General Control Objectives for the Incident (include alternatives) <p style="text-align: center;">Leader's Intent</p> <p>A full suppression strategy will be implemented for the Hirz Fire through a combination of direct and indirect strategies. Efforts will be made to minimize fire spread and severity across private timberlands and structures through the application of well-planned tactical responses.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Management Objectives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that strategies and tactics provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management principles. • Minimize the threat to private property, critical infrastructure, and commercial timberlands while working with READs to reduce negative impacts to cultural/sensitive sites. • Establish and strengthen cooperators, partners, and stakeholder relationships • Minimize the cost of the incident by employing tactics that have the highest probability of success while minimizing firefighter exposure. <p style="text-align: center;">Control Objectives</p> <p>Keep the Hirz Fire:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • North of Gilman Road to protect private residences and property to the south. • South of Tom Neal Creek Road to protect private and federal timberlands and natural resource values, including Northern Spotted Owl habitat and Inventoried Roadless Area. • East of Middle Salt Creek to Green Mountain to North Fork Salt Creek to protect private property and infrastructure values in and around the Interstate 5 corridor. • West of Squaw Valley Creek, McCloud River and McCloud River arm of Shasta Lake to protect private timberlands, natural resource values, including northern spotted owl habitat and recreation infrastructure. 															
6. Weather Forecast for Period: WEATHER DISCUSSION ...A stronger inversion is expected over the fire area this morning and this has the potential to keep more smoke trapped over the fire. Reduced visibilities (1-3 miles), especially in the drainages this morning, will be possible due to the smoke. The inversion should break by 1300. Temperatures will be 3-5 degrees cooler than Tuesday and minimum relative humidities up 4-8 percent. Winds will be more terrain driven with downslope/downvalley in the morning and upslope/upvalley in the afternoon. Ridge winds will generally be from the south and southwest. Humidity recoveries are expected to be in the good category tonight with the inversion developing once again after 2100. At this time indications are the inversion may not break until later in the day on Thursday. Temperature and humidity values on Thursday will be similar to the conditions on Wednesday. Terrain driven winds can also be expected.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: A Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory is still effect for heavier than normal grass and low fuel moistures. The fire is burning in mixed brush and timber stands with timber litter. The fire will continue to move to the north under the expected weather conditions. The inversion layer will be thicker today, limiting fire activity until the air starts clearing midafternoon. Fire activity may start to pick up in favored drainages and over the ridgetops, but shouldn't make large movements without a strong wind.

Branch I

DIV A/B: No control problems expected continue to patrol and watch for rollout into the receptive fuels.

DIV F: No control problems expected, continue to monitor interior for fuels burning out.

DIV T: Watch for increased activity within the pine plantations and slash.

Branch III

DIV U: Expect the fire to continue to flank and back into drainages north of the ridge between Green Mtn and High Mtn. Fire activity will increase to the North especially as the fire experiences slope reversals.

DIV W: Expect the fire to continue to back down the northern slope of Tombstone Mtn with rollout producing short duration runs uphill. Fire should remain within the understory, with occasional single and group torching.

Branch V

DIV Y: The fire continues to move North / Northeast along the McCloud River. Threat of the fire crossing the McCloud River still exists in sections 28 and 33.

DIV Z: No control problems expected, continue to monitor interior for fuels burning out.

Contingency Branch

DIV NN/OO/RR: If fire crosses the McCloud River, upslope runs can be expected.

DIV XX: No expected fire impacts.

AIR OPERATIONS: The thicker inversion will limit air operations until later in the day.

- The thicker inversion will make seeing the fire more difficult, be aware of unburned fuel between you and the main fire.
- Watch for hazard trees and hot stump holes.
- Watch for rolling material.


Special Medical Emergency Procedures for remote locations and night shift:

Identify your EMT's for each Division. In the event of a medical emergency, notify your division supervisor (DIVS) and initiate care with available resources on scene. **Follow the MEDICAL INCIDENT REPORT (MIR) procedure on pages 118-119 in the 2018 IRPG or from last page of the IAP.** Using the MIR, notify Hirz Communications of the type of emergency and the location over the command channel. This will initiate the Incident Within Incident (IWI) procedures to get the appropriate recourses to assist in the emergency.

The DIVS, or designee, shall coordinate the incident and direct necessary actions. Take the following actions:

1. Determine the nature of the emergency.
2. If the emergency is a medical injury/illness, determine if the injury/illness is life threatening. **Green (Non-Life Threatening), Yellow (Serious Injury/Illness), Red (Life Threatening Injury/Illness).**
3. If the injury is life threatening, then clear designated frequency for emergency traffic.
4. Identify the on-scene point of contact by position.
5. Hirz Communications will contact the Medical Unit Leader and Safety immediately.
6. Identify number injured, patient assessment(s), location (geographic and/or GPS coordinates), and agency of the patient(s).
7. Identify on-scene medical personnel by division and position (i.e. Tango Medic, Tango EMT)
8. Identify preferred method of patient transport. **Ground or Air.**
9. Determine any additional resources or equipment needed.

Continually evaluate the Evacuation Plan, develop contingencies in the event the first plan is not effective.

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical. IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
