# Modoc July Complex Fire Weather Forecast

...Red Flag Warning Thursday Afternoon and Evening for Abundant Lightning...

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms will develop yet again across the area Thursday. A Red Flag Warning has been issued from 1200 to 2200 Thursday for abundant lightning on dry fuels. In addition to the lightning, gusty outflow winds and small hail are expected near storms. Highs Thursday will peak in the low to mid-80s, with relative humidity around 20-30%. Drier weather is expected by Friday, with gusty Southwesterly winds expected over the weekend.

\*\*\*Thunderstorms imply the possibility of gusty and erratic winds\*\*\*

### **WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy in the morning, becoming mostly cloudy in the afternoon. 40% chance of T-storms in the afternoon and evening, with storms first developing around 1500 and ending around 2000.

**HIGH TEMPERATURES:** 79-86. Little change.

**HUMIDITY:** 20-30% away from storms. 35-45% near storms. Little change.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGE: COVE - Light early, becoming Northeast 4-6 mph 0900-1500, then Northwest 5-8pm with

gusts to 12 mph from 1500-2000.

RIDGE: STEELE - Light early, becoming Southeast 3-6 mph from 0800-1300, then Southwest 5-10

mph with gusts to 15 mph 1300-2000.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope 2-5 mph. Gusts to 8 mph from 1200-1900.

HAINES INDEX: 4 LAL: 3

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate morning inversion becoming unstable after 1300.

THURSDAY NIGHT: Thunderstorms will dissipate by 2200, and then skies become partly cloudy overnight. RH recovery will be 50-70% away from storms, and 70-90% near storms. Lows 52-60. Light and downslope winds after midnight.

<u>FRIDAY THROUGH SUNDAY:</u> Drier weather will return Friday into the weekend. Seasonably warm through the period, with highs in the 80s and moderate overnight humidity recovery around 60% by 0600. Afternoon and evening West to Southwest wind gusts of 15-20 mph over the weekend, with minimum relative humidity around 20%.

<u>SAFETY INFORMATION</u>: Keep an ear to the radio for weather updates, and seek shelter from lightning if a storm approaches. If you feel the hair on your arms or head "stand up," there is a high probability of a strike in the vicinity. Crouch or sit on a pack with your legs together. Take shelter in vehicles if possible.

#### **OUTPUTS**

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL**: The southern half of the Initial Attach Response Area did receive scattered showers yesterday. The wetting rains did increase the moisture content of those area fuels. Similar conditions will be replicated today with intermittent thunderstorms throughout the afternoon and evening. Drying did occur to the fuels away from the showers. Additional fires can be expected to surface today, away from any wetting rains.

#### LOCAL THRESHOLDS - WATCH OUT

Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior:

Thresholds: 20' winds over 5 mph RH less than 20% Temp over 90° ERC over 64 BI over 51

Forecasted: 20' winds 4-10mph RH 20-30% (away from storms) Temp 79-88° ERC 60 BI 37-50

Probability of Ignition: Near Storms – 30-40% Shaded.....50-60% Unshaded
Away from storms – 40-50% Shaded.....70-80% Unshaded

#### SPECIFIC:

North Zone & Steele Fire: Fuels in the Steele fire area didn't receive any direct rainfall and will be more receptive to day time drying. However, the area did receive significant RH recovery (60-70%). By mid-morning the fuels will start the drying process through light winds and solar heating. Fuels can be expected to reach critical thresholds earlier today. Be aware of shifting winds and the outflow boundary of passing storms

South Zone & Cove Fire: Fuels at the Cove fire did receive some wetting rain but by early-morning will dry enough to support active fire behavior. Fuels are expected to reach critical thresholds earlier today. Be aware of shifting winds and the outflow boundary of passing storms.

<u>IA "Gasoline Alley":</u> 10hr moisture trend – Max.10hr fuel moisture started at 26% and dried to 7% by the afternoon. By mid-morning fuels had dried enough to support active fire behavior. Fuels are expected to reach critical thresholds earlier today.

#### **THREATS**

- #1- Holdovers.....Holdovers continue to be a threat and can be expected today away from any wetting rain.
- #2- Additional Starts from thunderstorms.... Red Flag Warning issued for abundant lightning.
- #3- NE area of the Steele Fire.... There still remains some isolated heat along the north-east Perimeter. The fire made a run there before which may be an indication that it could happen again.

AIR OPERATIONS: VFR conditions are expected throughout the operational period

#### THUNDERSTORM SAFETY

Observe the 30/30 rule: If you see lightning and hear the thunderclaps follow in less than 30 seconds, take the storm precautions identified on Page 21 of the IRPG. Do not resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed.

### **INDICATORS OF EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR**

- A rapid increase in the fire's intensity
- High, sustained rate of spread
- Well-developed convection column
- Long-distance spotting (over 600 feet)
- Fire whirlwinds or horizontal flame sheeting
- Sudden calming of the wind

### COMMON DENOMINATORS OF FIRE BEHAVIOR ON TRAGEDY FIRES

- Most incidents happen on smaller fires or isolated portions of larger fires.
- Fires respond quickly to shifts in wind direction or wind speed.
- Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels.
- Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, and on steep slopes.
- Some suppression tools, most notably helicopters and air tankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and air tankers have been known to cause flare-ups and cause weak trees to fall.

#### DANGER

High rates of spread can cause entrapment, injury, and death.

Remain within 5 minutes of identified escape routes and safety zones at all times.

With the predicted weather (heat, lightning) take the time to considered the following before you engage;

- Standard Firefighting Orders
- Look Up, Down and Around
- Watch Out Situations
- Common Tactical Hazards
- LCES
- Planning for Medical Emergencies

- Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires
- Safety Zones

### If air or ground ambulance is DELAYED:

Package and transport patient to rendezvous with ambulance. Re-route EMS helicopter to rendezvous point as appropriate.

### If Declaring an "Incident within the Incident"

The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response.

The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

#### FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN

# Guidelines for dozer lines, hand lines, helispots, spike camps, drop points, water sources and safety zones:

Note: Where there is more rock than soil on control lines with slopes 5% or greater, waterbars are not needed as long as the non burnable debris on the line will dissipate the water enough to prevent channeling.

Stage 1) Soil and rocks will be put back on control lines and spread. Waterbarring will be completed where appropriate. No burnable material will be placed on the direct control lines.

Stage 2) In addition to stage 1 burnable material/debris will be placed on the lines and spread. Pull slash and downed trees over dozer line to reduce erosion and prevent unauthorized vehicular use.

Contingency line will be repaired as stage 2.

Obliterate any berms from the outside edge of existing fireline. Work material back onto the line. Do not sidecast berm material into or near stream channels.

Restore Forest roads to pre-fire suppression activities. Blade and grade travelway, remove berms, clean ditches and culvert inlets, chip roadside slash.

Repair fences damaged resulting from fire suppression activities.

Remove all improvised dams from drainages created for pumps and drafting. Area should be returned to pre fire suppression activities.

Water bars should be constructed at least 30 degrees perpendicular to the fireline. Make sure waterbars outlets are open.

Waterbars should be no further apart than this. When in doubt, put in more. Use only excavators for this work. Make sure waterbars outlets are open (often requires alittle shovel work).

### Watercourses:

All slash, soil, and debris deposited into watercourses resulting from fire suppression activities shall be removed and stabilized.

#### Concentrations of Green Timber

Areas that have concentrations of fallen or pushed over trees (not juniper) will need to be addressed. Trees over 10" DBH should have the root wad removed at the base and the tree placed with others in an organized fashion. All of the butts of the trees even, stacked on top of each other so that there 4-6 trees in a bundle. If possible the bundles will be parallel to the road and not overlapping.

Trees less than 10" DBH and root wads should be handled as slash/debris and used for covering dozer line to prevent vehicular travel and reduce erosion.

# STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES—FINANCE SECTION 16 HOURS IS NOT A GUARANTEE – IT IS HOURS WORKED!!

#### WORK REST CYCLE

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don't exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hours shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person's responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

#### **OPERATIONAL SHIFTS**

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

### **DUTY STATUS**

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, <u>and/or</u> be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed at least 8 hours of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

### PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

<u>Personnel time</u> will be reported to the Time Unit and daily once they are signed by the next level supervisor. OES resources will be monitored by OES Agency Rep (if assigned) for 2/1 Work Rest compliance. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (ie. HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

<u>Private Contracted Equipment time</u> must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily and hours on shift noted even if it is a daily rate. When swapping out operators you need to notify Finance as well as changing from single to double shift and vice versa.

Supervisor's - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

### MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). Until the fire is controlled, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation. Kitchen closes at 2200 so show dinner break unless you went off clock by 2130.





### FIRE REPLACEMENT PROCEDURES

### Submit requests for all incident replacements on a 213, General Message:

- Separate cache from non-cache items on separate 213's!
- Include explanation for lost or damaged items.
- Include DIVS signature on the 213 to verify the item(s) has/have been lost or damaged and support the circumstances surrounding it.
- For stolen items, contact your supervisor and Security Manager as soon as practical.

#### FOR CACHE ITEMS

### Requesting Resource is **NOT** Being Demobed and Requested Items **ARE** Available in Supply:

R&D shall fill request and note on the 213.

### Requesting Resource is NOT Being Demobed and Requested Items are NOT Available in Supply.

• The Supply Unit will place an order for the requested items through the regular cache order process on the incident. The order will be shipped to the incident and replacement will take place at the Supply Unit and noted on the 213.

# Requesting Resource <u>IS Being Demobed</u> and Requested CACHE Items are <u>NOT in Stock</u> in Supply:

- Along with the 213, complete an OF-315, Incident Replacement Requisition for cache items only
  and take to SPUL for review and approval. Include the requesting resources' email on the form so
  the Resource Order can be emailed to the Requesting Resource.
- The SPUL will issue S#'s pending receipt and verification of proper documentation for cache items.

### NON-CACHE Items – This is the Important Part!!!

### Non-Cache items include any item not available through the National Cache System.

Lost, damage, or destroyed government non-cache property shall be reported to the appropriate DIVS or higher-level overhead within 24 hours of occurrence. Stolen property shall be reported to the Security Manager. The requesting resource shall complete a 213 <u>and</u> *OF-289, Property Loss and Damage Report – Fire Suppression,* and include the following:

- All witnesses shall document the facts and circumstances of the loss or damage on the OF-289. Use additional paper if needed. Explanations shall be detailed and thorough.
- The requesting resource will take the 213 and OF-289 to the Comp/Claims Unit Leader (COMP) for review.
   The COMP will make a determination based up on the documentation presented and other information provided by the requesting resource.
- Approval for replacement is the responsibility of the incident agency and may be delegated to the Incident Management Team.
- If the replacement request is approved, the replacement cost will be limited to cache equivalent value. This value will be reflected on the Resource Order.
- Items that do not have a like-item in the cache will be reviewed and approved at the discretion of the FSC or Incident Business Advisor, as delegated by the Agency Administrator.
