecasts. Make sure all personnel receive thorough briefings every shift. - Maintain adequate escape routes and safety zones. - Advise all personnel if these are compromised or changed. Set trigger points when appropriate. - Adhere to 10 Standard Firefighting Orders, mitigate 18 Watch Out Situations. - Maintain Situational Awareness.
ALL	DRIVING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve. - Drive with headlights on. - Be alert for wildlife, heavy trucks, & high speed opposing traffic crossing into your lane. - Check traffic approaching behind you when making left turns. - Increase following distances on dusty roads. Slow down when you meet opposing traffic. - Maintain Situational Awareness. Watch out for evacuating civilian.
ALL	FATIGUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. - Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. - Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue.
ALL	COMMUNICATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Share your Situational Awareness (hazards, changes, etc.) to those who also have a need. - Answer questions when asked by others. Ask for intel if and when you don't know the plan. - Ensure all personnel are familiar with the communications plan.
STAGING	HEAVY EQUIPMENT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Be alert to heavy equipment - Utilize backup spotters when backing up vehicles - Do not take breaks or sleep in equipment staging area
ALL	HEAT RELATED ILLNESS (HRI) & DEHYDRATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Drink 2 to 1 water to sports drinks. - Take Frequent breaks, minimum of 10 minutes every hour. - Recognize symptoms of HEAT RELATED ILLNESS which include: Lack of energy, Headaches, dizziness, lack of rest, no hunger, poor eating habits, hot skin, and lack of sweating
ALL	AIRCRAFT	Stay alert for aircraft drops and maintain adequate communications.
