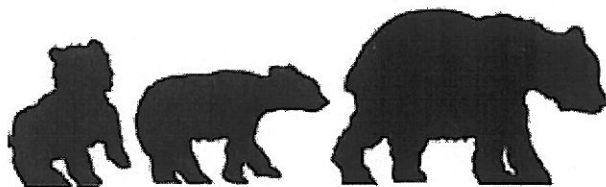



WEATHER SUMMARY:

Mostly sunny, warm and dry

Temps and RHs – Max Temp 74-89° RH 10-15% LAL 1

20ft Wind –

Slope/Valley – Downslope/downcanyon 4-9 mph until 1000, then upslope/upcanyon 6 mph gusts to 13 mph

Ridgetop –East to southeast to 6 mph gusts to 12 mph until 1000-1200, then southwest to west-southwest 6 mph gusts to 15 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

FUELS

Predominantly mature mixed conifer with heavy shrub loading. Fuel loadings are generally heavy. Live fuels moistures remain dry; however the dead fuels still remain moist in sheltered areas.

Thresholds for Active Fire Behavior in the King Fire area (Eldorado NF Pocket Card): 20ft Winds (over 5 mph), RH (under 22%), Temperature (over 84°) and 1000hr FMC (under 9%). *Currently ERC's from Bald Mountain RAWS station is 60%. The 1000 hr fuel moisture is 11% which is above the threshold for active fire behavior.*

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Continued warm and dry as indicated by the rise in ERC's and lower 1000 hr fuel moisture. Fuels are drying out persistently on multiple sunny exposed aspects, and the soil is beginning to dry out as well. However the fuels are still holding moisture under the canopy on all aspects. Heavy fuels continue to burn out throughout the interior.

Unburned islands adjacent to heat sources on exposed southerly aspects could carry fire, at a low rate of spread. Maximum rate of spread could be up to 6 ch/hr with 2' flame lengths on unshaded southerly aspects if inline with slope and wind. Probability of ignition on southerly exposed aspects is 32%, otherwise 1% on cooler aspects.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Lower windspeeds and clear air will be favorable for air operations.

SAFETY

As the fire behavior decreases stay mindful of the task at hand which is mopup and repair work which can be hazardous. Stay safe.

*****POOR RELATIVE HUMIDITY RECOVERY THROUGH EARLY NEXT WEEK*****

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Stagnant weather pattern remains in place as high pressure continues to dominate the region. Therefore, continued hot and dry conditions with poor humidity recoveries can be expected for the King Fire through Monday. Terrain driven winds can be expected with upslope/upcanyon winds from 1000 through 2000, then downslope/downcanyon winds thereafter. Ridgetop winds will favor an easterly direction at night into the early morning, transitioning to southwest and west-southwest from 1000-1200. Locally gusty winds will be possible early Sunday morning over the higher peaks. High pressure breaks down after Monday allowing for slightly cooler temperatures and slightly better humidity recoveries the rest of the week.

WEATHER TODAY: Sunny, warm, and dry.

RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 10-15% **24 HR Trend:** Little Change

Noxious weeds are marked by orange "noxious weed" flagging. Minimize or avoid activities in the area. Sensitive areas are marked with pink/black checkerboard flagging. Minimize ground disturbing activities in the area. Field weed wash heavy equipment used off roads in Branch III before leaving to assignment on another section of fire. READ verifies location for wash.





The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response.

The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

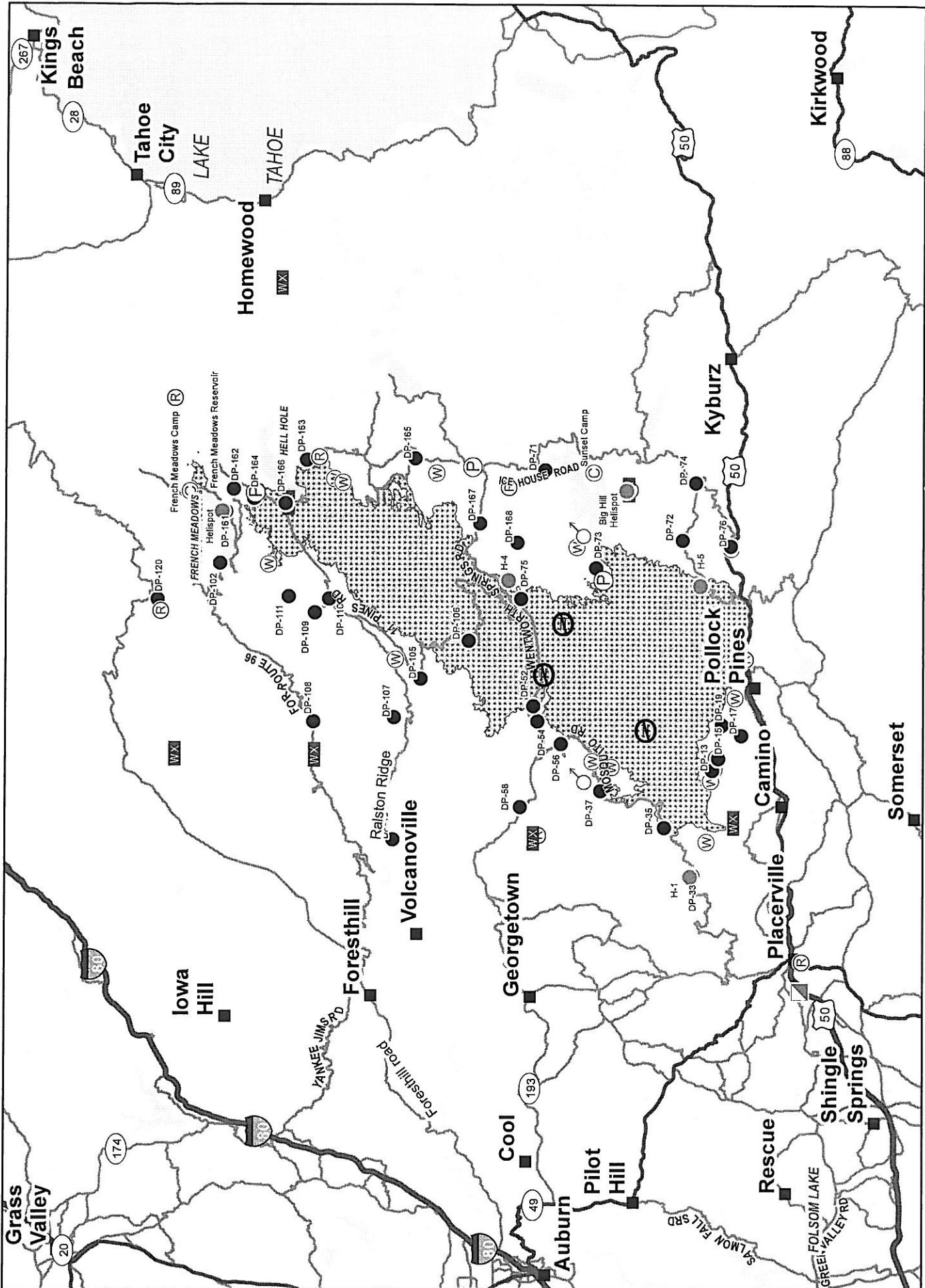
