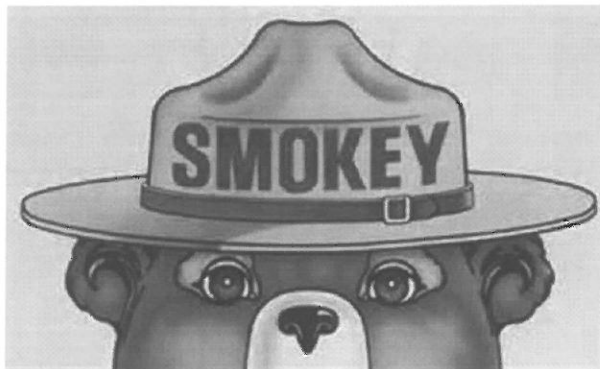




*****Easterly (but lighter)Winds Return Today*****

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Easterly component ridge winds return today as the thermal trough builds back up the coast. This should help clear some of the smoke along the east and south flanks of the fire. Better heating will enhance the slope/canyon winds. Thermal trough meanders near the incident Thursday bringing instability and variable ridge winds somewhat favoring east. Northwest winds arrive Friday as the thermal trough pushes east. A weak trough could swing by Monday/Tuesday but so far no rain expected.

Weather Forecast For Today (Wednesday):

Weather: Warming and drying.
Max Temperatures: Canyons (1,200 ft) 88-94 °F, Ridges (5,000 ft) 81-85 °F
Min Humidity: Canyons (1,200 ft) 10-15%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 16-22%
Winds (20 foot):
 Lower Slope/Canyons – Variable winds 0-2 mph becoming terrain driven 3-7 mph in the afternoon.
 Upper Slope/Ridgetop – East 6-9 mph becoming Northeast 3-6 mph around 1200.
Haines Index (High Level, afternoon): 3 (stability=1; moisture=2)
Stability/Inversion: Moderate Low Level instability. Inversion lifting 1300. Afternoon Mixing Height 12,000 feet MSL.
Smoke Transport: East around 12 mph becoming Northeast 7 mph around 1300.

Weather: Smoke settling into Canyons...otherwise mostly clear.
Min Temperatures: 50-62 F...upper slopes and ridges warmest.
Max Humidity: Valleys (1,200 ft) 68-72%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 25-30%

 Valleys – Terrain Driven 4-8 mph becoming drainage 3-6 mph around 2100.
 Ridgetop – East 3-6 mph becoming Southeast 5 to 8 mph around 0200.
Haines Index (High Level, evening): 4 (stability=2; moisture=2)
Stability/Inversion: Low level inversions developing around sunset. Main thermal belt around 5000 feet.
Smoke Transport: East 8 mph becoming Southeast 10 mph near Midnight.



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: (Please see attached fire weather forecast)

High Temperature: 81-94° **Minimum temperature:** 50-62 °

Minimum RH: 10-22% **Maximum RH:** 25-72%

Winds (20'): Day, Ridges east 6-9 mph becoming northeast 3-6 mph gusts to 20. Night, east 3-6 mph becoming southeast 5-8 mph around 0200. 8-12 mph.

GENERAL:

POI: 70-80% **Predicted ERC:** 84 **Predicted BI:** 76 **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80%

East to north easterly winds should move smoke out on the east side of the fire and lengthen the burn period today. Smoke may linger in lower areas sheltered from the ridgetop winds to early afternoon. Fire will continue to burn out within the planned perimeter mainly through backing fire in the morning hours and increasing fire activity as the fuels heat up throughout the day. Heat sources along the fire perimeter on the eastside of the fire other than Monday's activity have decreased significantly. Fire growth will continue to be fuels and topography driven with potential for large fire growth. As smoke lifts and the fuels become exposed to sunlight, the fire could become extremely active including torching, and active crown fire especially when in alignment with the wind. Moderate column growth is possible. Expect spot fires 1+ mile.

Night Shift Personnel: Fire behavior probably will not be as active as it has been the past two shifts as fuels are consuming. Conditions should be favorable for firing operations. Low RH recovery on the ridgetops will enable residual fuels to consume.

SPECIFIC:

Division O, Q, T, Z, D, F, G,H, J,K: Minimal fire behavior anticipated

Division L: Spotfires from Monday should be mostly contained by beginning of shift today. Numerous heat sources are present within the perimeter. Northeast winds in the afternoon will not be favorable for holding. Any isolated torching could carry spots to the southwest. Spotfires to the southwest could come into alignment with ridgetop and upvalley winds and spread across slope. **ROS could be up to 1-30 ch/r.**

Division M: Northeast ridgetop winds will be in alignment with Cayenne ridge so in the event of any torching occurs, the fire could spot to the southwest. Yesterdays IR indicated only scattered heat sources.

Division S: Northeast ridgetop may not be favorable for burning operation.

Division I: Fire will continue moving south and southeast towards Red Rock. **Rates of spread could be up to 1-25 ch/hr.**

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke cover could limit air operations throughout the day

SAFETY

Alignment of topography and wind during the Burning Period should be considered a trigger point to reevaluate tactics.

Major Hazards and Risks:

- ✓ **Situational Awareness** – Conduct thorough briefings with your crew on all components of the IAP. Weather forecast should be highlighted in crew briefing today. Crews know where your EMTs are, and ensure communications are in place. Make LCES personal for your piece of real estate.
- ✓ **Fire Behavior** – This fire is a sleeping giant under the inversion that really takes off when it's allowed to breath. Wind is forecast to blow from a different direction than the past few days. Be aware of how this impacts your piece of ground.
- ✓ **Communications** – Emphasis the Comm plan during crew briefings. If you are reassigned to a different division, be sure to check the comm plan get on the right frequency.
- ✓ **Structure Protection** – An individual's ability to assimilate all available factors affecting situational awareness is limited in a dynamic wildland urban interface fire environment. Every firefighter is responsible to understand and recognize these limitations, and to apply their experience, training and personal judgment to observe, orient, decide, and act in preparation for the "worst case".
- ✓ **Driving Safety** – Still one of our bigger concerns. Many fire line roads are paved, so it's easy to drive fast. Slow down. Set up one way traffic control on those long narrow stretches to avoid extended backing operations.
- ✓ **Heavy Equipment** – (Branch I, III, V) Ensure all personnel are visible to dozers, maintain communications and mitigate overhead and rolling hazards. Maintain adequate separation between dozers and crews. Utilize traffic control on roads when transporting dozers to different parts of the fire.




If Declaring an "Incident within the Incident"

The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response. The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

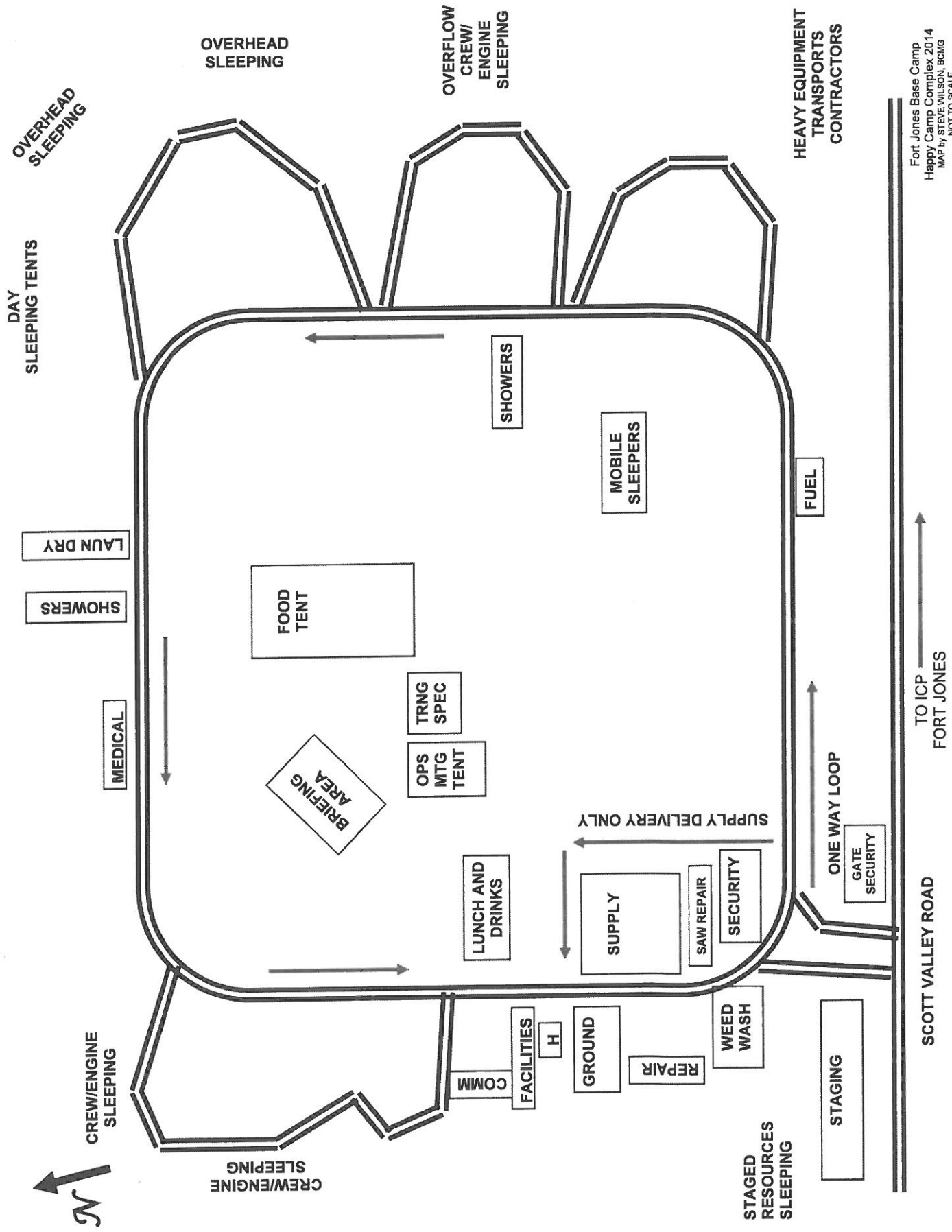
