Discussion: Low pressure remains over Oregon today through Wednesday bringing a threat of Thunderstorms...

Weather: Mostly sunny. Hazy and areas of smoke.

Max Temps: 87 - 90° Min RH: 10 - 16%

20' Wind: Downcanyon 2-5 mph through 0900 then upslope/upcanyon 3-6 mph after 1100. Gusts to 12 after 1300.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Forecasted Indices: Sugarloaf BI (Fuel Model G) 67 down 4; Sugarloaf ERC (Fuel Model G) 90 <u>no change</u> GENERAL:

- Fuels: NW California is currently under a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory for a heavier than normal grass crop and low fuel moistures through the end of August. Fire history is minimal, timber litter accumulation is significant, and available fuels are significantly increased in private timber blocks with red slash and induced shrub/oak mortality, leading to a high resistance to control. All live fuel moistures are reaching critically dry levels. Live fuel moistures are modeled to be at/near 70% (lower on SW aspects) and the dead/down 1000 hr. fuel moistures are < 6%.
- **Topography**: All aspects are represented in the fire. The fire is burning on steep terrain above the McCloud Arm of Lake Shasta, the McCloud River and on either side of the Salt Creek drainage with slopes that vary between 35 and 75%. Elevation range is 1100 3969'.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

- Short uphill runs in brush exceeding 80 ch/hr with 12-20' flame lengths may occur. This will trigger group- and single-tree torching with flames in excess of 100' to include short-range spotting < 0.3 mile (further if plume dominated fire behavior develops). Fire could travel over a mile during the burn period, when in alignment.
- Probability of ignition 85- 91%.
- The majority of the fire spread will continue to be flanking and backing aided by rollout on steep slopes (ROS <2 ch/hr and flame lengths 1-3').

Branch I DIV A/B: No control problems expected along the Gillman Road from DP1 to DP15 and on to Matquaw Flat. Burn out is completed to the Ing house tying it into the main fire. Watch for rollout; expect spotting to continue into the receptive fuels outside the fire perimeter near the structures.

DIV F: Fire will continue to back into the Middle Salt Creek drainage. Expect similar conditions today for any burnout operations NW toward DP-35. Expect excessive heat in the cut block/treated area adjacent to DP-29.

DIV T: Slope reversal occurs when the fire crosses the Middle Salt Creek. Expect short duration runs upslope, with the possibility of crossing Fenders Ferry Road. Fuel composition changes as the fire enters the High Fire, with more brush/grass than timber. Conditions for burning from Green Mt down to DP40 & 35 will be favorable with light upslope winds. Unburned fuels between you and the fire, Post lookouts.

DIV Z: The fire will continue to flank actively on the upper slopes, and short duration upslope runs will occur as the fire continues moving north up the McCloud River drainage, leading to a threat of fire across the McCloud River. Rollout will continue to extend backing fire spread.

Contingency Branch II DIV Y/U: No expected fire impacts. Unburned fuels between you and the fire, post lookouts.

Contingency Branch East DIV OO/RR/XX: Unstaffed. No expected fire impacts.

### **SERIOUS INJURY PROCEDURES**

Firefighter Health & First Aid

Dealing with serious injuries on the fireline can add even more stress to our hectic work environment. In the event a fireline accident occurs, adherence to the following principles is important to insure an adequate and appropriate response is made.

- Before entering the scene, determine whether it is safe to approach. Look for hazards as well as what may have happened. It may be necessary to move the patient or to make the area safe before doing an assessment.
- Provide first aid and assess the extent of the injuries.
- Make contact with your supervisor. Depending on the complexity of the fire, that could be your crew boss, the Division Supervisor, the IC, or even dispatch. If your fire has a medical plan, follow the plan.
- Provide them with accurate, concise information on the following
  - · Number of people injured
  - Type of injuries
  - Severity of injuries (light, moderate, severe, life threatening)
  - Mechanism of injury
  - Vital signs (pulse, respirations, level of consciousness, etc)
- Determine the best method of evacuation. Depending on the severity of injury or availability of resources, this decision may already be made for you.
- Keep the radio frequency clear of non-emergency traffic, provide updates of the patient's condition and await instructions.
- If evacuation is by helicopter, it may be necessary to construct a helispot. Document treatment provided in case it is necessary to send the information along with the patient in the aircraft.
- If the patient needs to be carried to a road, insure enough people are available to work in relays.
- Once the patient is clear, take a moment to write down witness statements, clean up notes and timelines, and document any other pertinent information.



# **Human Resource Message**

### **Incident Behavior**

It is extremely important that inappropriate behavior be recognized and dealt with promptly. If inappropriate behavior is allowed to continue, not only would it adversely impact the affected individual and your crew, as a witness, you could be held accountable for your inaction.

Inappropriate behavior is considered any form of conduct that negatively impacts the work environment for the affected individual or those who witness the conduct. Any form of harassment and/or bullying or use of any language that could violate a Civil Rights policy, will not be tolerated and must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist (HRSP).

When you observe or hear of any inappropriate behavior, you should:

- Educate your staff/subordinates of their rights and responsibilities.
- Provide support to anyone who was negatively impacted by the inappropriate behavior.
- Immediately direct the alleged offender to stop their behavior.
- If the behavior is minor in nature, such as discourteous or disrespectful conduct, advise them if the behavior continues, disciplinary action may be taken.
- Document the inappropriate behavior with facts and report it to the HRSP.
