## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY

\*\*See Fire Weather Forecast for Discussion\*\*

**Weather:** Mostly sunny with areas of smoke in the valleys.

**Day Temps:** 75-81 degrees

**Day RH:** 60-70%.

**20 FOOT WINDS:** **Ridges:** Southeast 3-8 mph in morning becoming Southwest in the afternoon with late afternoon gust to 15-20 mph

**Slope/valley:** Downslope 1-5mph in the morning becoming upslope mainly southwest to northwest 4-8 mph gust to 12mph in the afternoon.

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

### INPUTS:

- **Fuels:** Will continue the dry with light winds and increased solar radiation.
- **Topography:** Inversion in valley locations may hamper firing operations before noon.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR:** Expect an increase in surface spread. Drier conditions will affect 10 hour fuels increasing their ability to carry fire. Exposed locations on the east flank will see the greatest intensities with isolated torching and small slope runs possible with burn operations. When the inversion lifts, fire behavior may increase in receptive fuel beds.

### Day:

**DIV A/C/E:** Be aware of the forecasted SE-S winds in the late morning hours. Potential for small slope runs and moderate fire behavior in receptive fuel beds. Snag fall remains a hazard in previously burned area. Interior pockets in timber fuels could support surface runs late into the morning when aligned with forecast winds. Expect fire behavior in the Antelope Dip area to increase once the inversions lifts. Direct suppression tactics should be successful.

**DIV FIG:** Small scale firing operations should be effective in the late morning and afternoon as the light forecasted winds will be in your favor.

**DIV I/K:** Light winds and fuel moistures should support small scale firing operations. Moderate fire activity will continue to increase throughout the shift in the Clover Dip, Railroad Dip and Beaver Dip area.

**DIV M/Q/V/X:** Fuel type change to Pinyon-juniper could create control issues as conditions trend toward drier and windier. Winds will become less favorable in the afternoon as they transition to SW with gust to 15-20 mph.

## AIR OPERATIONS

The inversion is predicted to lift by noon, plan accordingly.

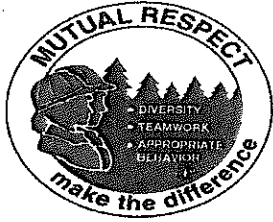
