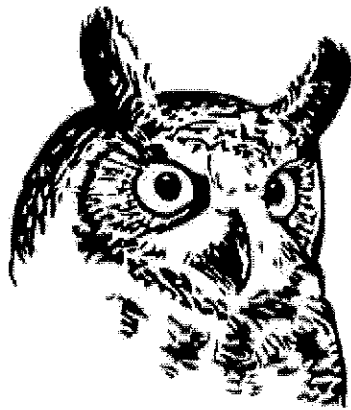




WEATHER DISCUSSION: Smoke from our fire and upstream fires will continue to have a big impact on our weather as the inversion will be strong once again. Expect quiet weather through the morning hours with heavy smoke under the inversion. A stable airmass aloft will make the inversion hard to break but some weakening should occur by 2 pm with heat from the fire in Division E helping things along. General trend on temperature and humidity will be subtle warming and drying. However the smoke and inversion strength may limit solar heating and keep temperatures within the fire cooler than the ambient air just outside the fire lines. Watch out for this as the inversion breaks and fresh air is injected inside the firelines. Ridgetop winds will be out of the West this afternoon with upcanyon winds focused along Sawyers Bar Road during the afternoon and early evening hours.

Weather Forecast for Wednesday: Smoke stuck under a strong inversion until about 2 pm. Sunshine only on the highest peaks above 5000 feet. General trend of warmer and drier.

TEMPERATURES: Warmest day since before last weeks rain. High 70-80 above 4500 feet and 80s to lower 90s along Sawyers Bar Road. Heavy smoke and canopy areas highs 75-85.

HUMIDITY: Trending 2-5% drier than yesterday with afternoon minimum 14-22% lower elevations below 3000 feet and 22-32% above 4500 feet including Div E and along the Tanner Ridge hand line.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Westerly 5-10...strongest after 2 pm with gusts 14-18 mph Div E, M, S and T

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light east then turning upcanyon/westerly 6-10 mph with gusts 12 mph after 2 pm...except 15-20 mph along the Salmon River.

HAINES INDEX: 4 **LAL:** 1 **CWR:** 0%

STABILITY/INVERSION: Strong inversion through 2 pm...may not break if the fire stays quiet.

Wednesday Night: Smoke under the inversion...mostly clear above 5000 feet.

TEMPERATURES: Overnight lows in the 50s lowest elevations but upper 50s to mid 60s thermal belt between 3000-4500 feet.

HUMIDITY: Humidity 25-30% at 6 pm Div E and T along Tanner Ridge...rising 40-50% by midnight and staying steady in the thermal belts between 3000-4500 feet. Lower drainages will recover 60-70% along Sawyers Bar Road.


20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 5 to 10 mph through 9 pm then 5 mph Easterly overnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Becoming down-canyon 2-5 mph. **LAL:** 1 **CWR:** 0%

Extended Forecast: No big weather changes forecast for Thursday. On Friday an upper trough will approach with slight cooling and moistening along with a change to Northwest winds. Another few degrees of cooling Saturday as the trough passes. Dry North winds develop Sunday through early next week.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: A stable airmass aloft will make today's inversion difficult to break but some mixing should occur by 1400. Light westerly winds under the high pressure will keep things persistent with yesterday. Temperatures and humidity will be similar to past days but the smoke has the potential to act as an insulator extending the burn period.

OUTPUTS

GENERAL: Fire behavior will remain consistent with the past couple of shifts. Observations made over the last several shifts will hold true again today with the persistence in the weather pattern. With the airmass continuing to dry as the high pressure builds expect fire behavior indices to slightly increase again today. Fine fuel moisture values will be a point or two lower today with the driest sites getting down to 4% and a P(ig) of 80%. This will continue to present holding issues for line that has heat against it and for firing operations where spotting will be a serious issue. Nearly full consumption of 100-hr and 1000-hr fuels remains with their fuel moistures down to near critical levels. Winds will be key today. Pay particular attention to wind direction and how winds will be influenced by the topography around you. Expect the down slope/canyon winds in the evenings to be the best times for firing and holding lines on ridges but the upslope winds in the height of the burn period will test control lines.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: Favorable conditions to clean up the successful firing operations from previous shifts will be present today with winds limiting spotting potential. Opportunities to continue the burnout beyond DP 1 will be difficult because the change in fuel model to a brush type will mean backing and flanking fire typically used for ignition patterns will be hard to achieve. Watchout for areas where depth from the firing operation left the chance for an uphill run to still challenge control lines.

Rolling material from above Sawyers Bar Road will remain a threat for fire crossing the road and establishing near the river. Keep an eye uphill as you work along the roadway. The fire has not spread in the north part of the branch east of Olsen Meadows for a few days but heat remains, particularly in heavy fuels and in sheltered locations, expect these last traces of fire to be consumed over the next couple of shifts.

Branch III: Fire behavior in the northern portion of the branch from Tanners Peak around to the break has been fairly calm following the recent suppression actions. A few locations with unburned fuel remain interior of the line and these will clean themselves up or will be available to burn during the shift with favorable conditions. Large diameter fuels and rocky slopes with intermixed fuels will retain heat and present some difficulty for mop-up.

The Tanner Line down to the mouth of Jackass Gulch will present some issues with afternoon upslope winds being adverse to suppression efforts. Look for opportunities to conduct firing operations late in the burn period when the downslope diurnal wind begins. Holding efforts will continue to be tested as residual heat in the timber takes time to consume down. Be aware that the significant surface fuel loading will mean a long burn down period and require extra vigilance.

Night Branch: Conditions will remain favorable for fire spread and burning until 2300 with humidity values remaining below 40%. Once the fine fuel moisture reaches 10% expect fire behavior to slow greatly and after midnight fire spread will be all but stopped. Larger diameter fuels will once again hold fire through the night as they consume down. Expect rolling material to continue to threaten the Sawyers Bar Road and to help position fire ahead of the next burn period. Downslope winds at night will aid firing operations early in the shift and will make holding operations for the control lines on the ridges much easier.

AIR OPERATIONS

Once again smoke from the fires in the area will have created a strong inversion overnight and it will struggle to mix out before early afternoon. Once the inversion breaks expect a dense haze to be left in the drainages making visibility difficult and will threaten to shut down air operations. Winds will be relatively calm creating rather smooth flying conditions.

SAFETY

Identify your escape routes and make sure they are communicated, especially while in areas with limited access and egress. Provide ample time for slower moving resources to leave the area and have a plan in place to ensure accountability of all those assigned with you.

- ✓ **Heat Illness** - When the air temperature is higher than the skin temperature, sweating is the only way to prevent overheating. During sweating, blood is diverted to the extremities, where water diffuses from the blood to the surface of the skin. As water evaporates, the body loses 580 kilocalories of heat for each liter of sweat evaporated. On average, wildland firefighters need 4 to 6 liters of water a day to stay hydrated. Muscle cramping might be the first sign of heat-related illness, and may lead to heat exhaustion or stroke

- ✓ **Fire Behavior** - Watch for alignment of wind and topography as the fire burns toward the control lines on Div T and E. Watch for indicators and have your trigger points and escape routes secured.

- ✓ **Demob** No driver will drive more than 10 hours (behind the wheel) within any duty day.
Multiple drivers in a single vehicle may drive up to the duty day limitation provided no driver exceeds the individual driving (behind the wheel) time limitation of 10 hours.

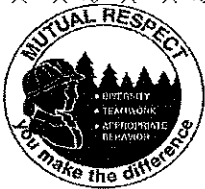

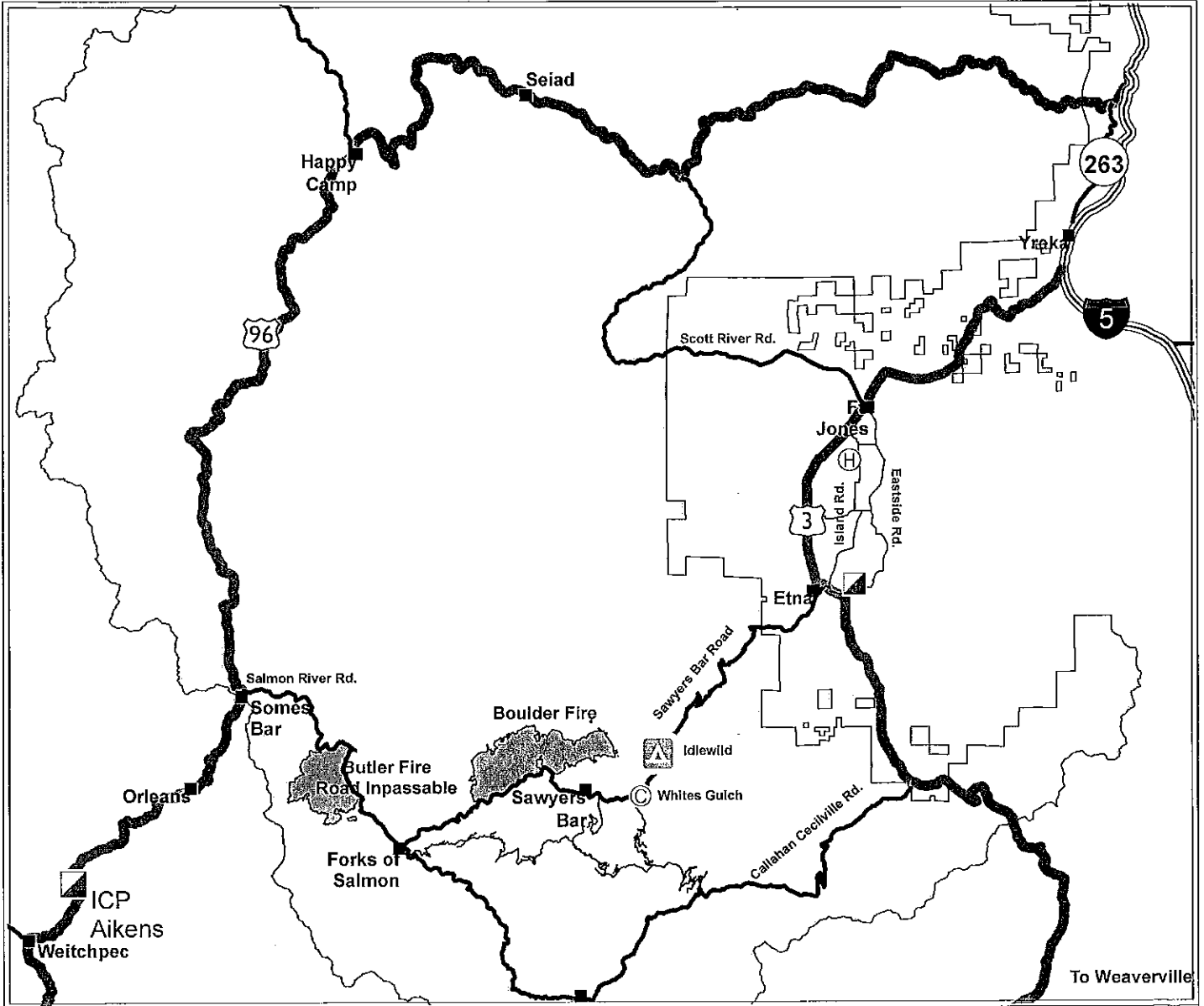

Salmon River Complex Fire Transportation Map

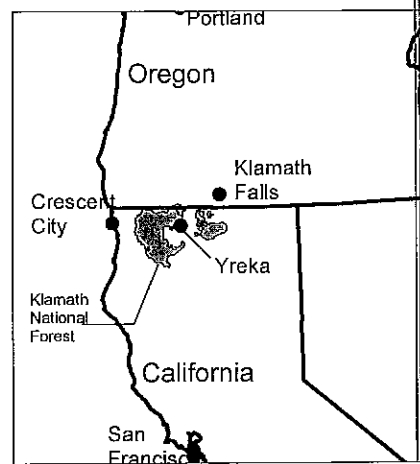
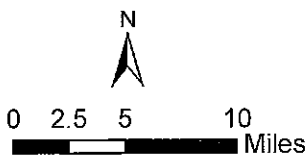
