WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Today will be the last hot and dry day. The low pressure system off the coast is gradually moving east with an associated upper disturbance that may spark isolated dry thunderstorms over or near the fire area late this afternoon and possibly through the night. A period of cooler, cloudier and more moist days are in store Thursday through Saturday...however confidence is still low for wetting rains falling across the fire perimeter.

WEATHER FORECAST TODAY (TUESDAY DAY SHIFT):

WEATHER: Cumulus in the afternoon...A 20% chance of dry thunderstorms afternoon and evening. MAX TEMP: Elev. 1000 ft: 97 – 102 F. Elev 2500 ft: 90-95 F Elev 4000 ft: 80 – 84 F MIN HUMID: Elev. 1000 ft: 7 - 10%. Elev 2500 ft: 8-12% Elev 4000 ft: 16 –22%

Discussion:

High pressure will remain over the region through today with high temperatures and low humidities. A trough of low pressure with instability and isolated dry thunderstorms are possible in the afternoon and evening. Precipitation chances increase Wednesday through Friday.

Weather: Sunny with scattered light cumulus in the afternoon

Max Temp: 1000' elev: 97 - 102° 2500' elev: 90 - 95° 4000' elev: 80 - 84° **Min RH:** 1000' elev: 7 - 10% 2500' elev: 8 - 12% 4000' elev: 16 - 22%

Winds:

Eye level*: 0600 - 1100: East or Downslope 2 - 4 mph, gusts to 10 1100 - 1800: West or Upslope 4 - 6 mph, gusts to 12

*Note: eye level winds could represent either midslope or ridge winds

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: ERC of 64 is approaching the 97th percentile. Potential for very high to extreme fire behavior.

Fire will burn with moderate to high intensity during the burn period. Rollout, flanking, torching and medium duration crown runs can be expected on Divisions A, B, H, K, T, W and Z. Torching and crown fire runs could result in 50 - 100' flame heights with ½ mile spotting distances. Probability of ignition 60 - 70%. Predicted head fire surface rates of spread are 10 - 15 chains/hour with 4 - 8' flame lengths. Predicted backing fire flame lengths are 2 - 4' with rates of spread at 3 - 6 chains/hour.

Division A: Some potential for rollout across Salmon River with subsequent upslope crown fire runs heading east.

Division B: Surface and/or crown fire is predicted to burn and spot over Nordheimer Ridge. Fire will likely back toward Division B south of DP-1.

Division H: Short to medium duration crown fire runs are likely in Lewis Creek drainage. Spotting over Nordheimer ridge into Hemmel creek is likely. <u>Head fire could spread toward Division H in the afternoon.</u>

Divisions K, T, W,: Fire will continue to back into Butler Creek drainage with slope reversal across Butler Creek possible. Moderate duration crown runs toward Divisions W and T are possible.

Division Z: <u>Fire is predicted to back around Butler Flat structures and into Butler Creek.</u> If it crosses, headfire may then spread toward the Z/W break. <u>Fire has high likelihood of rolling out across Salmon River Rd. at Grant Bluffs in Division Z.</u> If fire crosses Salmon River, significant crown fire runs up the opposite slope are likely.

AIR OPERATIONS

Morning inversion will create smoky conditions in canyon bottoms.

SAFETY

- Watch for rolling material igniting unburned vegetation below.
- Expect fire behavior to increase as inversion lifts.
- Rates of spread and fire behavior will increase in steep chutes and narrow canyons, particularly when wind, aspect and terrain features are in alignment.
- Watch for increase in fire behavior as fire reverses slope in drainage bottoms.
