

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A storm system moving south along the Washington coast will result in elevated winds today, mainly at the ridgetop levels. Terrain driven winds are expected below ridgetop locations except where the drainages align with the general wind flow direction. Temperatures will be a several degrees cooler today along with moderating relative humidity levels. There will be a slight chance of showers starting this afternoon and continuing into midday Thursday. Cooler temperatures and higher relative humidity values will continue into Friday morning.



FIRE BEHAVIOR

INPUTS:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fuels: Increased humidity will shorten the burn period. Fuel moisture will remain higher under the inversion. • Topography: Slope and rollout will be the primary driver of fire spread. Fire on ridges in alignment with wind will also see spread.
FIRE BEHAVIOR:	Diminished winds will see the return of fuel and slope driven fire spread. Fire will move through backing and flanking in timber fuels and short slope runs in brush. Expect FL of 10ft and ROS of 45ch/hr in brush and FL of 4-7ft and ROS of 7-9ch/hr in timber fuels. Isolated torching is possible in closed stands with moderate surface fuel.
Probability of Ignition:	80% in clear air. Spotting Distance: .2 mile from ridgetop locations.
BRANCH 9 - DIV YY:	Holding operations will be aided by the inversion. The best conditions for touch up firing will be later in the burn period, around 1600.
DIV ZZ:	Pockets of unburned fuel will continue to consume. South winds will bring clean air into the DIV and accelerate any fire behavior.
DIV AA:	Rollout from elevated line will continue to be a threat. Reduced potential for spots across Dog Creek as heavy surface fuel consumes.
BRANCH 7 - DIV CC:	Fire crossing North Fork of Dog Creek will be set up for a slope run. Brush fuel on lower slopes could ignite a run into heavier timber fuel on the surrounding ridges.
DIV DD:	Fire in Blodgett Creek drainage West of Slate Mountain Lookout will see reduced spread from increased humidity. However, spots from rollout will increase into the afternoon hours as fine fuel dries out.
BRANCH 4 - DIV GG:	Continued backing off ridge top locations through rollout. Inversion will break as forecast winds move into the DIV in around 1200.
DIV JJ:	Spotting across containment lines and cold areas of open line is probable as burn down occurs. Inversion breaking around 1200.
BRANCH 8 - DIV MM:	The spot in a side arm of Slate Creek became active with low humidity. Broken fuels beds and dissected land forms will break up any crown runs. Group torching will produce moderate range spotting of up to .2 miles.
DIV PP/TT:	Firing operations will be hampered by the inversion. The best firing condition will be after 1600 or in the evening hours.
DIV WW:	Holding operations will be aided by the inversion. The best conditions for touch up firing will be later in the burn period, around 1600.
Hirz Fire:	Threat of spread from the fires edge remains low. Remaining hot spots have very little fuel to run.

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations will be hampered by inversion in the morning. Most areas will experience clearing by late afternoon.

SAFETY

** Spotting continues to be a driver of fire spread. Spotting distances increase near ridge tops and can rapidly accelerate spread. es. **

Communications

- Share your Situational Awareness (hazards, changes, etc.) to those who also have a need.
- Radio Communications may be poor in some areas: use human repeaters as needed.
- Ensure all personnel are familiar with the ICS 205 incident communications plan and the ICS 206 medical plan.
- Make sure all resources have radios cloned appropriately.
- Ensure that non-agency resources understand radio use and procedures.

Fight Complacency

- Stay mentally engaged on the task at hand
- Give clear briefings.
- Address complacency in your daily AAR.
- Clearly identify the day's mission and purpose.
- Use the "Buddy System" and watch out for each other. If you see something, say something.
- Ask yourself: "Are you doing the job safely, the way you were trained?"
- Look for a "new" or "fresh" approach to repetitive assignments.

Driving & Fatigue

- Make sure you are getting your rest when you can! Stick to work/rest guidelines.
- Fatigue can cause us to mentally stray from the driving task.
- It only takes a second of distraction to lose control of our vehicle. The faster you are traveling, the faster you get in trouble.
- Make sure you recognize when you are too tired to drive!
- Don't tough it out and put yourself and your passengers at risk!
- Slow down, take breaks, and talk to your passengers. If possible, keep an alert passenger in the front seat next to you. Know your limits.

Individual Accountability


- Know where your crewmembers are at all times.
- Have crewmembers work in pairs.
- Inform Division or your Supervisor of changing locations.
- Review radio procedures, and ensure your radio is properly cloned.
- Check **IN** with the Division Supervisor on site if not assigned there
- Check **OUT** with your supervisor (or Division) at the end of shift.

YOU ARE ENTITLED TO ACTUAL HOURS WORKED!!

WORK REST CYCLE

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET A 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work.. Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don’t exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hrs shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person’s responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

OPERATIONAL SHIFTS

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

DUTY STATUS

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, and/or be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed **at least 8 hours** of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

Personnel time will be reported to the Time Unit and daily once they are signed by the next level supervisor. OES resources will be monitored by OES Agency Rep (if assigned) for 2/1 Work Rest compliance. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

Private Contracted Equipment time must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily and hours on shift noted even if it is a daily rate. When swapping out operators you need to notify Finance as well as changing from single to double shift and vice versa.

Supervisor’s - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). **Until the fire is controlled**, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For **personnel in support positions**, and fireline personnel **after control** of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. This statement does not mean you don’t show all meal breaks if taken. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. **If meal breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a -38- ement in remarks explaining the situation.**

If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance. -46-

Position Qualifications

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

Engagement/Disengagement

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

Debriefing

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be reviewed and signed by the next level supervisor. A finance "Rules of Engagement" document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

Social Media

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.

CALIFORNIA INTERAGENCY INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM 4 TRAINING EXPECTATIONS

1. Upon arrival at the incident and after check-in, the trainee will bring the following documents to the initial meeting with the training specialist:
 - a. A properly initiated Position Task Book.
 - b. Your Request Number and your Agency (3) letter identifier.
 - c. Your agencies Fire Chief or Training Officers name, address, and phone number to insure that a copy of the training documents will be mailed back to your home unit.
 - d. Your current Incident Qualification Card (red card) that identifies you as a Trainee in the position you are seeking to be trained.
2. Have you identified or has a Trainer been assigned to you and if so, have the Trainer present when you meet with the training specialist.
3. At closeout and prior to entering the demobilization process, you should complete, sign, and review with the trainer the Final exit interview form. Once the form is complete, bring the following documents to the Training Specialist for closeout;
 - a. Position Task Book (Evaluation Record dated and signed by the Trainer).
 - b. Completed ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Record) dated and signed by both the trainee and trainer.
 - c. Completed Final Exit Interview Form – dated and signed by both the trainee and the trainer.

Trainer Expectations

1. Arrive with the Trainee at the initial meeting with the Training Specialist.
2. Be ready to provide your Contact information and your Incident Request number.
3. Have a Current Incident Qualifications Card (Red Card) in a position of equal or greater qualifications that the Trainee is trying to achieve.
4. Be willing to educate, support, and provide professional and consistent feed back to the trainee during the assignment.
5. Throughout the incident the trainer shall continue to monitor and review with the trainee their tasks and goals within the task book.
6. The trainer, where appropriate is expected to sign off task's that are achieved by the trainee and to complete and sign the following documents.
 - a. ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Form)
 - b. Evaluation Record at the back of the task book.
7. The trainer shall portray a positive and professional attitude that lets the trainee know that it is desirable to ask for direction and feedback.
8. When accepting the role as a trainer, you are expected to act in a professional manner that represents the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 and your home agency.
