


WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper level low pressure will continue to meander along the Pacific Northwest coast through Wednesday, maintaining a southwest flow into the mid and upper slope elevations of the fire perimeter. Expect continued dry weather with a few cumulus clouds between 5000ft and 10,000ft Monday and Tuesday. Afternoon high temperatures will be 2 to 4 degrees cooler Monday and humidity's 2 to 5 percent higher. Looking ahead...a warming trend is expected to begin Friday and into the weekend with the possibility of northeast to easterly winds returning.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

The fire will remain fuels & topography driven. At present primary fire spread is from heavier fuels burning log to log and rolling material, watch below you. Falling snags will challenge containment lines and will increase the potential for fire spread over barriers that would normally hold the fire. Rates of spread will be from 1 to 12 chains per hour with flame lengths 1-4 feet in the timber. With the present alignment of our fire expect mainly backing and flanking fire. Short uphill runs are probable where heavy fuels and slope align. Spotting if any will be short range less than 400feet.

SPECIFIC:

West Side DIV F&H, Tish Tang Ridge:

- Expect the fire to continue to slowly back off of the ridge, log to log. Rollouts will result in short uphill runs.

South – Eastside DIV R&W:

- Main source of fire spread will be from rollout at the head of Quinby Crk. Retardant and bucket drops have been effective checking fire spread.

North West DIV L:

- Heavier fuels continue to hold heat. Forward progression will be mainly from rollout. Fire is still in a backing alignment.

Horse Linto Crk. DIV A&X:

- There is a low potential for the fire to cross the creek and make a slope reversal and burn up slope to the south. ROS will be low to moderate if this was to occur.

Northeast DIV M&P:

- No forward fire progression expected.

Air Operations: Expect smoke inversion to lift by 1100hrs.

Safety:

Steep country means rolling material, watch for spot fires below you!

INCIDENT HAZARDS:

DRIVING continues to be one of the biggest hazards on this incident. Expect the unexpected. Wildlife is common. Defensive driving is essential. Enter blind curves expecting to meet opposing traffic. Keep windows clean, use headlights, seat belts, chock blocks, and common sense. When backing, use a spotter whenever available. When not, get out and walk behind vehicle.

BRAKE CHECK: There is now a brake check on Big Hill Rd. All buses and vehicles over 15,000 LB GVW without Jake brakes or retarders must stop and remain parked for at least 20 minutes allowing brakes to cool before proceeding down the rest of the grade. It is further recommended that engines dump their water at the top of the hill before descending.

SNAGS: There are numerous snags throughout the entire incident area. Maintain a strong situational awareness for snag issues in your work area at all times. Look up, look down, and look around and be especially alert when the wind picks up. When falling operations are in progress, keep nonessential personnel at least 2 ½ tree lengths away from the activity.

BEARS: There have been an increasing number of incidents with bears getting into vehicles, tents, etc. As this continues these animals lose their fear of humans and become increasingly dangerous. Make sure to remove all trash from fire line. Do not store food, food wrappers, empty lunch bags, tooth paste, etc. in parked vehicles, unattended personal gear bags, or tents. Strictly adhere to bear mitigation measures prescribed for spike camps. Remember, "A fed bear is a dead bear."

DIV	HAZARDOUS ACTIONS / CONDITIONS	MITIGATIONS / WARNINGS / REMEDIES
ALL DIV's	SNAG HAZARDS	Follow Hazard Tree Safety Guidelines (IRPG p. 20). Limit number of personnel around snags and their exposure time; fallers must be qualified for trees being fallen. Be especially alert around snags during wind events. Check for hazard trees & "widow-makers" in sleeping areas prior to using. Maintain Situational Awareness.
ALL DIV's	DRIVING HAZARDS	Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights on; use chock blocks, keep windshields clean; look before backing; and use backers whenever available. DO NOT drive when fatigued. Change drivers if possible. Don't hesitate to pull over and rest if necessary. Adhere to agency driving regulations and guidelines. Be alert for wildlife, heavy trucks, & high speed opposing traffic crossing into your lane. Maintain Situational Awareness! BRAKE CHECK: There is now a brake check on Big Hill Rd. All buses and vehicles over 15,000 LB GVW without Jake brakes or retarders must stop and remain parked for at least 20 minutes allowing brakes to cool down before proceeding down the rest of the grade. It is further recommended that engines dump their water at the top of the hill before descending.
ALL DIV's	FATIGUE	Be alert for signs of fatigue in yourself and others and take breaks as necessary. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue. Check reporting resources for length of time worked prior to this assignment. Assess cumulative fatigue level.
ALL DIV'S	HYDRATION	Drinking water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift. Include sports drinks to maintain electrolyte levels. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others. Avoid drinking energy drinks.
DIV'S F, H, L, W, Z & SS	WORKING AROUND HEAVY EQUIPMENT	Stay at least 100' in front or 50' behind equipment. Never approach without making eye contact with operator. Avoid working below equipment. Establish visual and radio communications with operator before engaging. Communicate all hazards to operator.
ALL DIV's	DRUG CULTIVATION AND LAB SITES	Be alert for any signs of illegal cultivation or drug labs. If found, leave area and request law enforcement, advise DIVS and warn all personnel to stay clear of area.
ALL DIV's	BEAR PRECAUTIONS	BEARS: Pick up and remove all trash from fire line. Do not store food, food wrappers, empty lunch bags, tooth paste, etc. in parked vehicles, unattended personal gear bags, or tents. Strictly adhere to bear mitigation measures prescribed for spike camps.
ALL DIV's	POISONOUS INSECTS, SNAKES	Identify, avoid, and get treatment for any bites or stings. Use caution (for bees, wasps, etc.) when drinking from opened cans.
ALL DIV's	FOOT TRAVEL	In steep and rocky terrain, watch footing and maintain proper spacing. Watch for overhead hazards. Treat "hot spots" on your feet before they become blisters. Maintain downhill tool placement. Refer to H&SC sects 18.1, 18.2, 18.3.
ALL DIV's	AVIATION USE	Confirm each mission is necessary to minimize pilot exposure. Communicate with pilots on air-to-ground frequency. Keep drop zones clear of personnel. Review "Aviation Watch Out Situations," page 52 in IRPG.
DIV M	WORKING AROUND PACK STRINGS	(1) Step off trail to downhill side when stock approaches. (2) Speak quietly to packer as string passes. (3) No fast movement or reaching to pet stock on trail. (4) If possible, place tools and packs below trail. (5) Stock cannot be routed up sections of line with sharp staubs protruding.
ALL DIV's	STEEP TERRAIN AND ROLLING MATERIAL	Watch your footing; take your time; ensure adequate spacing between crewmembers. Post lookouts to warn of rolling debris if necessary.
ALL DIV's	POISON OAK	Review identification of poison oak. Avoid poison oak, wash as frequently as possible. Obtain medication from Med Unit. Change into clean clothing as often as possible.
ALL DIV's	COMPLACENCY	Repeated assignments in the same area can lead to complacency making personnel more vulnerable to accidents. Situational awareness must be maintained for the duration of the incident.
ALL DIV's	SAFETY ZONES	Follow safety zone guidelines (IRPG p. 7). Carefully evaluate burned areas before designation as safety zones due to snags and re-burn potential. When safety zones are distant from work site, set trigger points to allow personnel to reach them in a timely manner.
DIV F & M	CREW CHIPPER USE	Personnel involved to review & sign JHA; follow JHA direction; Utilize recommended PPE; review operator's manual. Never operate chipper alone.

POINTS OF INTEREST CONCERNING BRAKING ON LONG STEEP GRADES

The following information is provided to assist all personnel working on the Corral Complex while driving on the numerous narrow steep roads. These bullet points are intended to be used as talking points during tailboard briefings. These bullet points pertain to the operation of both heavy and light vehicles. The information was gathered during discussions with Safety Officers and the Ground Support Unit Leader.

- Overheated brakes on late model vehicles do not produce a noticeable odor as rapidly as older models. Don't use this as your first indication of a problem.
- Excessive use of brakes will boil the brake fluid, resulting in the loss of "pedal".
- When your "pedal" starts getting mushy, stop and let the braking system cool **before you lose all braking**.
- If you boil the brake fluid, it should be changed due to contamination from water condensation in the system. Water and brake fluid don't mix.
- Air brakes will often lock up one wheel due to heat expansion, this can also be a precursor losing your "pedal".
- Use "four wheel low" and low gears when starting down a long steep grade, use the brakes to control your engine rpm's.




What Makes Communication Difficult?

Words Mean Different Things to Different People

Look up 500 different words in a dictionary and you will find over 2,500 meanings and/or definitions for those same words. To communicate effectively, both the speaker and the listener must have a mutual understanding of the words they use.

The Presenting Problem May Not Be the Major Concern

People often are hesitant to talk about what is really bothering them. The “real issues” are what they tend to hide most carefully. Trying to solve minor problems while the real problems are not clearly understood does not work. Doing this is a major source of ineffectiveness.

Filters Distort What People Hear and Say and Emotions Are Blinding

Our own expectations, experiences, values, biases, self-images, beliefs, ideas, worldview, etc. create a “zone of distortion”...the filter that distorts our interpretation of another person’s message. People are often unaware of how their emotions affect communications with others and emotions can literally put some people out of control and prevent them from communicating effectively.

Here’s what to do to improve communication:

Stand in the other person’s shoes. You have stood in the other person’s shoes when you repeat their point of view back to their satisfaction.

Drop your point of view long enough to take another way of seeing things.

Remember the point of communication is not to win or be right, but to either bring people together or clarify their differences.

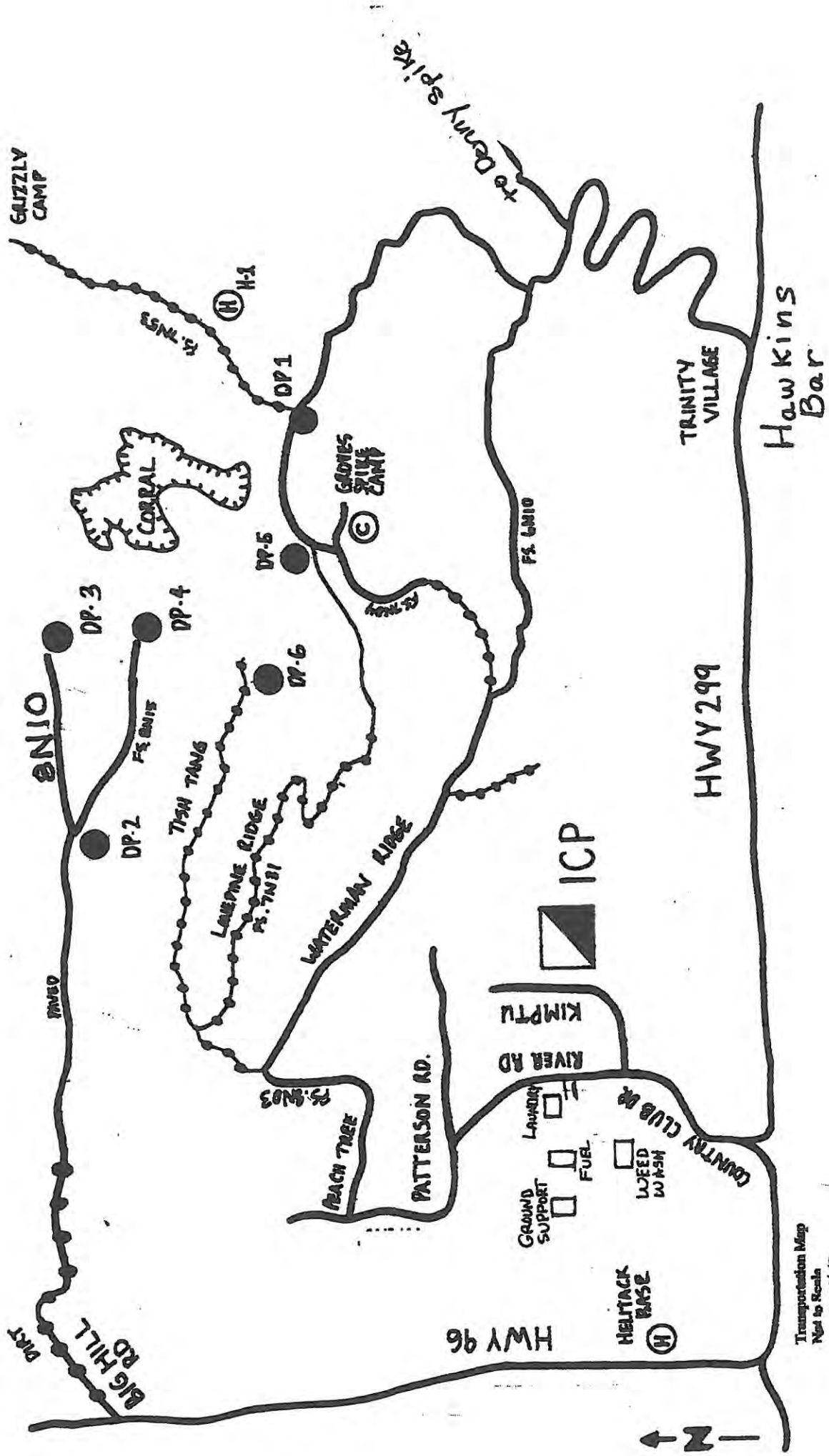

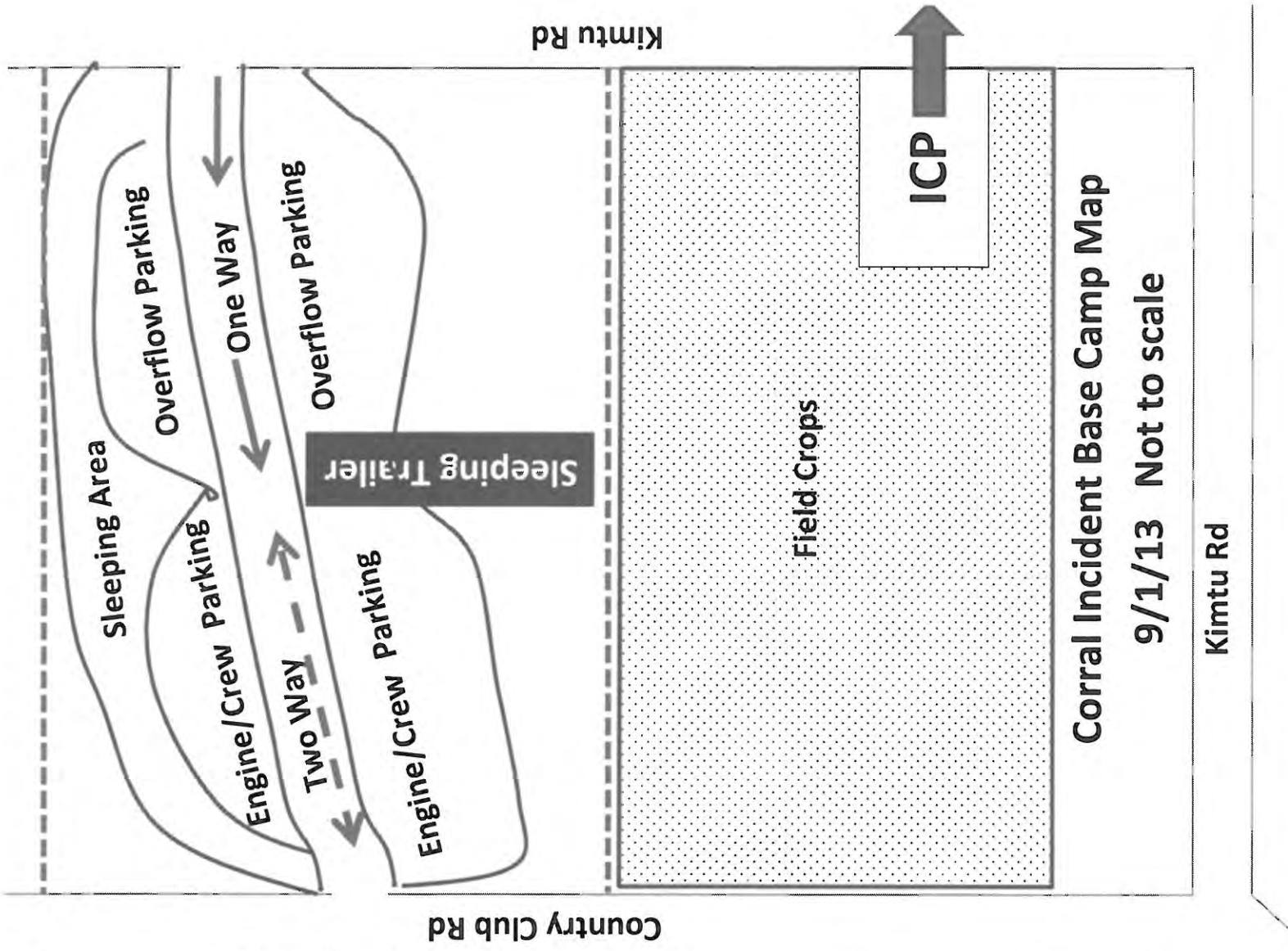
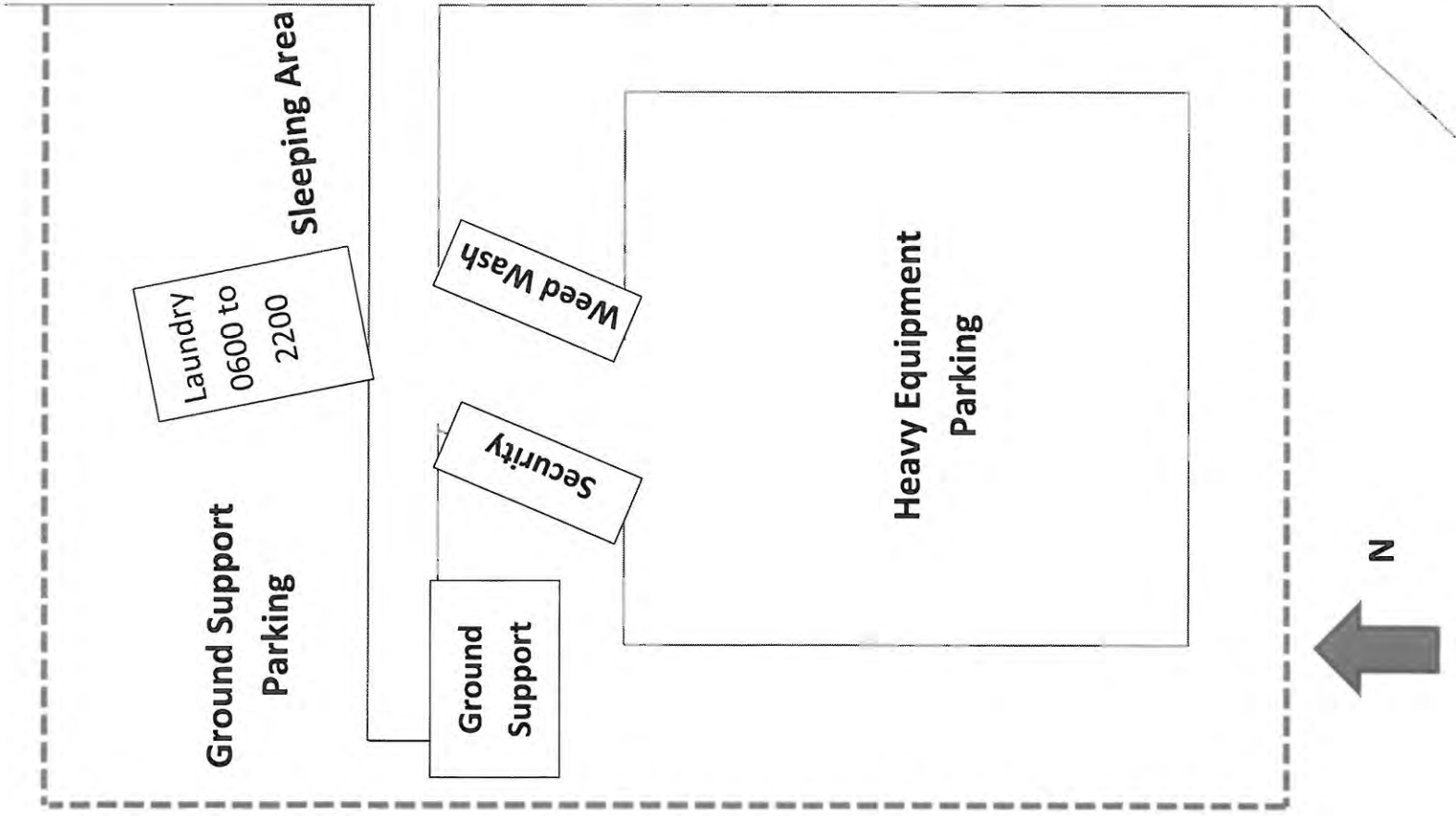
