




*All future forecasts will have ridgetops as 7000 feet in elevation*

**Weather Discussion:** High clouds are expected to increase tonight and become thick enough to limit solar heating on Saturday. This will lead to slightly cooler maximum temperatures. A trough will approach the coast Sunday and Monday bringing an increase in low level moisture with flat cumulus expected to develop. No rain is expected. The trough will continue to approach the coast by the middle of the week bringing increasing south winds to the area. Cooler temperatures along with the possibility of light rain by Thursday.

**Weather Forecast For Today (Saturday):**

**Weather:** Considerable High Clouds. Slightly cooler temperatures and continued dry. Smoke stuck in most of the canyon bottoms.

**Max Temperatures:** Canyons (1,200 ft) 85-95 °F, Ridges (7,000 ft) 72-77 °F

**Min Humidity:** Canyons (1,200 ft) 10-15%, Ridges (7,000 ft) 18-23%

**Winds (20 foot):**

**Lower Slope/Canyons** – Variable winds 0-3 mph becoming terrain driven 3-7g18 mph in the afternoon.

**Upper Slope/Ridgetop** – Southwest 5-10 mph becoming West 6-10 mph around 1600.

**Haines Index (High Level, afternoon):** 4 (stability=2; moisture=2)

**Stability/Inversion:** Moderate instability. Inversion lifting 1300. Afternoon Mixing Height 11,000 feet MSL.

**Smoke Transport:** Southwest 10 mph becoming West 10 mph around 1500.

**Weather Forecast For Tonight (Saturday Night):**

**Weather:** High Clouds in the evening then clearing overnight. Smoke in the canyons.

**Min Temperatures:** 54-66 F...upper slopes and ridges warmest.

**Max Humidity:** Valleys (1,200 ft) 70-75%, Ridges (7,000 ft) 30-35%

**Winds (20 foot):**

**Valleys** – Terrain Driven 4-8 mph becoming drainage 3-6 mph around 2100.

**Upper Slope/Ridgetop** – Northwest 5-10 mph then becoming variable 3-6 mph after midnight.

**Haines Index (High Level, evening):** 2 (stability=1; moisture=1)

**Stability/Inversion:** Low level inversions developing around sunset. Main thermal belt around 4,500 feet.

**Smoke Transport:** Southwest 6 mph above the inversion.

**Outlook For Sunday 9/14:** Some afternoon shallow cumulus. Continued warm and dry. Moderately unstable. Max Temps: 87 to 97. Min RH: 12-19%. Max RH: 28-66%. Ridge Wind: Light Southeast in the morning around 4 mph becoming Southwest 5-10 mph in the afternoon. Haines 2 (s:1, m:1).

### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** (Please see attached fire weather forecast)

**High Temperature:** 72-95° **Minimum temperature:** 54-66 °

**Minimum RH:** 10-23% **Maximum RH:** 30-75%

**Winds (20'):** Day, Ridges southwest 5-10 mph becoming west 6-10 around 1600. 3-6. Night, Ridgetop northwest 5-10 mph becoming variable 3-6 mph.

### GENERAL:

**POI:** 80-100% **Predicted ERC:** 85 **Predicted BI:** 77 **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80%

Continued warm and dry, and moderately instable. Smoke in the canyon bottoms will shade fuels and decrease fire behavior through early to late afternoon. Unburned islands within the fire perimeter will continue to consume.

Fire will continue to back under these conditions in available fuelbeds.

If and when the smoke lifts, fire activity will increase where there are available fuel and heat sources. Fire movement will be influenced by the terrain driven winds, dry fuels, and topography.

As smoke lifts, expect active fire behavior in available fuels that include active surface fire, torching and crown runs. Spotting distance up to 1 plus miles. Moderate column growth is possible. Watch for spotting towards the east in the afternoon.

**Night Shift Personnel:** Fuels will continue to burnout within the fire perimeter. The only major fire growth anticipated will be in Division O south of Kings Castle. Low RH recovery on the ridgetops will enable residual fuels to consume.

### SPECIFIC:

**Division Q, T, Z, D, F, G,H, J,K:** Minimal fire behavior anticipated

**Division L:** Islands will continue to burn out west of Scott River Rd. Otherwise minimal fire behavior is anticipated

**Division M and S:** afternoon west winds will move parallel to the fireline. Watch for spots if there are any hot jackpots of fuel.

**Division R:** Minimal fire activity expected.

**Division N:** West ridgetop winds combined with local upslope/upcanyon winds may not be favorable for firing operations today combined with high temperatures and low relative humidity after (if) smoke lifts.

**Division O:** Fire will continue to move south and southeast. Fire is currently burning in timber stringers. There are also large areas of brush and grass surrounding the timber stringers where it is currently burning. Generally when fire moves through the brush it spreads snag to snag, log to log, and when it runs into a jackpot the fire may run through the brush. With record low live fuel moisture, the brush may be more available to burn than normal.

**Potential Forward ROS on slopes:** 1-25CH/HR

### AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke cover could limit air operations throughout the day

### SAFETY

Steep slopes, poor access, and active fire behavior will compromise escape routes and safety zones. Be sure to implement LCES prior to engagement.

### If Declaring an "Incident within the Incident"

The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response. The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

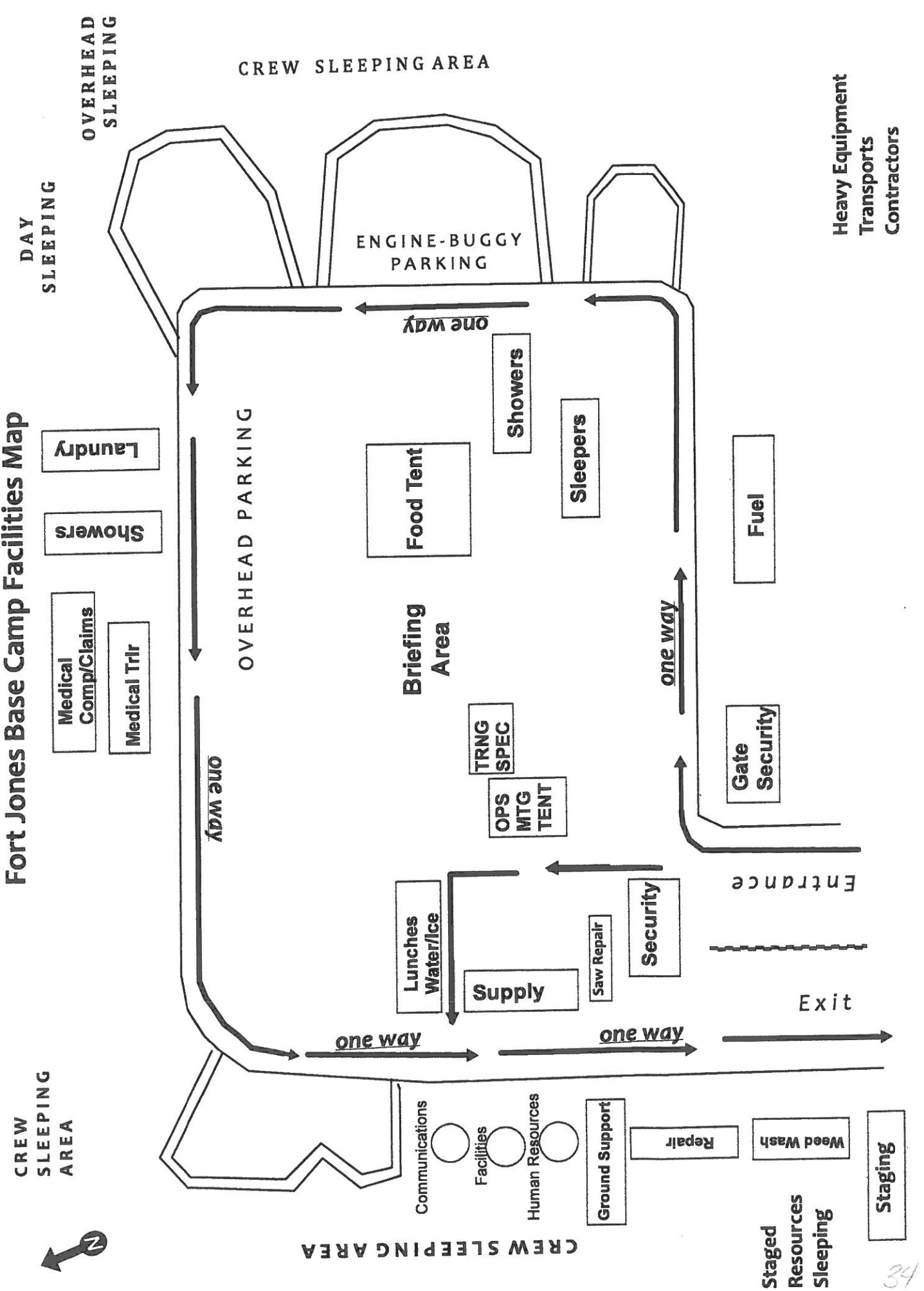

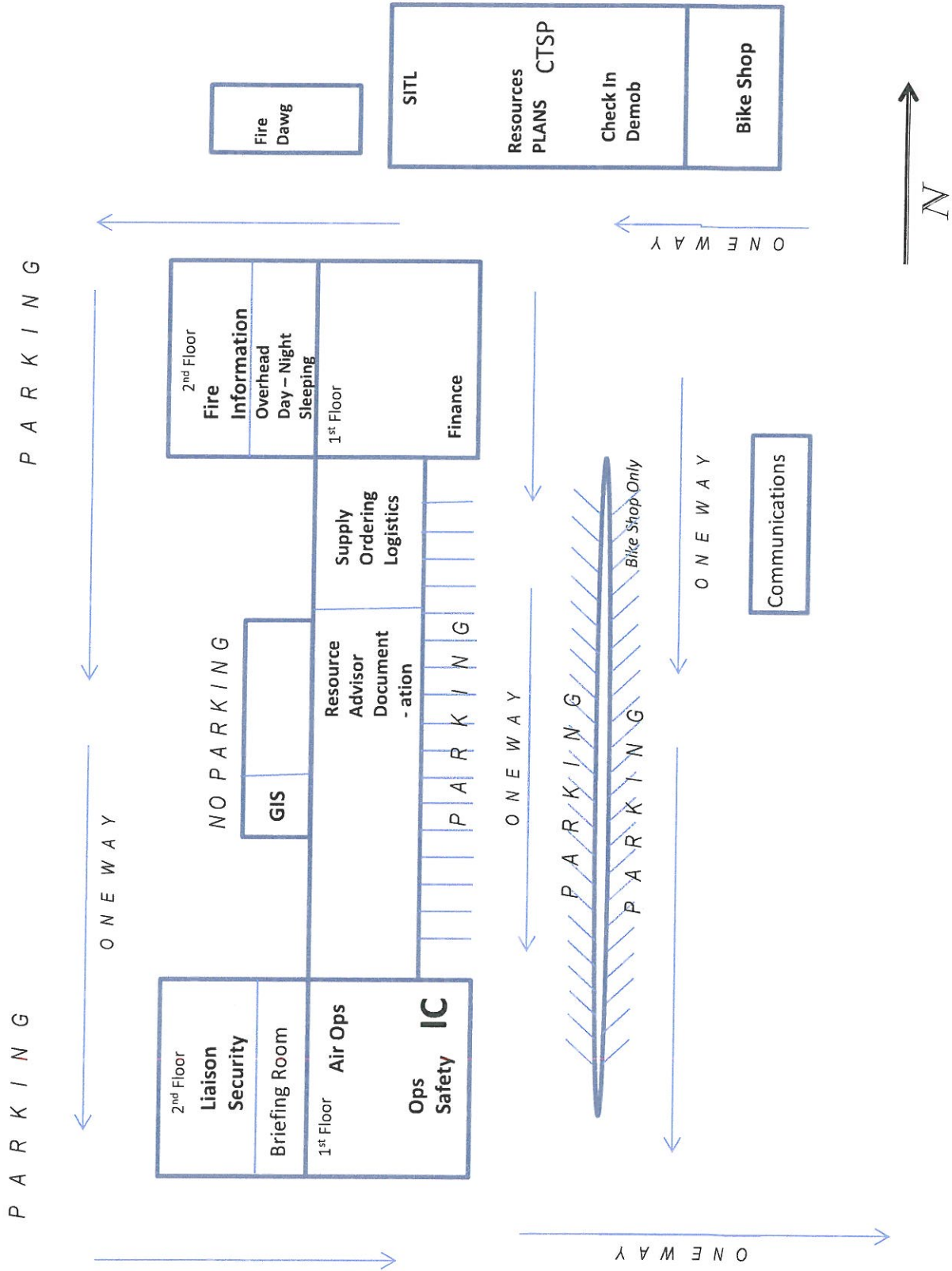
