Upon occurrence of a "Major Medical" or accident involving significant injury on the fire-line, the closest DIVS should respond directly to the scene to take control of the situation and direct necessary actions. If the DIVS is unavailable, the nearest fire line supervisor or leader needs to take charge.											
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Clear all radio traffic on the Incident Command Channel-use to coordinate response. Do Not use names. Identify:1) The on-scene Point of Contact (i.e. TFLD Smith); 2) Describe the nature of the accident.</li> <li>2. Obtain and facilitate nearest EMT to the scene, request Medical Unit response. Identify to Communications medical personnel on Site.</li> <li>3. Check nature of the problem, # of patients, status, vitals &amp; location, (GPS if possible). Request additional resources if needed.</li> <li>4. Coordinate and facilitate appropriate transportation for injured with Medical Unit EMT in charge of patient(s).</li> <li>5. Remove all unnecessary personnel from the scene.</li> <li>6. Secure scene, Identify witnesses for later investigation. Keep a log.</li> <li>7. Inform Communications of <b>any</b> changes on scene for point of contact.</li> </ol>

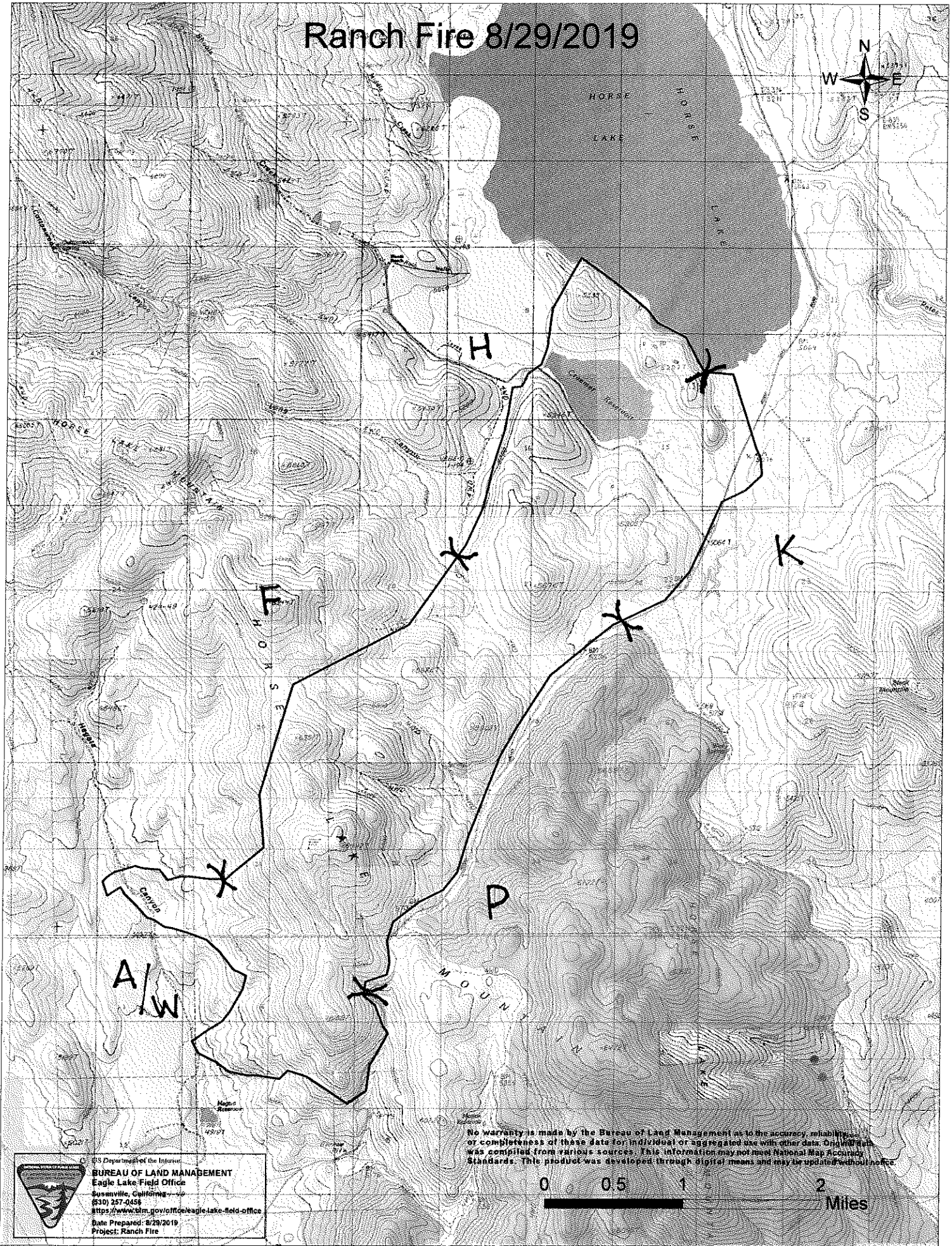
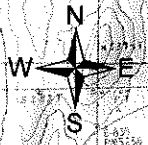
