...Fire Weather Watch Sunday Afternoon through Monday morning for strong wind and Low RH...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A bit more warming and drying is expected today as high pressure remains over the area. Only moderate humidity recover is expected this morning with RH values dropping into the low to mid teens likely this afternoon. Southwest winds will pick up a bit today helping to clear the smoke a little better this afternoon but strong winds are not expected. Slightly drier and windier conditions are expected Saturday as a unusually strong for the season Pacific frontal system approaches the coast. This system will bring very strong winds and low humidity most of the day on Sunday. The dry windy conditions will make Sunday a critical fire weather day. Significant precipitation is expected on Monday as the cold front moves through the northern half of the state.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Fair skies with smoke hanging over the fire through about noon.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 78 to 84

HUMIDITY: Minimum RH of 13 to 19%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Variable mainly light west to 3 mph through about noon becoming southwest 7-13 mph. Afternoon gusts 15-20 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope to downcanyon to about 4 mph through about noon then becoming upslope to upcanyon mainly southwest to northwest 3-8 gust to 14 mph in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversions breaking after about noon with slightly less stable afternoon conditions.

<u>Ourlook for Friday Night:</u> Fair Skies with smoke developing over the fire. Lows 38-48 except cooler some valleys. Max RH recovery 50-60%. Ridge winds decreasing after 2000 becoming variable mainly south to southwest to 5 mph. Slope winds becoming downslope to downcanyon to 5 mph after about 2000.

<u>Extended forecast for Saturday:</u> Fair Skies. Highs 78 to 85. Min RH 12-18%. Ridge winds becoming southwest 8-15 mph with afternoon gusts 20-25 mph. Slope winds becoming upslope to upcanyon mainly southwest to northwest 4-8 gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

Extended forecast for Sunday; Fair to partly cloudy. Highs 70 to 78. Min RH 14-20%. Ridge winds 8-12 gusts to 20 mph in the morning increasing through the morning and afternoon. Afternoon ridge winds 15-20 mph with gusts up to 40 mph. Afternoon slope winds mostly southwest to northwest 6-12 gusts to 30 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

INPUTS:

- Fuels: Live and dead fuel moistures continue to decline. 10Hr fuels are in the single digits, current RAWS observations are 5-7% (7% is critical).
- **Topography:** Be aware of the alignment of wind and topography.

FIRE BEHAVIOR: Expect an increase in surface spread. Drier conditions will affect 10 hour fuels increasing their ability to carry fire. Exposed locations on the east flank will see the greatest intensities with isolated torching and small slope runs possible with firing operations. When the inversion lifts, fire behavior may increase in receptive fuel beds.

DIV A/C/E: Be aware of the forecasted SW winds in the late morning hours. Potential for small slope runs and moderate fire behavior in receptive fuel beds. Expect fire behavior in the Antelope Dip area to increase once the inversions lifts. Direct suppression tactics should be successful.

DIV F/G: Small scale firing operations should be effective in the morning and early afternoon, forecasted winds should be in your favor.

DIV I/K: Light winds in the morning and fuel moistures should support small scale firing operations. Conditions will change in the afternoon as wind gust develop. Moderate fire activity will continue to increase throughout the shift in the Clover Dip. Railroad Dip and Beaver Dip area.

DIV M/Q/V/X: Fuel type change to Pinyon-juniper could create control issues as conditions trend toward drier and windier. Winds will become less favorable in the afternoon as they transition to SW with gust to 15-20 mph.

Foot Travel in Steep Terrain

- When walking through steep and rocky terrain, watch footing and maintain proper spacing.
- Identify safe routes and local conditions.
- Test and use secure footing.
- Watch for over-head hazards, carry tools on downhill side, and wear gloves.
- Treat "hot spots" on feet before they become blisters.

Fatigue/Smoke Effects

- Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.
- Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio.
- Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue.
- Allow for extended rest periods if needed.
- Avoid working in heavy inversions for prolonged periods if possible. Take occasional breaks in clear air to mitigate build up of CO, and CO2.
- "Over hydrate" to assist in flushing smoke particulates from your system.

Other Concerns:

- Hazard Trees- Dead trees, snags, leaning trees, burned trees (especially with a burned root system), burned "cat faces", trees with dead "spike tops", and large green trees.
- Driving- Unexpected local traffic, deer and bears, cattle, speed on rough roads, narrow roads, steep drop offs, soft shoulders, dust, blind corners.
- Hydration- Hydrate frequently. Avoid energy drinks. Dilute sports drinks. Preplan for drinking water needs.
- Backing- Use a backer, and/or perform a "walk around".
- Camp Crud- Drink lots of water and fruit drinks, eat a balanced diet, get adequate sleep, use hand sanitizers, and avoid common surfaces.
- Fire Behavior- Follow the 10, mitigate the 18, ensure LCES is in place, constant situational awareness. Maintain accountability at all times.

CALIFORNIA INTERAGENCY INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM 4 EXPECTATIONS

CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR

This team is committed to "ZERO TOLERANCE" of careless, illegal, inappropriate and unsafe actions.

Alcohol and/or illegal drugs are NOT allowed within the incident environment or while actively assigned to the incident. Local Law Enforcement Officials will be called to deal with any suspected illegal activities. Each employee has the responsibility to be ready, willing, and able to perform the duties for which they are qualified.

Sexual Harassment

Inappropriate actions or comments will not be tolerated. Everyone is expected to act in a professional manner. It is your responsibility to stop inappropriate actions or comments immediately upon becoming aware of such. Sexual Harassment must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist or Incident Commander. When outside of your designated sleeping area, you are required to wear at least a shirt, appropriate shorts, and shoes or sandals. If you need clarification of these expectations contact the Human Resource Specialist or IC. What we PERMIT we PROMOTE!!!!

SAFETY

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

EMPHASIS AREAS

Training

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations** – **See back page.**

Evaluations

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

Injuries/Claims

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

Work Rest Cycles

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

Position Qualifications

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

Engagement/Disengagement

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

Debriefing

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be <u>reviewed and signed</u> by the next level supervisor. A finance "Rules of Engagement" document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

Social Media

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.


Incident Behavior

It is extremely important that inappropriate behavior be recognized and dealt with promptly. If inappropriate behavior is allowed to continue, not only would it adversely impact the affected individual, as a witness, you could be held accountable for your inaction.


Inappropriate behavior is considered any form of conduct that negatively impacts the work environment for the affected individual or those who witness the conduct or that violates any Forest Service rule or regulation. Any form of harassment and/or bullying or use of any language that could violate a Civil Rights policy, will not be tolerated and must be reported to your supervisor and the Human Resources Specialist (HRSP).


When you observe or hear of any inappropriate behavior, you should:

- Immediately direct the alleged offender to stop their behavior and counsel them.
- Provide support to anyone who was negatively impacted by the inappropriate behavior.
- If the behavior is minor in nature, such as being rude or discourteous, advise them if the behavior continues, you will need to report the misconduct to your supervisor or Human Resources.
- If the behavior could be interpreted as bullying and/or harassment, immediately contact your supervisor and the HRSP.
 - Document the inappropriate behavior with facts.
