## WEATHER DISCUSSION:

A cold front moving through the region this morning will bring much higher humidity and breezy conditions. Shower activity will move across the fire but precipitation amounts will be light with the best chance of moisture over Divisions C and H. Cloud cover will keep humidity minimums in the 30 to 40% range while temperatures will be 10 degrees cooler. Winds today will favor moving smoke towards Highway 299 down Canyon Creek. The flow aloft will turn northwesterly on Tuesday keeping cooler conditions over the region with a stronger front with a better chance of moisture expected arriving late Tuesday night and Wednesday.

**TODAY:** Mostly cloudy with isolated showers mainly in the morning. Areas of smoke lower elevations. Best chance of moisture Divisions C/H.

**TEMPERATURES:** High temperatures from 66 highest elevations to 77 Trinity river canyon.

**HUMIDITY:** Starting off today with a good recovery around 80%. **Minimum RH** 30% Trinity river canyon to 40% highest elevations.

### **20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOPS** - West northwest 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 20 mph. Gusts to 30 mph Weaver Bally lookout.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** - Upslope / Upvalley 3 to 6 mph except 10 to 15 mph west facing aspects and west to east running canyons including Trinity River canyon.

**CANYON CREEK** - Down valley 4 to 6 mph.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Weak inversions clearing around 1100 but limited smoke lift due to a stable atmosphere.

**FORECAST FOR MONDAY NIGHT SHIFT:** Decreasing clouds and cooler. Stronger inversions forming overnight with smoke in the valley. Minimum temperatures in the 40s. Excellent humidity recovery at 70-90%. Ridge winds northwest 10-15 mph. Slope winds becoming downcanyon 3-6 mph after sunset.

### **FORECAST FOR TUESDAY:**

Partly cloudy and continued cool. Afternoon cumulus with an isolated shower possible. Patchy smoke. High temperatures 68-78. Minimum RH 28-38% canyon bottoms to ridgetops. Ridge winds northwest around 10 mph with gusts to 20 mph. Slope and canyon winds becoming upslope to upcanyon 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph west facing aspects.

### **EXTENDED OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY:**

Windy and cloudy with a good chance of rain. Wetting rain possible Divisions C/H. Colder with high temperatures in the 50s and 60s. Minimum humidity 45 to 55%. West winds 15 to 20 mph with ridgetop gusts to 30 mph. Lighter winds north to south running drainages.

**Discussion:** A cold front moving through the region today will bring much higher humidity and breezy conditions.

**Weather:** Mostly cloudy with isolated showers mainly in the morning.

**Max Temp:** 66 – 77°      **Min RH:** 30 – 40%

**20 Foot Winds:**

**Slope/Valley** – Upslope/upcanyon 3-6 mph except 10-15 mph west facing aspects and west to east running canyons.

**Ridgetop** – W-NW 10-15 mph gusts to 20 mph. Gusts to 30 mph Weaver Bally lookout.

**Tonight:** Inversions forming overnight. Min Temp 40's; Max RH 70-90%. Ridge winds NW 10-15 mph.

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

### GENERAL

The Helena fire continues to spread through pockets of surface fuels, especially large dead materials. Fire spread and intensity mid-slope and above will increase as forecast winds impact the fire area but will be moderated as high relative humidity begins to influence dead fuel moisture. Rainfall will further inhibit fire spread.

### SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### Div A/C (Canyon Creek Rd.)

The Helena Fire reached the ridge separating Rarick Gulch from Gwin Gulch yesterday and spread a considerable distance to the northeast-east. Anticipate continued spread upslope today at slow to moderate rates and backing toward Canyon Creek.

#### Div O/R (Conner Creek, Eagle Creek drainages)

Containment lines in Conner Creek are nearly complete and expected to hold. If fire does cross the creek, discontinuous fuels should slow fire spread upslope to the south. Aviation has been effective at slowing fire spread in the drainage.

Fire in Eagle Creek drainage has continued to back and flank and has reached the creek in several areas. The greatest threat for crossing the drainage would be a tree falling across or torching/spotting near the drainage bottom. Water drops have aided in keeping the fire in check. Fire may spread rapidly upslope depending on where fire crosses the drainage bottom. Rainfall and increased humidity will reduce this risk.

#### Nighttime

Expect the fire behavior to be minimal after dark with excellent humidity recovery overnight.

## AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations may be limited in the morning due to inclement weather.

## SAFETY

The Helena Fire was very active on Sunday. Fuels will take some time to react to increased relative humidity and/or precipitation. Predicted winds can have a significant effect on spread and intensity even with increases in moisture. Ensure weather and fire behavior observations are taken on a regular basis and passed on to other line personnel.
