# SAFETY MESSAGE

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INCIDENT: ENF Wind Complex

DATE: December 4, 2011

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**Major Hazards and Risks:**

- ✓ Possible Active burning—could continue given the predicted winds and heavy fuel loading.
  - ✓ Changing weather conditions— beware of dropping temps/wind chill and layer accordingly
  - ✓ Driving – Wind, Icy roads just add to our hazards. Rocks, slippery roads, blow down trees/limbs make for increased hazards. Don't let down your guard. Drive defensively and expect the unexpected; lights on, chock vehicles when parked. Manage parking/staging areas. Forest Visitors, Christmas Tree Cutters may be out as you pass thru communities—watch for them.
  - ✓ Snags – Hazardous trees and limbs are all around you. Roots/cat - faced and decayed areas have been burning for several days and trees will continue to fall. Avoid or fall hazardous trees where needed
  - ✓ Take care of your personal health and medical needs at the medical unit before or after your shift. Wash your hands often to prevent the spread of viruses. Eat well and hydrate.
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## REMEMBER

- Ensure you review/follow the Medical Ics 206s Plans and Protocols for the Divisions you are Assigned  
Your tailgate safety sessions are the best place for clarifying your hazards/risks/and needed mitigations. Refer to the LCES Check lists IRPG and Update your mitigation as conditions change hourly.

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**Major Hazards and Risks:**

- ✓ Possible Active burning—could continue given the predicted winds and heavy fuel loading.
  - ✓ Changing weather conditions— beware of dropping temps/wind chill and layer accordingly
  - ✓ Driving – Wind, Icy roads just add to our hazards. Rocks, slippery roads, blow down trees/limbs make for increased hazards. Don't let down your guard. Drive defensively and expect the unexpected; lights on, chock vehicles when parked. Manage parking/staging areas. Forest Visitors, Christmas Tree Cutters may be out as you pass thru communities—watch for them.
  - ✓ Snags – Hazardous trees and limbs are all around you. Roots/cat - faced and decayed areas have been burning for several days and trees will continue to fall. Avoid or fall hazardous trees where needed
  - ✓ Take care of your personal health and medical needs at the medical unit before or after your shift. Wash your hands often to prevent the spread of viruses. Eat well and hydrate.
