WEATHER DISCUSSION... A cold front will move across the region today bringing an increase in winds aloft over the fire area in the afternoon and evening hours. Winds will be mainly terrain driven downslope in the morning with moderate inversion conditions. By mid day winds aloft will increase and dissipate the inversion. **During the afternoon ridge winds will become locally strong and gusty with upslope winds picking up in speed.** Temperatures will show little change in trend however relative humidity will trend lower ahead of the afternoon frontal passage.

.TODAY...

Sky/weather.....Sunny. Hazy and areas of smoke in the morning. Inversion breaking after 1100. Becoming windy over ridges and slopes in the afternoon.

Max temperature.....73-77 ridge tops and 87-93 lower drainages.

Min humidity.....23-28 percent ridges and 14-20 percent lower drainages.

Wind (20 ft).....

Slope/valley.....Downcanyon 2-5 mph through 0900 then upslope/upcanyon 3-6 mph after 1100. Wind increasing to south to southwest 6-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph after 1400.

Ridgetop.....Southwest to west 5-10 mph in the morning then **increasing to 10-18 with gusts to 25 mph in the afternoon.**

Mixing height.....Rising to 6500 ft AGL in the afternoon.

Transport winds.....West to northwest around 20 mph.

Discussion: A cold front will move across the region today, bringing an increase in winds aloft over the fire area in the afternoon and evening hours.

Weather: Sunny. Hazy and areas of smoke in the morning. Inversion breaking after 1100.

Max Temps: 73 - 93° Min RH: 14 - 28%

20' Wind: Down canyon 2-5 mph through 0900, then upslope/upcanyon 3-6 mph after 1100.

Ridgetop: Southwest to West 5 - 10 mph in the morning then increasing to **10-18 with gusts to 25** in the afternoon.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Forecasted Indices: Sugarloaf BI (Fuel Model G) 65 Down 1; Sugarloaf ERC (Fuel Model G) 86 up 1;

GENERAL:

- **Fuels:**
 - NW California is currently under a **Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory** for a heavier than normal grass crop and low fuel moistures through the end of August. Timber/brush litter accumulation is significant
 - **All live fuel moistures are reaching critically dry levels**
- **Topography:**
 - All aspects are represented in the fire. The fire is burning on steep terrain with slopes that vary between 35 and 75%. Elevation range is 1100 - 5590'.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

- Uphill runs in **brush** exceeding **170 ch/hr with 9-24' flame lengths** may occur. Runs in timber may exceed 25 ch/hr with 10- 13' flame lengths. This may trigger group and single tree **torching with flames in excess of 100'** and produce **short-range spotting < 0.6 mile** (further if plume dominated fire behavior develops).
- Probability of ignition 73 - 79%.
- With clean air the fire has made significant runs when in alignment with slope.

Branch I

DIV A/B: No control problems expected continue to patrol and watch for rollout into the receptive fuels.

DIV F: Fire will continue to consume interior islands as they heat up. Watch for rollout.

DIV T: Watch for spotting outside of control lines from burnout between Green Mtn and DP-40.

DIV U: Expect the fire to continue to flank and back into the North Salt Creek drainage north of the ridge between Green Mtn and High Mtn. Fire will roll out and make runs to the east and north when the westerly winds become established. Unburned fuel between you and the fire, Post Lookouts.

Branch III

Div W: If fire gets established in the bottom of Tom Dow Ck, there is probability of it making a run up Yellowjacket Mtn. and likely becoming a threat to the main control line from Yellowjacket Mtn to H-70, H-75.

DIV Y: The fire continues to move North / Northeast toward and along the McCloud river. Threat of the fire to cross the McCloud River, watch for spotting.

DIV Z: The fire continues moving to the north with backing, flanking and rollout. Watch for rollout and spotting across the rd.

DIV OO/RR: If fire crosses the McCloud River, upslope runs can be expected. Unburned fuel between you and the fire, Post lookouts.

XX: No expected fire impacts.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke inversion over the fire until mid-afternoon will limit air operations.

Fatigue/Stress

Firefighter Health & First Aid

Accumulated (Chronic) Fatigue is defined as fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery. Accumulated fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods, which results in decreased productivity, compromised immune function, and reduced alertness. Fatigued workers perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors and become inattentive. Chronic fatigue often results in increased stress, which may present itself through certain behavioral and physiological indicators, such as those described below:

- Behavioral indicators
 - Decreased motivation and low morale
 - Increased irritability and depression
- Physiological indicators
 - Confused, poor problem solving
 - Poor abstract thinking
 - poor attention/decisions
 - poor concentration/memory
 - extreme emotional responses
 - social/behavioral changes
- Recommendations for chronic fatigue/stress are:
 - Take longer periods of rest/recovery
 - Ensure that workers are adequately rested before they begin work shifts
 - Provide periodic rest breaks to allow physical and mental recovery
 - Alternate between heavy and light tasks
 - Eat well-balanced meals regularly, with energy supplements during periods of high exertion
 - Maintain hydration
 - Ensure workers maintain good personal hygiene
 - Maintain high standards of physical fitness and work capacity
 - In extreme cases, personnel may need to be relieved of their duties

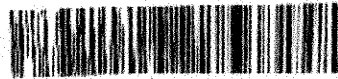
