


WEATHER DISCUSSION: A series of weak systems will move across the Pacific Northwest through the upcoming weekend, resulting in continued cool daytime temperatures across the Hirz and Delta fires. The typical ridgetop wind flow pattern is expected with nighttime northerly winds and daytime south to southwest winds. Terrain driven winds are expected below the ridgetop locations. There will be a slight chance of showers through the morning hours today as the first system exits the region. Dry conditions are then expected into at least Sunday.



Weather:	Mostly cloudy early, then becoming partly cloudy. A 10 percent chance of showers in the morning. Patchy smoke. Weak inversion breaks around 1000.
Max Temps:	63-68 ridgetops and 73-78 lower drainages.
Min RH:	27-32 percent ridges and 22-27 percent lower drainages.
20 FOOT WINDS:	Ridges: North 4 to 9 mph with gusts to 15 mph until 1000, then South-Southwest 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 17 mph. Slope/valley: Downslope/Downvalley 3 to 6 mph until 1000, then upslope/upvalley 3 to 7 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

INPUTS:

- **Fuels:** Fine fuel under timber canopies will continue to be available even as humidity rises. Fine fuel moisture in open areas and at higher elevations will reduce spread and spotting potential.
- **Topography:** Fire has few remaining slopes to run. Fire is checked on containment line and topographic features. The fire will need to spot through rollout or group torching.

FIRE BEHAVIOR: Fuel and slope will drive fire spread. Fire will move through backing and flanking in timber fuels. Short slope runs in brush are possible, but late in the burn period. During the hottest part of the day, 1530-1730, Expect FL of 10ft and ROS of 40ch/hr in brush and FL of 4-7ft and ROS of 8ch/hr in timber fuels. Isolated torching is possible in closed stands with moderate surface fuel.

Probability of Ignition: 70% in clear air. **Spotting Distance:** .2 mile from ridgetop locations.

BRANCH 9 - DIV YY: Reduced potential for torching but spread rates will remain similar to previous shifts at 30-40ch/day. Best opportunity to burn will be later in the burn period.

DIV ZZ: Continued burn down of heavy fuels. Rollout from areas above the line remains possible.

DIV AA: Line remains static. Burn trough of fire weakened vegetation could send material dog to Dog Creek and Dog Creek Road.

DIV CC: Conditions for firing operations in Sec 26 will be best after 1500. Mixed fuels above the slope could transition to slope runs if a sustained fire front can organize. Any runs would transition to backing fire after crossing Damnation Ridge.

BRANCH 4 - DIV DD: Threat of rollout from ridge and underslung line locations remains. Slope runs back up to the ridge would be head fire in timber litter.

DIV GG: Few opportunities remain for aggressive spread. Fire crossing Halls Gulch Creek could make a short run up the South aspect. Expect open line locations to continue backing.

BRANCH 7 - DIV JJ/MM: Any spots across containment lines will exhibit low ROS and FL. Spotting from torching will be the most likely ignition source.

BRANCH 8 - DIV PP/TT: Firing operations will be more favorable as the burn period progresses. Spots across containment lines will exhibit low ROS and FL. Monitor downwind locations and areas of torching during the hottest part of the day as POI will be moderate with spotting distances of .2 mile from ridgetops.

DIV WW: Threat of spotting from torching remains high at the forks of Shotgun Creek and the confluence of Sacramento River. Swirling winds and steep slopes will make IA difficult.

Hirz Fire: Threat of spread from the fires edge remains low. Remaining hot spots have very little fuel to run.

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations will be hampered by inversion in the morning. Most areas will experience clearing by late afternoon.

SAFETY

** Cooler temperature do not mean greatly reduced fire behavior. Conditions for short crown runs remain. **






WORK REST CYCLE

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET A 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work.. Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don’t exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hrs shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person’s responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

OPERATIONAL SHIFTS

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

DUTY STATUS

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, and/or be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed **at least 8 hours** of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

Personnel time will be reported to the Time Unit and daily once they are signed by the next level supervisor. OES resources will be monitored by OES Agency Rep (if assigned) for 2/1 Work Rest compliance. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

Private Contracted Equipment time must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily and hours on shift noted even if it is a daily rate. When swapping out operators you need to notify Finance as well as changing from single to double shift and vice versa.

Supervisor’s - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). **Until the fire is controlled**, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For **personnel in support positions**, and fireline personnel **after control** of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. This statement does not mean you don’t show all meal breaks if taken. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. **If meal breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation.**

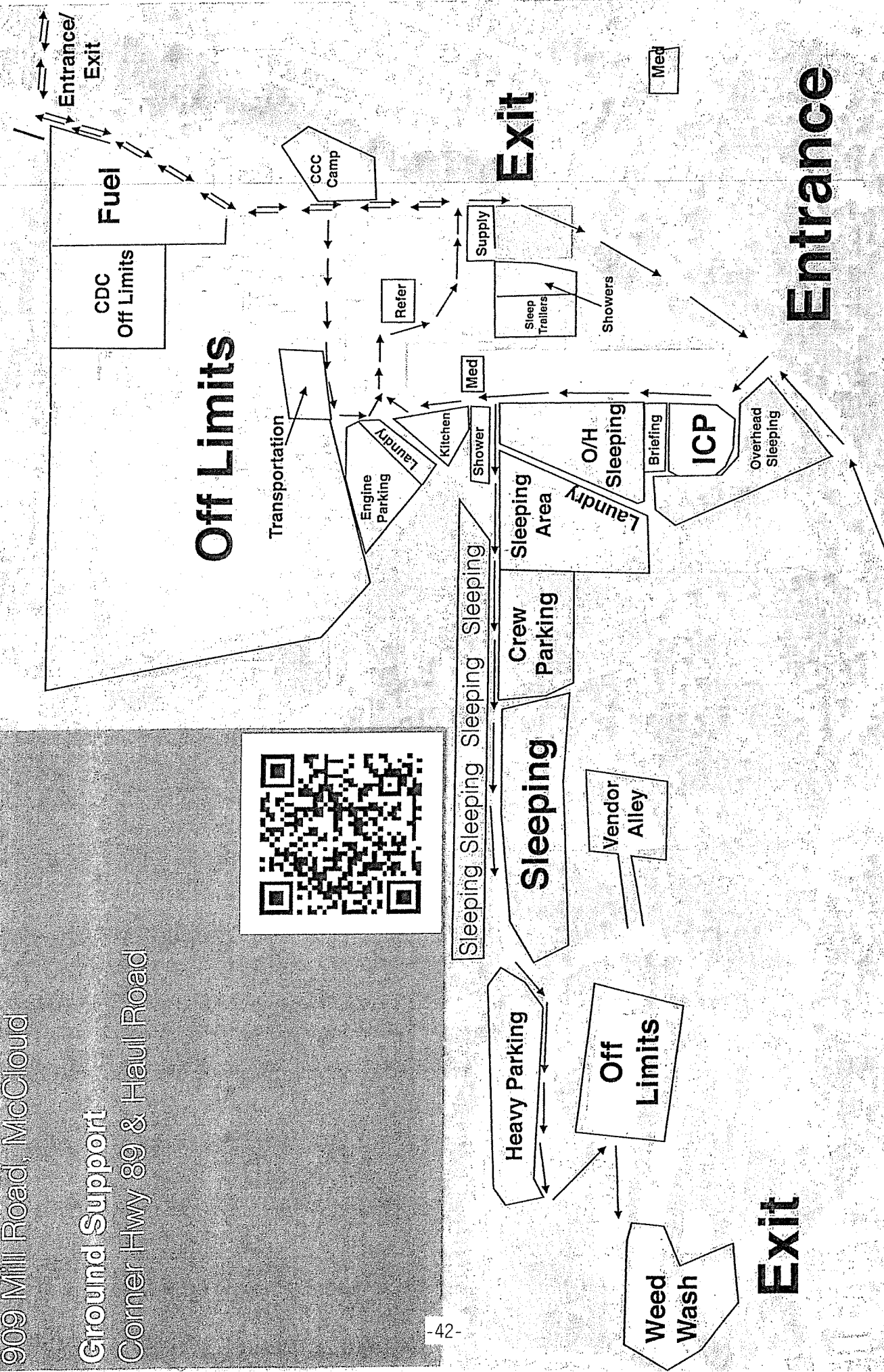
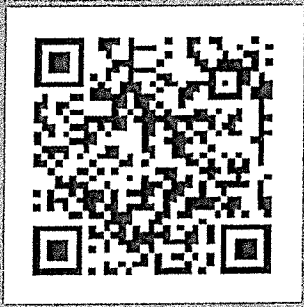

CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR

This team is committed to “**ZERO TOLERANCE**” of careless, illegal, inappropriate and unsafe actions.

Alcohol and/or illegal drugs are **NOT allowed** within the incident environment or while actively assigned to the incident. Local Law Enforcement Officials will be called to deal with any suspected illegal activities. Each employee has the responsibility to be ready, willing, and able to perform the duties for which they are qualified.

Sexual Harassment

Inappropriate actions or comments will not be tolerated. Everyone is expected to act in a professional manner. It is your responsibility to stop inappropriate actions or comments immediately upon becoming aware of such. Sexual Harassment must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist or Incident Commander. When outside of your designated sleeping area, you are required to wear at least a shirt, appropriate shorts, and shoes or sandals. If you need clarification of these expectations contact the Human Resource Specialist or IC. What we PERMIT we PROMOTE!!!!

SAFETY

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

EMPHASIS AREAS

Training

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations – See back page.**

Evaluations

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

Injuries/Claims

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

Work Rest Cycles

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

Position Qualifications

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

Engagement/Disengagement

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

Debriefing

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be reviewed and signed by the next level supervisor. A finance “Rules of Engagement” document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

Social Media

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident’s professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.

CALIFORNIA INTERAGENCY INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM 4 TRAINING EXPECTATIONS

1. Upon arrival at the incident and after check-in, the trainee will bring the following documents to the initial meeting with the training specialist:
 - a. A properly initiated Position Task Book.
 - b. Your Request Number and your Agency (3) letter identifier.
 - c. Your agencies Fire Chief or Training Officers name, address, and phone number to insure that a copy of the training documents will be mailed back to your home unit.
 - d. Your current Incident Qualification Card (red card) that identifies you as a Trainee in the position you are seeking to be trained.
2. Have you identified or has a Trainer been assigned to you and if so, have the Trainer present when you meet with the training specialist.
3. At closeout and prior to entering the demobilization process, you should complete, sign, and review with the trainer the Final exit interview form. Once the form is complete, bring the following documents to the Training Specialist for closeout;
 - a. Position Task Book (Evaluation Record dated and signed by the Trainer).
 - b. Completed ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Record) dated and signed by both the trainee and trainer.
 - c. Completed Final Exit Interview Form – dated and signed by both the trainee and the trainer.

Trainer Expectations

1. Arrive with the Trainee at the initial meeting with the Training Specialist.
2. Be ready to provide your Contact information and your Incident Request number.
3. Have a Current Incident Qualifications Card (Red Card) in a position of equal or greater qualifications that the Trainee is trying to achieve.
4. Be willing to educate, support, and provide professional and consistent feed back to the trainee during the assignment.
5. Throughout the incident the trainer shall continue to monitor and review with the trainee their tasks and goals within the task book.
6. The trainer, where appropriate is expected to sign off task's that are achieved by the trainee and to complete and sign the following documents.
 - a. ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Form)
 - b. Evaluation Record at the back of the task book.
7. The trainer shall portray a positive and professional attitude that lets the trainee know that it is desirable to ask for direction and feedback.
8. When accepting the role as a trainer, you are expected to act in a professional manner that represents the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 and your home agency.
