


**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Another dry day is expected as relative humidity across the fire will be in the 14 to 22 percent range, with the lowest values along the Interstate 5 corridor. Temperatures will also be slightly warmer today compared to yesterday. Winds are expected to be lighter today with more of a terrain driven influence. Even with the lighter winds, a few gusts will be possible across the ridgetops. Beginning tonight, the winds shift out of the north, where they will stay in that direction for the next few days. Wednesday and Thursday will be driest and warmest days this week. Some lower drainages will reach single digits relative humidity values with increasing winds from the north.



**Weather:**      **Day:** Partly cloudy, increasing clouds late in the day. Patchy smoke. Inversion breaks around 1000.  
**Night:** Partly cloudy to mostly cloudy skies. Patchy smoke. Inversion develops after 2100.

**Day/Night Temps:** 72-77 ridgetops and 80-85 lower drainages *then* 52-57 ridgetops, 47-52 lower drainages.

**Day/Night RH:** 17-22 percent ridges and 14-19 percent lower drainages *then* 42-47 percent ridges and 50-55 percent lower drainages.

**20 FOOT WINDS:** **Day/Night Ridges:** North 3 to 7 mph until 1000, then becoming South-Southwest 3 to 8 mph with gusts to 16 mph *then* South-Southwest 3 to 7 mph with gusts to 16 mph until 2100, then increasing North 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 18 mph.  
**Slope/valley:** Downslope/Downvalley 3 to 6 mph until 1000, then upslope/upvalley 3 to 7 mph *then* Upslope 3-7 mph becoming downslope 3-6 mph after 2200.

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

**INPUTS:**

- **Fuels:** Previously underburned aerial fuels are more susceptible to torching. Fuel moistures are near averages for this time of year. The exception is 1000hr fuels that are at the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile.
- **Topography:** Slope will enhance transition from surface to crowns, especially in brush and previously underburned fuels.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR:** In timber fuels, fire is re-burning areas that have previously seen fire during this incident. Some areas have had over story impacted by fire and are abnormally dry. During the hottest part of the day, 1530-1730, Expect FL of 12ft and ROS of 36ch/hr in brush and FL of 6-8ft and ROS of 8ch/hr in timber fuels.

**Probability of Ignition:** 90% in clear air.      **Spotting Distance:** .2 mile from ridgetop locations.

**Day: BRANCH 9 - DIV PP/TT:** Interior pockets continue to consume. Potential for slope runs up to Middle Ridge remains. Broken surface fuels on the reverse slope will slow spread.

**DIV WW/YY:** Torching remains possible on Southern slopes. Pockets of unburned fuels could produce active fire behavior.

**DIV ZZ/AA/CC:** Moderate fire behavior will likely produce spots on CC. Firing operations in Lunch Gulch will have favorable conditions after 1000. Elsewhere, only isolated areas of heat remain. Rollout from areas above the line remains possible.

**BRANCH 4 - DIV DD/GG:** Except for the area near the CC/DD break, few areas of heat remain along the line. Rollout remains possible.

**DIV JJ/MM:** Torching near ridges could produce spots during the hottest part of the day.

**Hirz Fire:** Threat of spread from the fires edge remains low. Remaining hot spots have very little fuel to run.

**Night: North – DIV PP/TT/WW/YY:** Forecast north winds at upper elevations will aid holding. Humidity recover will be near moisture of extinction at lower elevations. Little threat of escape or spots.

**South – DIV ZZ/AA/CC:** Winds will switch to the North around 2100 with moderate humidity recovery. Fire will remain active into the morning hours. Lower elevations will experience humidity near the moisture of extinction. Little threat of escape or spots.

Clear to moderate conditions with little smoke impact.

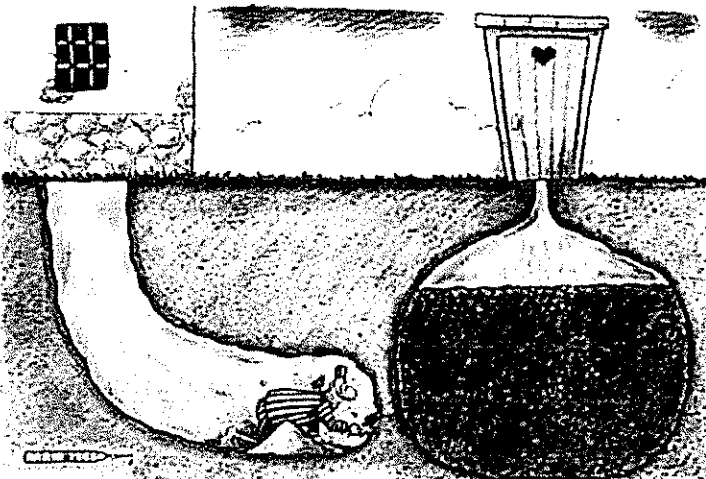

### Do Basic Things Very Well

- **Fire Behavior:** Follow the Ten Standard Fire Orders in a methodical and thorough way.
- **Hazard/Danger Trees:** Scout work areas, evaluate hazard trees, develop controls, and apply them to mitigate risk.
- **Driving to and from the Line:** Give a briefing on driving hazards prior to every trip.
- **Hydration and Fatigue:** Hydration starts PRIOR to the beginning of shift, drink a 2:1 ratio of water to sports drinks. Monitor fatigue levels, and do not exceed the 2:1 work rest ratio..

**Never commit to an action without a plan, however...**



**...make sure it is a good plan!**

### Beware of Soft Shoulders

- Many incident roads have **soft shoulders** on the downhill side.
- Wheels may sink into these areas causing the driver to **lose control** of the vehicle.
- **Stay well away** from the downhill side of all roads.
- Allow opposing heavy vehicle traffic to **pass slowly on the uphill side** of narrow access roads, after ensuring there is adequate room.
- Increase following distance to **maintain visibility**.
- **Use a spotter** when backing or turning around your vehicle. Do a walk around if a spotter is not available.

## INCIDENT REPLACEMENT POLICY & PROCESS

Prior to release from the incident, personnel may request replacement of equipment and supplies that were damaged, lost, or consumed during the incident. There is a distinct difference in the process to replace cache equipment and supplies and non-cache or specialized equipment. Damaged property **will be turned into the Supply Unit** prior to an Incident Replacement Requisition being approved.

Replacement of cache equipment is documented on a 213 General Message form and filled at the Supply Unit or approved for replacement at the home unit. Approval for replacement of non-standard cache items has been delegated to the IC, Finance Section Chief and IBA. You should initiate this process at least two days prior to demob.

Personnel who need to replace/repair damaged property will document the request and circumstances on a 213 General Message signed by your Incident Supervisor. The lost or damaged item(s) will then be taken to either, Supply, Communications or Ground Support for inspection and recommendation for replacement or repair. Bring the completed form to COMP/CLAIMS who will review the request and forward it to the FSC. The IC/FSC will make a decision as to whether or not the items can be replaced or repaired with incident funds.

Items originally purchased through use of preparedness funds which need to be replaced due to normal wear and tear should be accomplished using home unit funds, not incident funds. If government property was damaged on the incident due to a specific event, e.g. wind event destroys tent, items are burned over or caused by actions where there is no negligence, the incident could, upon receipt of required documentation and proof of damage, authorize replacement using the Incident Replacement Requisition.

In some cases, the cache replacement is not acceptable on some specialty items (e.g. sleeping bag or specialty packs). These items may be replaced with no more than "cache" quality and cost. The IBA or FSC must approve these requests.

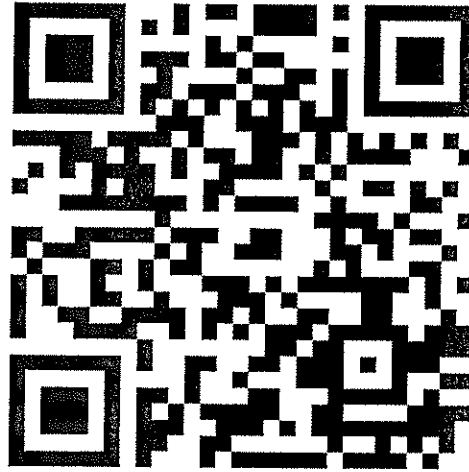

## Effective Waterbars

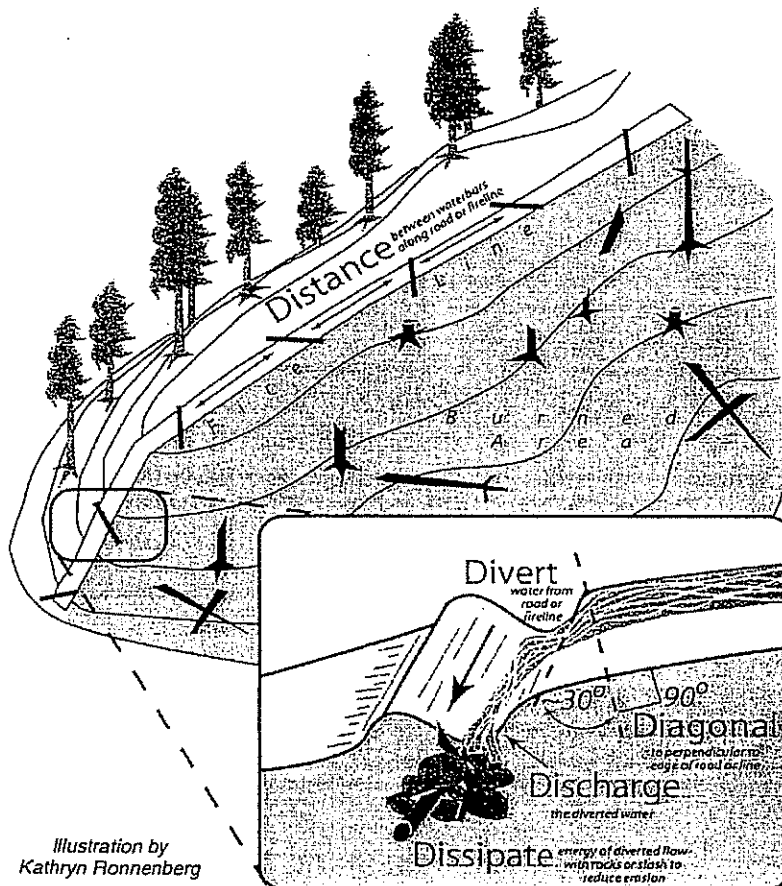
When locating and building water bars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fireline, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable, and that soil does **not block** the water bar outlet.

### Recommended spacing for waterbars on firelines.

Fireline slope %	Maximum Distance Apart (feet)
1 – 5	200
6 – 20	125
21 – 40	60
41 – 60	40
>60	25

*Waterbars should be at least 2 pulaski (4-6 inches) widths wide and 12-24 inches high for handlines.*

*Waterbars should be no more 2-3 feet tall on dozer lines to enable future access.*

## Stage 2 Suppression Repair Guidelines

(Apply to National Forest System Lands only on dozer lines with moderate to heavy suppression generated debris)

### Applicable Suppression Repair Plan Objectives

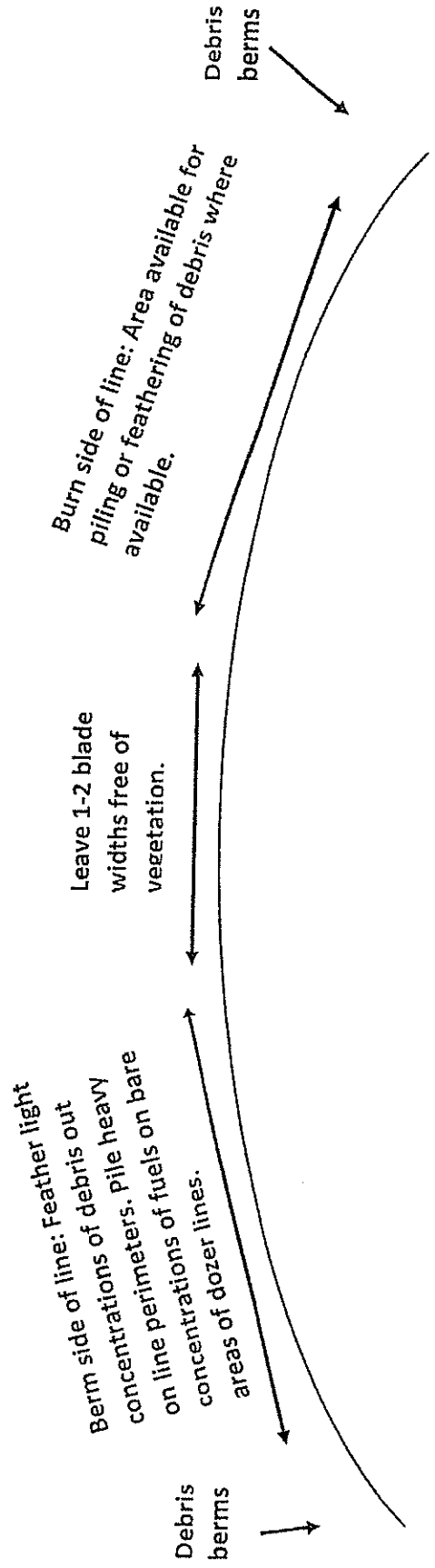
- Minimize loss of soil productivity due to potential erosion in cleared areas.
- Minimize surface erosion.
- Minimize excessive side-cast fuels.

### General Instructions

- Pile excessive amounts of suppression generated debris.
- Smaller concentrations of suppression generated debris can be feathered back into scraped side slope areas in order to breakdown fuel concentrations and reduce erosion.

### Piling Specifications

- Piles should be located at least 10 feet away from tree boles and preferably out of the drip line of the canopy where possible.
- If working in close or closed canopy piles should be built in a configuration that prevents excessive tree scorch (e.g. small piles, windrowed piles).
- If working in large openings on large dozer lines piles can be larger (e.g. 25x25 feet).
- Compress piles as much as possible to improve burn consumption.
- Piles should be clean (free of soil) to ensure adequate consumption during burning and reduced risk of escape in spring.

## **CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR**

## **SAFETY**

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

## **EMPHASIS AREAS**

### **Training**

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations – See back page.**

### **Evaluations**

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

### **Injuries/Claims**

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

### **Work Rest Cycles**

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

### **Position Qualifications**

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

### **Engagement/Disengagement**

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

### **Debriefing**

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

### **Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets**

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be reviewed and signed by the next level supervisor. A finance "Rules of Engagement" document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

### **Social Media**

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.

  - b. Your Request Number and your Agency (3) letter identifier.
  - c. Your agencies Fire Chief or Training Officers name, address, and phone number to insure that a copy of the training documents will be mailed back to your home unit.
  - d. Your current Incident Qualification Card (red card) that identifies you as a Trainee in the position you are seeking to be trained.
2. Have you identified or has a Trainer been assigned to you and if so, have the Trainer present when you meet with the training specialist.
3. At closeout and prior to entering the demobilization process, you should complete, sign, and review with the trainer the Final exit interview form. Once the form is complete, bring the following documents to the Training Specialist for closeout;
  - a. Position Task Book (Evaluation Record dated and signed by the Trainer).
  - b. Completed ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Record) dated and signed by both the trainee and trainer.
  - c. Completed Final Exit Interview Form – dated and signed by both the trainee and the trainer.

## **Trainer Expectations**

1. Arrive with the Trainee at the initial meeting with the Training Specialist.
2. Be ready to provide your Contact information and your Incident Request number.
3. Have a Current Incident Qualifications Card (Red Card) in a position of equal or greater qualifications that the Trainee is trying to achieve.
4. Be willing to educate, support, and provide professional and consistent feed back to the trainee during the assignment.
5. Throughout the incident the trainer shall continue to monitor and review with the trainee their tasks and goals within the task book.
6. The trainer, where appropriate is expected to sign off task's that are achieved by the trainee and to complete and sign the following documents.
  - a. ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Form)
  - b. Evaluation Record at the back of the task book.
7. The trainer shall portray a positive and professional attitude that lets the trainee know that it is desirable to ask for direction and feedback.
8. When accepting the role as a trainer, you are expected to act in a professional manner that represents the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 and your home agency.
