WEATHER DISCUSSION: Today will see a break in the wet pattern with fair skies and some drying expected although morning fog is likely in the canyons. Even with the drying, minimum humidity values will be quite moderate for this time of year due to the rain on Monday. Winds should be relatively light today under this brief period of high pressure. Yet another weather system dropping through the Pacific Northwest and northern California will bring another good chance of wetting rain Wednesday afternoon and Wednesday night. Thursday will see things start to dry out again beginning a longer period of warming and drving.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Valley fog in the morning clearing to fair skies by late morning.

TEMPERATURES: Maximum temperatures 58-66.

HUMIDITY: Min RH 28-38%.

20 FT WINDS:

Outlook for Tuesday night: Fair skies with some scattered high clouds by morning. Some valley fog possible. Minimum temperatures 38-46. Max RH recovery 65-75%. Ridge winds becoming southwest 4-8 gusts to 15 mph after about 2000. Slope winds becoming downslope to downcanyon to 4 mph after about 2000. Some west gusts to 10 mph upper west slopes.

Extended forecast for Wednesday: Increasing clouds with a chance of rain by afternoon. Wetting rain likely. Showers continuing into the evening. Maximum temperatures 53-58. Min RH 50-60% before the rain starts. Afternoon ridge winds southwest to west 8-15 gusts to 20 mph. Slope winds upslope to upcanyon mainly southwest to west 3-8 gusts to 12 mph in the afternoon. Higher gusts upper west slopes.

Situational Awareness:

Start the day with a briefing and re-brief during the day as the job changes. Use all the assessment guides to develop and maintain Situational Awareness. Constantly re-evaluate your situation throughout the day. Use the time tested process of "Looking Up, Down, and All Around", and the other assessment materials from the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

WATCH-OUTS

- Fatigue You are now many days into this fire or others and have completed some tough and tiring work assignments. WATCH OUT for slowed reaction times, inattention to details, and gaps in your attention span. Take positive action to get adequate rest, be deliberate in decision making and heighten your awareness to factors affecting your work.
- Communications With the changes in the work areas, ensure that communications exist. Will a human repeater be necessary?
- Vehicle Driving Roads are steep and narrow with many blind corners. Drive slowly, defensively, with your lights on, and stay on your side of the road! WATCH OUT for commercial, private vehicles, and other vehicles that commonly drive faster than we do.
- Wildlife and Cattle: Both deer and cattle are very common on the incident, especially during the dawn and dusk hours. When you see one deer, expect others to follow.
- Medical Plan Know where assigned medical personnel are located. Know in advance the request process in the Medical Plan. Ensure positive communications with the ICP.
- Danger/Hazard Trees: Continue to evaluate the areas around and under all trees. Use the IRPG guidelines on page 22. Minimize the exposure, and exposure time.

Fight Complacency

- One common reason for firefighter injury in the latter stages of a fire is when the firefighter throws her/his mind into neutral and doesn't think about the work they are doing. They are not thinking about how to do the job right, but just how to get the job done so they can just get home. Couple this with fatigue, and you really have a "WATCHOUT."
- There's a difference in between just getting the job done, versus getting the job done when MENTALLY ENGAGED.

So with that, keep your mind engaged and attentive to the task. Continually ask yourself if you are doing the job safely, the way you were trained. Keep an eye on your co-workers too. If you see them doing something that is unsafe, YOU NEED TO SAY SOMETHING immediately about the unsafe act.

Summary of Suppression Damage Repair Guidelines

Objectives - The objective of the fire suppression is to repair areas disturbed by fire suppression activities into a condition that does not negatively affect natural and cultural resources and will not create to excessive erosion on the landscape. Without compromising public and firefighter safety.

- Reduce the potential for soil erosion and sedimentation
- Reduce the visual impacts of fire line as well other suppression activities when feasible
- Repair roads and drainage structures to a functioning condition
- Protect natural and cultural resources from additional potential damage

Sensitive Sites are marked with yellow and black or red and black striped flagging.




On Firelines, waterbars should be installed as described below, fire line covered with slash, and entrances blocked.

Dozer Line

Fire line Gradient (% slope)	Distance Between Waterbars (A) (feet)
0 to 10	No waterbars needed
10 to 20	100
21 to 40	75
41 to 60 (B)	50 (B)

- (A) These are guidelines and are not intended to restrict the implementation of more or less water bars if the need or lack of need is justified.
- (B) Firefighter safety should be taken into account; if slopes are too steep for safe implementation then waterbars should not be constructed, if sensitive resources are not present.
- DEPTH AND WIDTH: Waterbars need to be cut into surface, do not simply push up soil.
 - Waterbar depths for dozer lines should be at least 6 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to the top of the
 waterbar should average at least 18 inches and not exceed 24 inches.
 - Waterbar depths for hand lines should be at least 4 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to top of waterbar should average at least 8 inches and not exceed 12 inches.








Helispots, Safety Zone, Spike Camp, and Staging Areas: These fire suppression activity areas should be repaired to standards similar to fire line repair. Waterbars place where appropriate. Use cleared vegetative material, and slash for soil cover

Watercourses: Remove deposited soil from streams, watercourses, swales, or draws back to the original contour. Remove only as much as feasible without further damage to the watercourse. Restore bank channels at fire line crossings back to the shape seen adjacent to the crossing. Pull perched soil from drainage edges and spread it evenly across the fire line.

- Do not remove large woody debris which was in the channel prior to the fire, bucked limbs and logs in watercourses from fire suppression activities should be removed from the watercourse.
- Where fire lines are constructed within 100 feet of intermittent and perennial streams, use certified weed free straw, wood strands, or slash to increase soil cover and prevent sediment from entering the stream channel.
