Steps To Protect Yourself From Illnesses

- Wash your hands often.

- Practice good health habits. Get plenty of sleep drink plenty of fluids, and eat healthy food.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness, separate that person from the rest of your crew and others, seek treatment at the medical unit.

Driving & Fatigue

- Make sure you are getting your rest when you can! Stick to work/rest guidelines.
- Fatigue can cause us to mentally stray from the driving task.
- It only takes a second of distraction to lose control of our vehicle. The faster you are traveling, the faster you get in trouble.
- Make sure you recognize when you are too tired to drive!
- Don't tough it out and put yourself and your passengers at risk!
- Slow down, take breaks, and talk to your passengers. If possible, keep an alert passenger in the front seat next to you. Know your limits.
