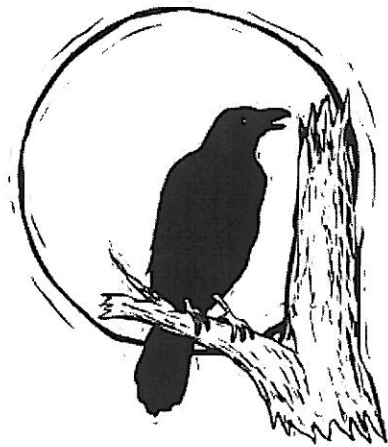



WEATHER DISCUSSION:

The very persistent high pressure begins to weaken today. As a result, temperatures will cool and slowly return to near normal for this time of year. In addition, humidities will increase slightly with better overnight recoveries. Winds will still be generally light to moderate and terrain driven given the complex terrain. The cooling and moistening trend will continue through Thursday. High pressure will re-build next weekend with another round of warmer and drier weather.

WEATHER TODAY: Sunny, cooler.

TEMPERATURES: Ridges: 70-75... Slopes/Valleys 77-86 **24 HR Trend:** 3-5 degs cooler
RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 13-23% **24 HR Trend:** up to 5% wetter

20 FT WINDS:

Slope/Valley: Downslope/Downcanyon 3-6 mph until 1000... then upslope/upcanyon 6 mph G13.
Ridgetop: East to northeast 8 mph G17 until 1000-1200... then southwest to west-southwest 6 mph G15.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Mostly sunny, warm and dry

Temps and RHs – Max Temp 70-86° RH 13-23% LAL 1

20ft Wind –

Slope/Valley – Downslope/downcanyon 3-6 mph until 1000, then upslope/upcanyon 6 mph gusts to 13 mph

Ridgetop – East to northeast to 8 mph gusts to 17 mph until 1000-1200, then southwest to west-southwest 6 mph gusts to 15 mph.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR**GENERAL:****FUELS**

Predominantly mature mixed conifer with heavy shrub loading. Fuel loadings are generally heavy. Live fuels moistures remain dry; however the dead fuels still remain moist in sheltered areas.

Thresholds for Active Fire Behavior in the King Fire area (Eldorado NF Pocket Card): 20ft Winds (over 5 mph), RH (under 22%), Temperature (over 84°) and 1000hr FMC (under 9%). *Currently ERC's from Bald Mountain RAWS station is 66%. The 1000 hr fuel moisture is 11% which is above the threshold for active fire behavior.*

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Slightly cooler and higher RH today with more favorable humidity recovery tonight, however the ERC's continue to rise. Mop-up has been mostly successful around most of the fire up to 200' inside the perimeter. Fuels continue to dry out on multiple sunny exposed aspects. However the fuels are still holding moisture under the canopy on most aspects in spite of the higher ERC's. Heavy fuels and islands continue to burn out throughout the interior. Maximum rate of spread in unburned islands could be up to 6 ch/hr with 2' flame lengths on unshaded southerly aspects if inline with slope and wind. Probability of ignition on southerly exposed aspects is 32%, otherwise 1% on cooler aspects.

DIV G: Interior island may be influenced by cross canyon winds. If left unchecked, the fire spread to the west could occur overnight with the downslope/downvalley winds.



Be cautious if working on steep slopes and utilizing bucket drops.

SAFETY

Stump holes continue to burn deeper and potentially dangerous when walking over them as they can collapse. Exercise caution when mopping up.





Minimize ground disturbing activities in the area. Field weed wash heavy equipment used off roads in Branch III before leaving to assignment on another section of fire. READ verifies location for wash.

Guiding Principles (2014 Red Book)

The primary means by which we implement command decisions and maintain unity of action is through the use of common principles of operations. These principles guide our fundamental wildland fire management practices, behaviors, and customs, and are mutually understood at every level of command. They include Risk Management, Standard Firefighting Orders and Watch Out Situations, LCES and the Downhill Line Construction Checklist. These principles are fundamental to how we perform fire operations, and are intended to improve decision making and firefighter safety. They are not absolute rules. They require judgment in application.

Tired Firefighters

Fatigue—A sense of tiredness, either mental or physical, brought on by stress (lack of sleep, physical work, nutritional inadequacies, or mental stresses). Fatigue following work or sleep deprivation is a normal state and can be reversed with adequate recovery or rest.

Accumulated (Chronic) Fatigue—Fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery. Accumulated fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods, resulting in decreased productivity, compromised immune function, and reduced alertness.

Fatigued workers perform poorly and behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors, and become inattentive. They display decreased motivation, increased irritability and depression, and low morale. Accumulated fatigue is more persistent, producing a wider array of effects on performance, health, and morale than ordinary fatigue. Accumulated fatigue requires longer recovery periods than ordinary fatigue

The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response.
 The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

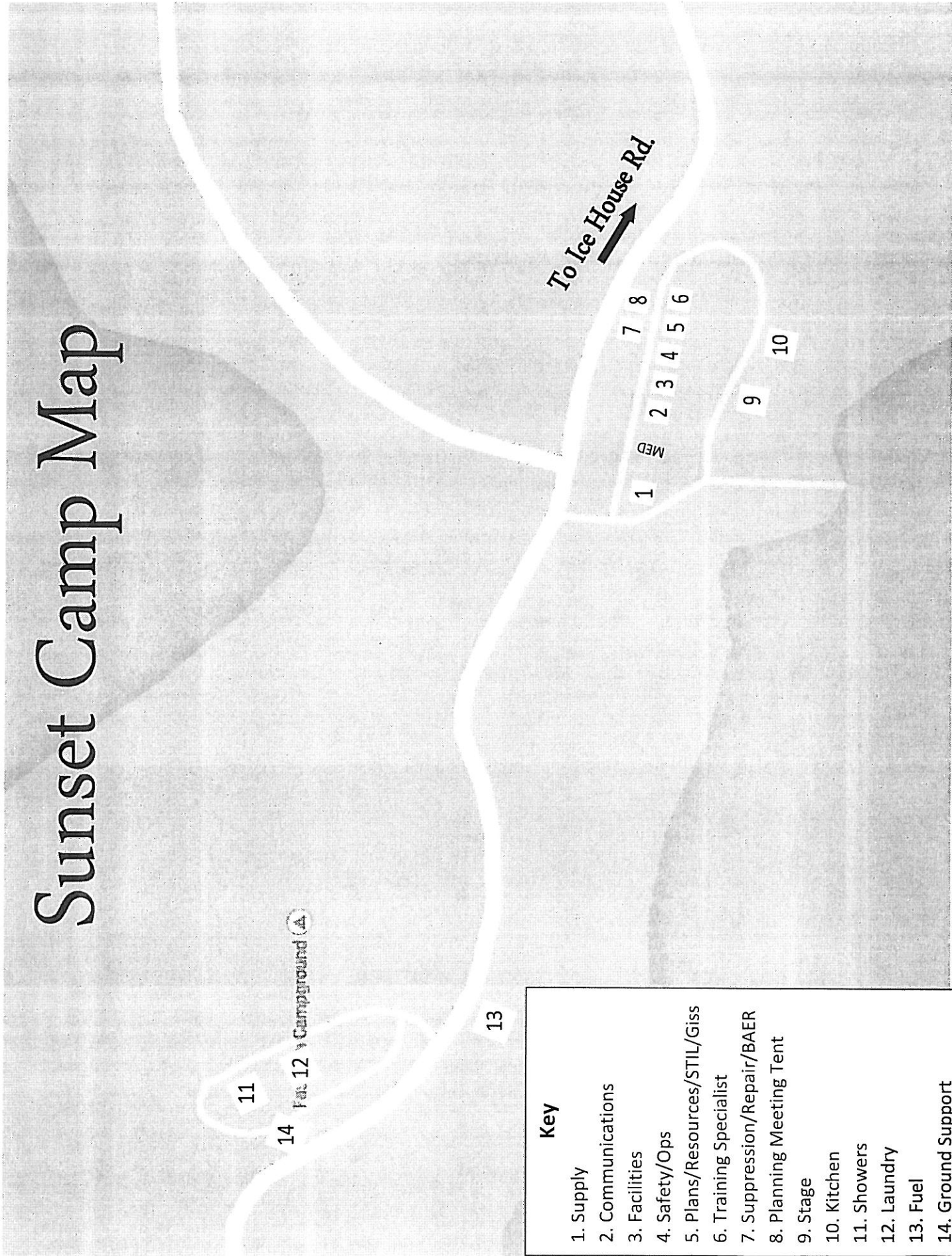

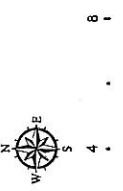
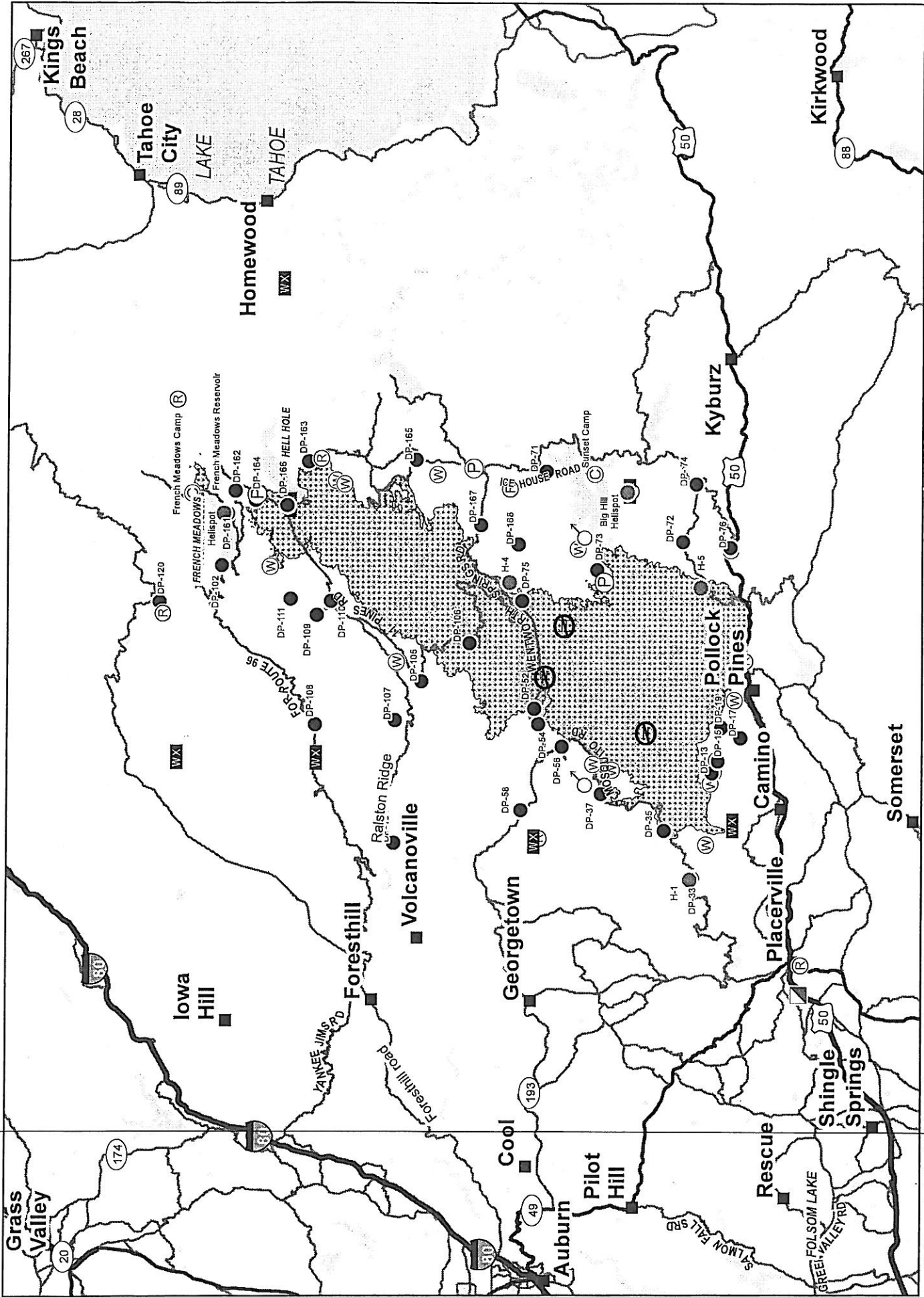
