Exertional Heat Injury


- **Extreme Signs/Symptoms:** Muscle pain out of proportion to exercise performed; tea colored urine; muscle swelling (compartment syndrome).
- **Know your risk factors:** Drinking Energy Drinks, excessive caffeine intake, history of previous heat injury, reluctance to report issues or illness, pushing oneself past the point of exhaustion, low fitness level and/or higher % of body fat, Dehydration and/or inadequate nutrition.
- If heat injury is suspected, immediately start active cooling. Do not leave affected personnel alone. **Start EMS protocols immediately.**



SERIOUS INJURY PROCEDURES

Firefighter Health & First Aid

Dealing with serious injuries on the fireline can add even more stress to our hectic work environment. In the event a fireline accident occurs, adherence to the following principles is important to insure an adequate and appropriate response is made.

- ◆ Before entering the scene, determine whether it is safe to approach. Look for hazards as well as what may have happened. It may be necessary to move the patient or to make the area safe before doing an assessment.
- ◆ Provide first aid and assess the extent of the injuries.
- ◆ Make contact with your supervisor. Depending on the complexity of the fire, that could be your crew boss, the Division Supervisor, the IC, or even dispatch. If your fire has a medical plan, follow the plan.
- ◆ Provide them with accurate, concise information on the following
 - Number of people injured
 - Type of injuries
 - Severity of injuries (light, moderate, severe, life threatening)
 - Mechanism of injury
 - Vital signs (pulse, respirations, level of consciousness, etc)
- ◆ Determine the best method of evacuation. Depending on the severity of injury or availability of resources, this decision may already be made for you.
- ◆ Keep the radio frequency clear of non-emergency traffic, provide updates of the patient's condition and await instructions.
- ◆ If evacuation is by helicopter, it may be necessary to construct a helispot. Document treatment provided in case it is necessary to send the information along with the patient in the aircraft.
- ◆ If the patient needs to be carried to a road, insure enough people are available to work in relays.
- ◆ Once the patient is clear, take a moment to write down witness statements, clean up notes and timelines, and document any other pertinent information.

Incident Behavior

It is extremely important that inappropriate behavior be recognized and dealt with promptly. If inappropriate behavior is allowed to continue, not only would it adversely impact the affected individual and your crew, as a witness, you could be held accountable for your inaction.

Inappropriate behavior is considered any form of conduct that negatively impacts the work environment for the affected individual or those who witness the conduct. Any form of harassment and/or bullying or use of any language that could violate a Civil Rights policy, will not be tolerated and must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist (HRSP).

When you observe or hear of any inappropriate behavior, you should:

- Educate your staff/subordinates of their rights and responsibilities.
- Provide support to anyone who was negatively impacted by the inappropriate behavior.
- Immediately direct the alleged offender to stop their behavior.
- If the behavior is minor in nature, such as discourteous or disrespectful conduct, advise them if the behavior continues, disciplinary action may be taken.
- Document the inappropriate behavior with facts and report it to the HRSP.
