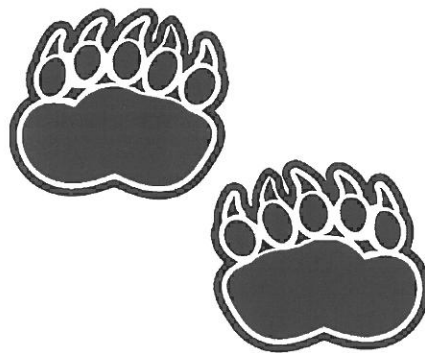



...A RED FLAG WARNING REMAINS IN EFFECT FOR GUSTY NORTHEAST WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITIES THROUGH 10 PM THURSDAY NIGHT...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The thermal pressure trough that has been impacting the fire will remain nearly stationary through the burning period tomorrow. That said, not much is expected in the way of change with regards to winds over the incident, as they will remain mostly out of the northeast at speeds similar to yesterday. With this continued flow from the northeast, afternoon high temperatures will rise 2-3 degrees from yesterday and thus, afternoon RH values are expected to once again dip down into the single digits. While unstable conditions are also expected to continue, they will be slightly diminished compared to yesterday.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY (THURSDAY):

WEATHER: Continued very dry conditions with gusty winds. Areas of smoke.
MAX TEMPERATURES: Valleys (1,200 ft) 85 – 90 F, Ridges (4,000 ft) 73 – 80 F
MIN HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 3 – 8%, Ridges (4,000 ft) 5 – 10%
WINDS (EYE LEVEL):

Lower Slopes/Drainages – Downslope/downcanyon 2–5 mph in the morning, becoming upslope/upcanyon 3–7 mph in the afternoon. (NE to SW oriented drainages 4-8 mph with gusts to 12 mph)
Ridgetop – Northeast 5 – 10 mph with gusts up to 15 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 5
STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion is expected to break between 1100 and 1200.
SMOKE TRANSPORT: Northeast 10 – 15 mph.

Red Flag Warning for Gusty Northeast Winds, Low Relative Humidity's, and Unstable Conditions Through 1000 PM Tonight

High Temperature: 73-90°

Minimum RH: 3-10%

Winds (eye level): Valleys becoming upslope/upcanyon 3-7 mph. Northeast to southwest oriented drainages 4-8 with gusts to 12

Ridgetop winds 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph

Winds (eye level): Valleys becoming downslope/ downvalley 3-6 mph, Strongest winds in east-west oriented drainages.

GENERAL:

POI: 60-90% Afternoon southerly aspects **ERC:** 90th percentile **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80%

Today will be less unstable than yesterday, but there is still potential for large column development with long range spotting (up to 2 miles). Southwesterly slopes aligned with the northeasterly winds could exhibit active surface fire, torching and active crown fire. The remainder of the fire will be fuels and topography driven. At present primary fire spread is from spot fires caused by rolling material and torching.

Night Shift Personnel: Fire behavior could be active on the slopes as the shift begins. Fire on ridgetops aligned with the northeast winds could be active throughout the evening and early morning hours. Fire behavior on the slopes backing into the drainages should decrease by early morning as the RH begins to rise around 2000 hrs.

SPECIFIC:

Division O, Q, T, Z, D, F and I: These Divisions are still indicating scattered and isolated heat on the IR, however minimal fire activity is anticipated.

Division G and H: Isolated heat sources are still present; however minimal fire activity is anticipated.

Division J: Fire will continue to burn out in Kuntz Ck and Mill Ck drainages. Spotting is still possible to the southwest over the ridge. Fire could start eating its way into Mitchell Ck, and could become established today. The spot fire in Tom Martin Ck drainage could continue to show some heat.

- Review the Incident or Forest Emergency reporting procedures
- Review the Incident's assigned Medical resources and their location. (note radio call sign)
- Assure that all assigned supervisors have reviewed and understand the Medical Plan. (if none is available develop a quick plan before engaging)

Arriving at work site:

- Assess access and egress for medical ground units.
- Assure that all resources can clearly articulate their location. (update as they move)
- GPS potential Drop Points or Landing Zones.
- Note weather changes and check on availability of air resources.
- Pre-Position medical supplies

During Response to a Medical Emergency:

- Contact Communications and declare a **MEDICAL EMERGENCY!!**
- Identify the Unit needing help and their location
- Insure that LCES are maintained.
- Obtain patient info and severity.
- Develop a resource list
 - Initial care
 - Sustained care
 - Extrication/evacuation
- Report the Emergency and request anticipated resources needs
- Put two plans in place and start both plans clearly identifying the primary and backup plan to resources assigned.
- During the Evacuation (every 15 min.)**
- Reassess the treatment and the patient response (Are they getting better?) Do you have the right level of care?
- Assess the evacuation plans progress and adjust as needed.
- Assure that additional personnel are available for relief.
- Up-date Comm/Disp of the progress of the rescue.
