Major Hazards and Risks:

Snags, steep terrain, driving on narrow, ICY, mountain roads, complacency, Medical Plan Review.

<u>Fire Order of the Day – *I*nitiate all actions based on current weather and expected fire behavior</u> Narrative:

Don't let your guard down!! This fire is not out!! LCES is needed now more than ever.

During this phase of the fire snags (dead and green) pose the greatest threat to our firefighters. ID and fall all hazard snags. Take your break insnag free safety zones and keep your wits about you at all times when working in timber areas.

Review Medical Plan, Know your location think what your role would be if there was an Incident.

Complacency can be a real problem as we continue mopping up and gridding the fire. Watch out for this.

The steep terrain and loose rocks can cause an injury including sprained ankles. Use extra care when walking on side slopes and in areas with loose rocks. We have had numerous reports of wild animals standing on the roads so keep an eye out for these well-camouflaged critters.

Drink your water, take frequent breaks, find a warm place and pace yourself throughout the day.

Look Up, Look Down, Look Around

*Look Up: Check the sky for any weather changes such wind shifts or increasing in speed. Look for snags.

*Look Down: Watch your footing. Keep an eye out for Frozen tripping Hazards on the ground.

* Look Around Check fuel loading in the area, general terrain, and current fire behavior and ladder fuels. Keep an eye on fellow firefighters for signs of hypothermia and smoke inhalation.
