




WEATHER DISCUSSION: Stable moderating conditions will continue tonight as a weak low pressure trough slowly develops along the west coast. Inversions will settle in fairly early under the stable conditions and light winds. Temperatures will continue to cool slightly with RH coming up a bit. Even with the moderating RH...RH values will remain in the 40 to 50% range through much of the night. Stable conditions will keep morning inversions in place well into Monday morning. Only minor changes are expected Monday with a slow cooling trend still on track for Tuesday and Wednesday with daytime highs dropping to a little below normal for this time of year.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Fair skies with smoke settling in by around 2100.

TEMPERATURES: Min temperatures 59 to 65.

HUMIDITY: Maximum humidity recovery 50-55% ridgetops to 65-70% canyon bottoms. Humidity for the majority of the night will range from 45-55%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest to west 2-4 gusts to 8 mph becoming southeast 1-4 gusts to 8 mph after about 2100.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope and upcanyon 2-5 mph with gusts to 8 mph becoming downslope to downcanyon 0-4 gusts to 7 mph after about 2000.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversions settling in after about 2100. Thermal belts above about 2000 feet elevation.

OUTLOOK FOR Monday (Independence Day) shift: Sunny skies with smoke clearing after about 1100. Max temps 85-92. Minimum RH 19-26%. Ridge winds southeast 1-4 gusts to 8 mph becoming southwest 2-4 gusts to 10 mph after about 1100. Strongest winds in the early to mid afternoon. Slope winds downslope to downcanyon 1-4 gusts to 7 mph becoming upslope to upcanyon 2-5 gusts to 8 mph after about 1100.

OUTLOOK FOR MONDAY: Sunny skies. Max temps 83-91. Morning min temps 58 to 64. Minimum RH 19-26%. Morning maximum recovery 50% ridges to 70% canyon bottoms. Ridge winds southeast 1-5 gusts to 8 mph becoming southwest 2-5 gusts to 12 mph after about 1100. Slope winds downcanyon 1-4 gusts to 7 mph becoming upcanyon 2-5 gusts to 10 mph after about 1100. Strongest winds in the early afternoon.

Discussion: Stable moderating conditions will continue tonight as a weak low pressure trough slowly develops along the west coast.

Weather: Fair skies, smoke settling in after about 2100 hrs. Thermal Belt above 2000 feet.

Temp: 59-65° **RH:** 45-55%

Winds (eye level): downslope/downcanyon to 3 mph after 2100; SE to 4 mph on ridge tops after 2100

10 hr fuels: 5% **1000 hr fuels:** 10%

Live Fuel Moisture: 100% lower elevations and 127% higher elevations (above 3,500 ft)

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

Expect the fire to remain active until after dark with the potential for short upslope runs through brush and timber to 20 ch/hr with flame lengths to 15 feet—with occasional short duration crowning and spotting up to ¼ mile. Fire activity will subside after dark. Division Z has the greatest potential for active fire behavior. Backing and flanking pushed by the down slope/down canyon winds will occur through the night.

Rate of Spread (Head Fire) Open Timber: 1-2 ch/hr Closed Timber w/ Understory: 4-8 ch/hr Brush: 6-15 ch/hr

Flame lengths (Head Fire) Open Timber: 1-2 feet Closed Timber w/ Understory: 4-7 feet Brush: 2-8 feet

POI: 30-40% **Spotting Potential:** less than 1/10 mile

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

Branch I: Fire is holding well in Divisions L, P, T, X. Any remaining interior green islands could still burn down tonight. Be on the lookout for undetected spots from day shift, snags burning down, stump holes, and dirty burn areas that have re-burn potential. Expect to have downwind smoke effects to Divisions X and Z. Use extreme caution when working near or under the powerlines crossing through Divisions X and T as smoke could cause arcing.

Division Z: The fire will continue to flank down canyon in the American River and in the draws below the holding lines. There is still a potential for the fire to cross the American River and could cause lateral runs where slope and wind align.

Branch II: The fire is being held within control lines. The only problem area remaining is Division A which drops down to the river. Should fire cross the American River from the Division Z side, the fire activity would increase, including lateral runs where slope and wind are aligned.

AIR OPERATIONS

Becoming stable with inversions settling in after 2100. Smokey skies causing reduced visibility in the morning until the inversions lift. Sunset: 20:33 Sunrise (07/04): 05:43



SAFETY
