

*** RED FLAG WARNING FOR GUSTY WEST-SOUTHWEST WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITY ***

DISCUSSION: Strong west-southwest winds will return today, and it will be even drier than recent days with minimum humidities in the single digits this afternoon. A red flag warning is in effect for these critical burning conditions. Over exposed areas, expect light southwest flow in the morning to suddenly increase as the inversion mixes out late morning with strong, gusty winds continuing into the evening. Sheltered areas may also experience occasional westerly wind gusts mixing down. In addition, today will also be unstable with a haines of 5, however, any plume that attempts to develop will likely be sheared off until winds diminish late in the day.

THURSDAY: * WINDY AND DRY. RED FLAG WARNING. *****

- **WEATHER:** Sunny and windy.
- **WIND (20 FT): Ridges, exposed areas, and wind-aligned drainages:** South around 5-10 mph through 1200 then becoming southwest and increasing to 12-18 mph with gusts to 25 mph. **Sheltered areas:** Downslope 1-3 mph through 0900, then upslope 2-5 mph through 1300, then west around 5 mph with gusts to 10 mph.
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 85-90
- **MIN RH:** 8-13%
- **CHANCE RAIN:** 0%
- **HAINES:** 5
- **MIXING HEIGHT:** 500 ft AGL or less, increasing to 8,000 ft AGL around 1200, then increasing to 15,000 ft AGL.
- **MIXING WINDS:** Southwest 15-25 mph.

THURSDAY NIGHT: * WINDY AND DRY UNTIL SUNSET *****

- **WEATHER:** Clear.
- **WIND (20 FT): Ridges and exposed areas:** West-southwest 12-18 mph with gusts to 25 mph possible through 2100, then becoming southwest 5-10 mph. **Sheltered areas:** West 5 mph with gusts to 10 mph through 2100, then becoming downslope 1-3 mph.
- **MIN TEMPERATURES:** 50-55 valley bottoms, 60-65 mid-slope and above.
- **MAX RH:** 45-55% valley bottoms, 25-30% mid-slope and above.
- **CHANCE RAIN:** 0%
- **INVERSION:** Weak developing around mid-slope.

FRIDAY:

- **WEATHER:** Sunny and breezy.
- **WIND (20 FT): Ridges, exposed areas, and wind-aligned drainages:** Southwest 5-10 mph through 1200 then becoming southwest and increasing to 8-13 mph with gusts to 20 mph. **Sheltered areas:** Downslope 1-3 mph through 0900, then upslope 2-5 mph. Occasional west gusts to 10 mph mixing down after 1400.
- **MAX TEMPERATURES:** 80-85
- **MIN RH:** 10-15%
- **CHANCE RAIN:** 0%
- **HAINES:** 5
- **MIXING HEIGHT:** 500 ft AGL or less, increasing to 8,000 ft AGL around 1200, then increasing to 15,000 ft AGL.
- **MIXING WINDS:** Southwest 15-25 mph.

3-5 DAY OUTLOOK

Saturday and Sunday: Mostly sunny, dry and possibly very windy. Highs 78-83. Min RH: 12-17%. Winds WSW 15-25 mph with gusts to 30 mph. **Monday:** Partly cloudy and windy. Highs 75-80. Min RH 12-17%. Winds WNW 12-18 mph with gusts to 23 mph.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: **RED FLAG WARNING- Low Humidity Gusty SW Wind Conditions**
Warm and dry with single digit humidity and afternoon gusty SW winds, primarily terrain driven at eye level early then SW in the afternoon.

Temp: 85-90F RH: Min 8-13% Wind: Light and Variable turning SW 12-18 with gusts to 25 mph at the 20ft. level. Inversion to mix out at 1200 hrs. **Haines of 5.**

Both ERC and 1000 hr Fuel Moistures are in the 97th percentile. Live fuels recorded on 8-5-18 in sage were 89% and 71% at locations closest to the fire. Fine Dead should be 3% on a West Aspect in the afternoon with a PI of 90%.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

In the morning expect minimal fire activity until the inversion breaks around 1400 hrs. The moderate RH recovery will allow the fire to spread through the night on the slopes and ridges in the timber. **Today there is a high risk of pyrocumulus development and associated outflow winds.** Burning conditions will be active in the heavier dead fuels. The low RH values are keeping light fuels receptive to brands and providing complete consumption of the dead component. SW winds will test containment in Western parts of the fire that have fingered out to the West. Expect increased risk of spotting across HY 299 where green islands torch out or where mop-up has not been completed along the 299 corridor. Fires that escape containment in the peak of the burn period will have rapid ROS and long range spotting in any continuous fuel bed.

SPECIFIC:

Limited direct attack opportunities will be present in all divisions with light fuel loading in the early parts of the shift. Low ROS and flame length during the early part of operational period will be favorable and provide opportunities to secure containment along HY 299 and other areas critical to meet strategic objectives. Normal burning conditions after 1400 hrs. should produce ROS of 55-65 ch/hr and flame lengths 6-10 ft. in the grass shrub mix. In the heavy timber litter expect ROS of 10-20 ch/hr and flame lengths of 3-7 ft. Expect group torching in aligned drainages, with spot distances of up to 1 mile.

Divisions E/G may receive an early wind test as SW winds impact the fire edge that has extended out past the main fire and to the West. Any open line that orients in an East/West direction will be wind tested. This includes small doglegs that may have developed firing ops. Good mop-up depth will be critical to holding any of these parts of fireline.

Divisions A/Z will experience favorable wind conditions except for the area around DP 20. Any fire activity that can result in torching trees will increase spotting risk across HY 299.

Division M/J will experience adverse winds conditions that will test containment. Division J may need to initiate defensive firing for runs that escape neighboring divisions.


AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke may obscure air operation opportunities early in the operational period. As the fire moves into areas covered with more grass and less conifer, expect increased effectiveness with retardant application.


SAFETY

Pyrocumulus build up may cause erratic and gusty winds from plume collapse and outflow winds. Today is a Red Flag Day. If involved in IA, develop a plan of attack that accounts for both slow foot travel, sudden wind shifts and rapid rates of spread. Surface fires consuming large amounts of heavy dead component may pre-condition conifer canopy and increase probability of a re-burn though the crowns on steeper windward slopes.







CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask. **Do not post:**

- Inappropriate information, pictures or videos
- Opinions regarding the incident or policy
- Endorsements of any kind

FEDERAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Social media posts can reflect on the professionalism of your crew, your agency and Wildland Firefighting Community. The U.S. Forest Service has enjoyed a reputation as the world leader in wildland firefighting for over 100 years. Protect our legacy with good conduct on the fireline and online. When assigned to a federal fire you are considered a federal employee under the delegation of authority. Even if you are a contractor, AD or from a partner agency we recommend you follow these ethics guidelines which apply to federal employees all the time.

Think before you post:

- On official time, do official duties; if using government equipment, do government business.
- Don't use your official position/title for private gain.
- Do share government information that is publically available (such as links to Inciweb, weather reports, feature stories, official evacuation notices etc...) Do not disclose (via any medium) non-public information to further private interests or the private interests of others.
- Do not share information outside official channels that could be associated with a crime or a claim, (for instance do not post on social media about serious accidents, deaths or destroyed property).
- Do not accept compensation for statements made over social media that relate to official duties.
- Never use your official title while engaging in "political activity" (activity directed toward the success or failure of a political party, partisan candidate or partisan political group).
- Federal employees may express their opinions concerning partisan political candidates and political parties on social media when they are off duty and away from the federal workplace.
- If you have questions about content you'd like to post on social media, contact a PIO, they can help you.

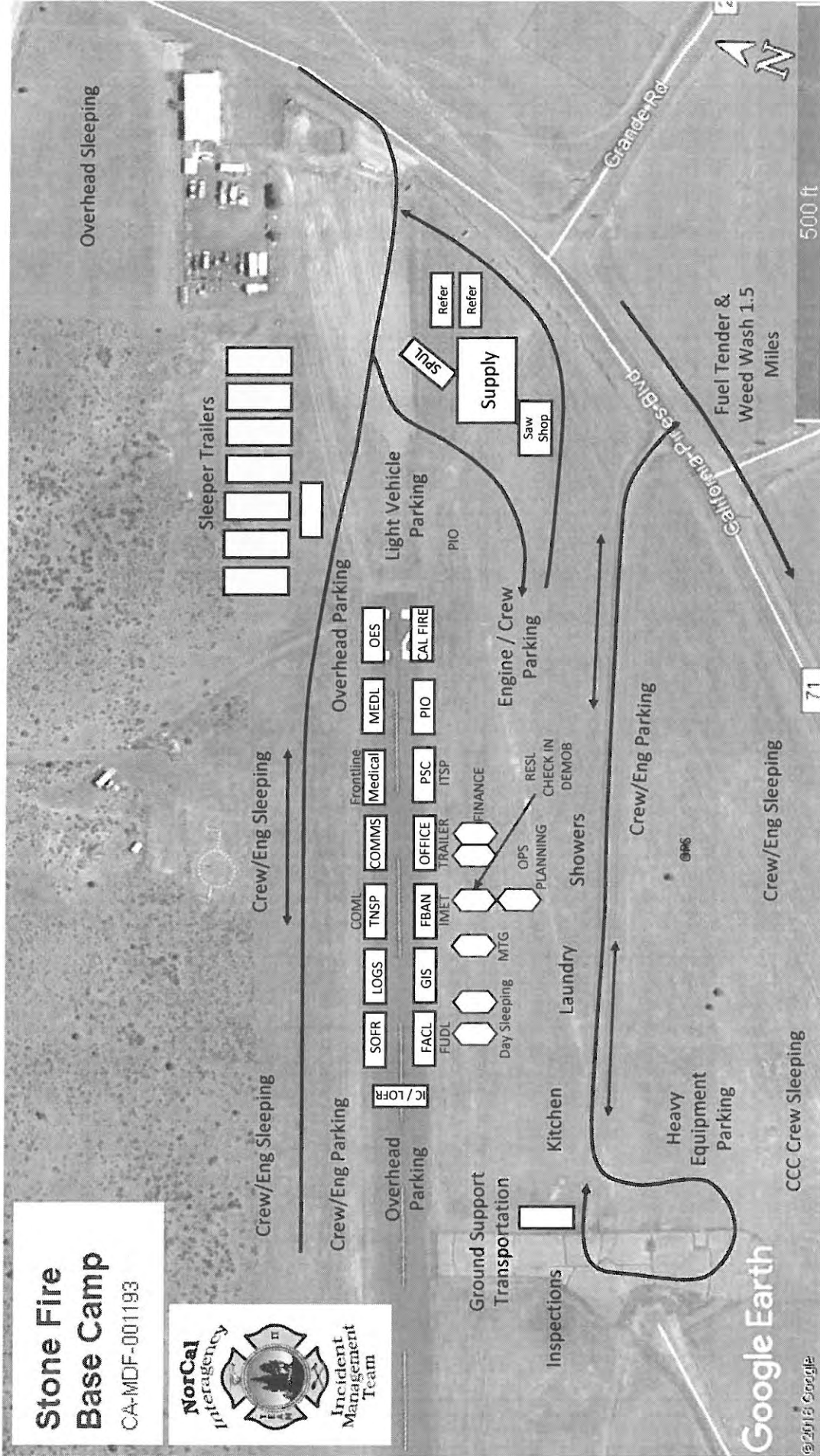
PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT

We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.
