WEATHER DISCUSSION: The low pressure system that brought the showers to the fire Tuesday has now moved east of the region. Today will be a transition day and skies should be mainly clear as high pressure begins to build over the west coast. Cold overnight temperatures and surface moisture will likely bring areas of morning fog or low clouds, however. Significant warming and drying can be expected later today and winds will be from the less common northerly direction over the ridges. Warm dry conditions continue on Thursday as high pressure builds over the state with a return to the more normal southwest ridge winds in the afternoon. Conditions level off by the end of the week preceding the possible approach of a stronger weather system expected to move through the region early next week. Strong southwest winds are indicated

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### INPUTS:

- Fuels: Showers yesterday have increased fuel and soil moisture. Fuel availability will be reduced until drying
- Topography: Locations on the north end of the fire, especially in the Wheeler Fire 2007, received more precipitation than southern areas, no recent fire history. Sheltered timber areas on the East and South sides will see movement today with lower humidity values.

FIRE BEHAVIOR: Expect an increase in fire behavior today. Humidity levels will reach levels capable of supporting torching and spotting. Timbered locations will see the greatest fire behavior as moisture impacts were reduced by canopy cover.

Probability of Ignition: 70%

DIV A/C/E: Burn operations in the Wheeler scar will be hampered by increased fuel moisture. Areas on Wheeler Mtn. with heaver timber could see movement by end of shift. Burn through on snags is approaching the 72 to 96 hour time frame. and snag fall will represent hazard.

**DIV F/G:** Less precipitation and heavier canopies around Mt. Ingalls will contribute to favorable surface fire conditions. Light north wind component will move embers across lines but fire behavior should be within suppression capability.

DIV I/K: Reduced moisture on the southeast side of the fire, Clover, Railroad and Beaver Dips coupled with continuous stringers of moderate timber fuels will create moderate burning conditions. Fire will move through surface fuel with possible torching later in the day. Clover Creek does present a possible wind/drainage alignment scenario.

DIV M/Q: Conditions on Round Mtn., 'The Horn' will be favorable for direct suppression and mop-up. Snag fall remains a hazard. Burning opportunities in the Wheeler scar may not present themselves today.

DIV V/X: Fire movement will be minimal today except in pockets of heavy down material. Burning opportunities in the Wheeler scar may not present themselves today. Any direct suppression efforts should account for snag fall in a risk assessment.

#### AIR OPERATIONS

Light winds from the north should allow for air operation after fog burns off in the morning.

# STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES—FINANCE SECTION

#### WORK REST CYCLE

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don't exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hours shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person's responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

#### **OPERATIONAL SHIFTS**

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fire-line will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

#### **DUTY STATUS**

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, <u>and/or</u> be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed **at least 8 hours** of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

### PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

<u>Personnel time</u> will be reported to the Time Unit and daily once they are signed by the next level supervisor. OES resources will be monitored by OES Agency Rep (if assigned) for 2/1 Work Rest compliance. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (ie. HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

<u>Private Contracted Equipment time</u> must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily and hours on shift noted even if it is a daily rate. When swapping out operators you need to notify Finance as well as changing from single to double shift and vice versa.

Supervisor's - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

## MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). Until the fire is controlled, personnel on the fire-line MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fire-line personnel after control of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation.


