Forecasted Indices: Sugarloaf BI (Fuel Model G) 66 down 1; Sugarloaf ERC (Fuel Model G) 89 down 1 GENERAL:

- Fuels:
 - NW California is currently under a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory for a heavier than normal grass crop and low fuel moistures through the end of August.
 - Timber/brush litter accumulation is significant
 - All live fuel moistures are reaching critically dry levels
- Topography: All aspects are represented in the fire. The fire is burning on steep terrain with slopes that vary between 35 and 75%. Elevation range is 1100 - 3969'.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

- Uphill runs in brush exceeding 80 ch/hr with 12-20' flame lengths may occur. This may trigger group and single tree torching with flames in excess of 100' to include short-range spotting < 0.3 mile (further if plume dominated fire behavior develops). Fire could travel over a mile during the burn period, when in alignment.
- Probability of ignition 83 89%.
- The majority of the fire spread will continue to be flanking and backing aided by rollout on steep slopes (ROS <2 ch/hr and flame lengths 1-3').

Branch I DIV A/B: No control problems expected along the Gillman Road from DP1 to DP15 and on to Matquaw Flat. Burn out is completed to the Ing house tying it into the main fire. Watch for rollout into the receptive fuels outside the fire perimeter near the structures.

DIV F: Fire will continue to back into the Middle Salt Creek drainage. Expect similar conditions today for any burnout operations NW toward DP-35. Expect excessive heat in the cut block/treated area adjacent to DP-29.

DIV T: Slope reversal occurs when the fire crosses the Middle Salt Creek. Expect short duration runs upslope, with the possibility of crossing Fenders Ferry Road. Fuel composition changes as the fire enters the High Fire, with more brush/grass than timber. Conditions for burning from Green Mt down to DP40 & 35 will be favorable with light upslope winds. Unburned fuels between you and the fire, Post lookouts.

DIV Z: As the fire continues moving north up the McCloud River drainage, the fire will continue to flank and back actively on the upper slopes. Rollout will bring fire down, extending backing fire spread, allowing short duration upslope runs to occur, leading to a threat of fire across the McCloud River.

Contingency Branch II DIV Y/U: No expected fire impacts. Unburned fuels between you and the fire, post lookouts.

Contingency Branch III DIV OO/RR/XX: Unstaffed. No expected fire impacts.

After Action Review part 1

Fire Communication Category

How to conduct an effective AAR

An AAR is a professional discussion of an event with the objective to identify successes and failures. It is a tool that leaders, teams, crews and units can use to get maximum benefit from every incident or project. It is essential for wildland firefighters to learn from our mistakes and to capitalize on our successes. It is considered a valuable tool in high-risk professions where the smallest mistakes can lead to disastrous results. FYI – an AAR is not a critique and not a forum to assign blame. It's an open, honest and professional discussion for purposes of improvement.

Once you (the leader/facilitator) have demonstrated that the AAR works and that it will be part of your team's Standard Operating Procedures, the discussion will become more open. Finding out *what* they did is not nearly as important as *why* they did it. Good active listening skills are essential. Do not immediately try to solve or correct the issue, but let it play out. Try to get to the root of the issue. The leader must be a part of the AAR and will have to accept criticism. This is important because the team will be looking for affirmation of the AAR process.

- Have the AAR as soon after an event as possible with all the personnel involved if at all possible.
- The leader's role is to insure there is skilled facilitation of the AAR.
- Make sure everyone participates.
- Pay attention to time.
- Establish clear ground rules: encourage candor and openness, all participants have equal ownership, focus on improving performance, and keep all discussions confidential.
- End on a positive note.

1. What was planned?

Review the intent of the mission
Desired "End State" (what does "Right" look like).

2. What actually happened?

Establish the facts

Pool multiple perspectives to build a shared picture of what happened.

3. Why did it happen?

Analysis of cause and effect

Focus on WHAT not WHO.

Provide progressive refinement for drawing out explanations of what occurred.

4. What are we going to do next time?

Correct Weaknesses

Focus on items you can fix, rather than external forces outside of your control.



Human Resource Message



Communication

Communication is a two-way street. When communication becomes a one-way, it becomes a traffic jam and turns into an issue. Some examples are:

- Someone irritating you and getting on your nerves, but you don't say anything until it boils over and causes a crash.
- A misunderstanding of what someone was trying to communicate to you, but you didn't take the time to clarify what was said and just stewed about it.
- It can be like the telephone game. It starts with specific information and by the time it gets to the end it very different than what was first communicated.

Whatever it is, clear the communication lines in a respectful manner and make it a smooth safe flowing two way street!


