


7. **Resource Protection Guidelines**

- Use MIST to minimize impacts to wilderness characteristics.
- Avoid aerial retardant within 300 feet of wet areas and in areas with threatened, endangered, proposed, candidate or sensitive species.
- Use screens on all drafting equipment.
- Track and map daily all tactical burning operations and turn into DIVS/ SIT unit.

Weather Discussion: A trough will approach the coast Sunday and Monday bringing an increase in low level moisture with a slight chance thunderstorms Monday. South winds are also expected to increase. Rainfall amounts are expected to be less than a quarter of an inch under the storm core. Slightly cooler temperatures and a continuation of southerly winds are forecast Tuesday and Wednesday.

Weather: A few clouds. Continued dry. Smoke stuck in most of the canyon bottoms.
Max Temperatures: Canyons (1,200 ft) 87-95 °F, Ridges (7,000 ft) 72-77 °F

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: (Please see attached fire weather forecast)

High Temperature: 72-95° **Minimum temperature:** 52-62 °

Minimum RH: 9-25% **Maximum RH:** 32-77%

Winds (20'): Day, Ridges south 4-7 mph becoming southwest-west 7-12 with gusts to 17 mph after 1200. Night, ridgetop southwest 5-10 mph decreasing after 2200 to variable 3-6 mph.

GENERAL:

POI: 60-90% **Predicted ERC:** 85 **Predicted BI:** 77 **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80-100% (100% at higher elevations)

Continued warm and dry, and moderately instable. Smoke in the canyon bottoms will shade fuels and decrease fire behavior until it lifts. Unburned islands within the fire perimeter will continue to consume. Fire will continue to back under these conditions in available fuelbeds. If and when the smoke lifts, fire activity will increase where there are available fuel and heat sources. Fire movement will be influenced by the terrain driven winds, ridgetop winds, dry fuels, topography, and spotting. (up to 1 mile+) Moderate column growth is possible and developing pyrocumulus. As smoke lifts, expect active fire behavior in available fuels that include active surface fire, torching and crown runs. Watch for spotting to the north in the morning then northeast-east in the afternoon.

Night Shift Personnel: Fuels will continue to burnout within the fire perimeter. The only major fire growth anticipated will be in Division O and N north of Elk Peak, and northwest of H40. Low RH recovery on the ridgetops will enable residual fuels to consume.

SPECIFIC:

Division: Q, T, Z, D, F, G,H, J,K, L, M, and R: Minimal fire behavior anticipated

Division N and O: Fire will continue to move south and southeast further into Toms Valley Ck, and Rainy Valley Ck. and will be pushed by local upslope/upcanyon winds. Fire will also move east towards H40 and could come into alignment with southwest-west ridgetop winds in the afternoon. That could become a source of long range spotting to the east-northeast over the ridge. Fire is currently burning in timber stringers. As fire moves into the Panther Fire burn scar, fire activity should drop as the brush is fairly immature (6 years old). There is low dead to live fuels present other than dead and down logs and snags. Live fuel moisture is low, but spread probably would originate from jackpots of fuel and make short runs.

Potential Forward ROS on slopes: 1-25CH/HR

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke cover could limit air operations throughout the day

SAFETY

Know where your fire is positioned on the slope. We saw yesterday what the fire can do when it establishes itself near the bottom of a slope. Post Lookouts, Keep Communications with your forces, Know where your Escape Routes to the Safety Zones are located.

- ✓ **Driving on the Incident** - Hazardous mountain roads are common.
 - **The right vehicle for the right road for the right reason.** Scout roads before sending up large suppression vehicles.
 - **Scott Creek Rd is narrow, winding and has few wide spots for turning around or getting by opposing traffic.**
 - **There are numerous places with soft shoulders where pavement is dropping away especially Elk Creek rd. Plus no guard rails at the top of steep drop-offs.**
 - **Inattention, distracted driving, or nodding off due to fatigue could easily result in tragedy. Keep your speed down.**
 - **Driving through the community between Fort Jones Base and the fire perimeter please slow down, the road is very close to some homes.**

Initial Attack Responsibilities "Drought Conditions"

- **Modify initial response to fires due to increased fire growth potential; significantly increase the numbers and combinations of line production resources.**
- **Throughout extended attack, evaluate the numbers and mix of resources to improve line production capability.**
- **Creation of anchor points is more difficult than normal. Focus firefighters energy on establishing a solid anchor point to work from.**
- **Monitor the effectiveness of all air and ground line production resources.**
- **Consider non-typical types of production resources; use different combinations of line producing resources using more mechanized equipment.**
- **Ensure all crews not familiar with the area are briefed on anomalies this season, such as fuels, fire behavior, and modified tactics.**
- **Constantly brief and remind personnel to look at self-protection and retaining defensive capability with water, foam, protection lines, escape routes, and safety zones.**

Consider increased focus on securing the perimeter. Hot spotting without follow-up patrol, cold trailing, and mop-up appears to result in line re-kindle in these fuel conditions




Medivac Sites

If air or ground ambulance is DELAYED:

Package and transport patient to rendezvous with Ambulance. Re-route EMS helicopter to rendezvous point as appropriate.

If Declaring an "Incident within the Incident"

The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response. The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

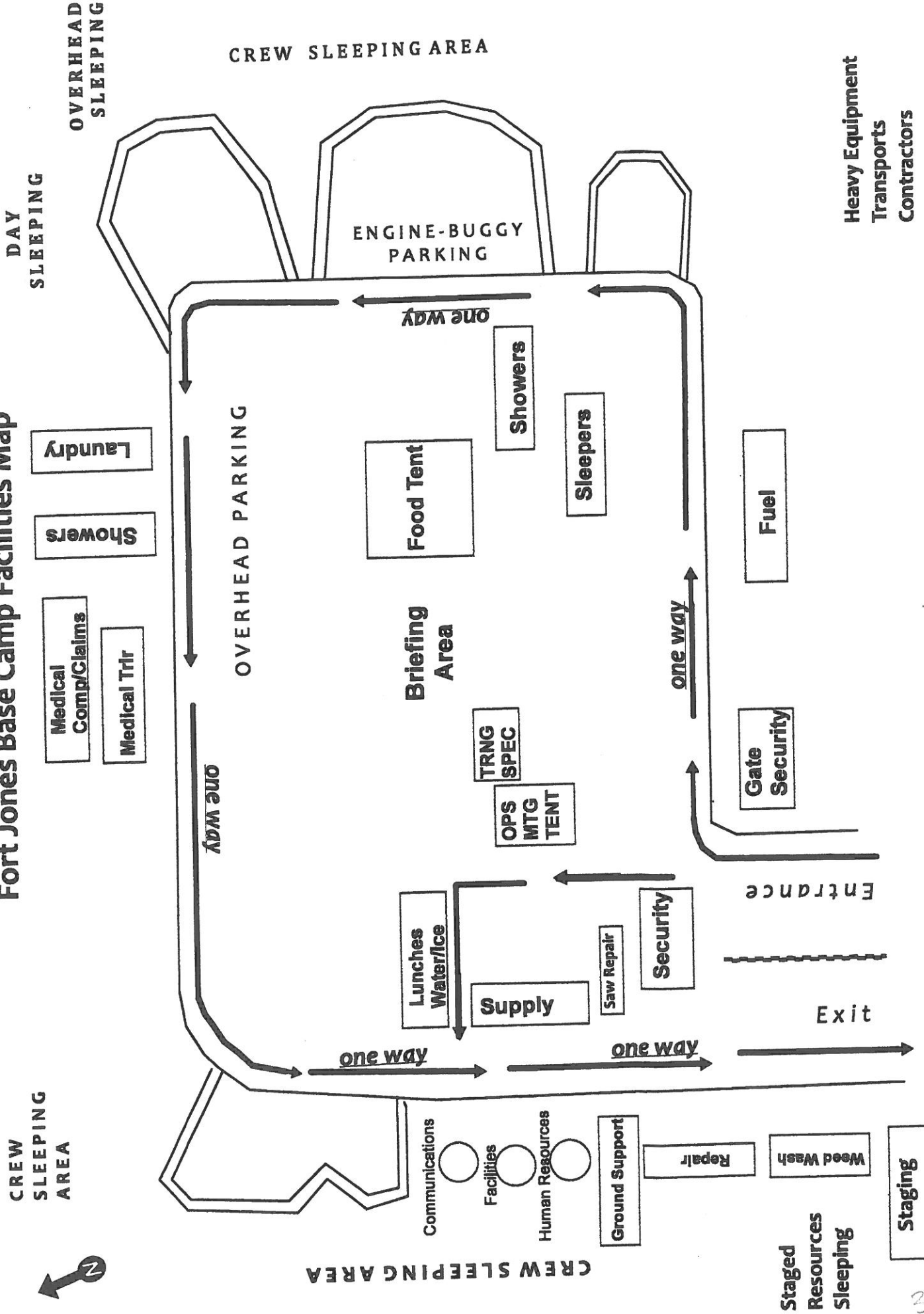

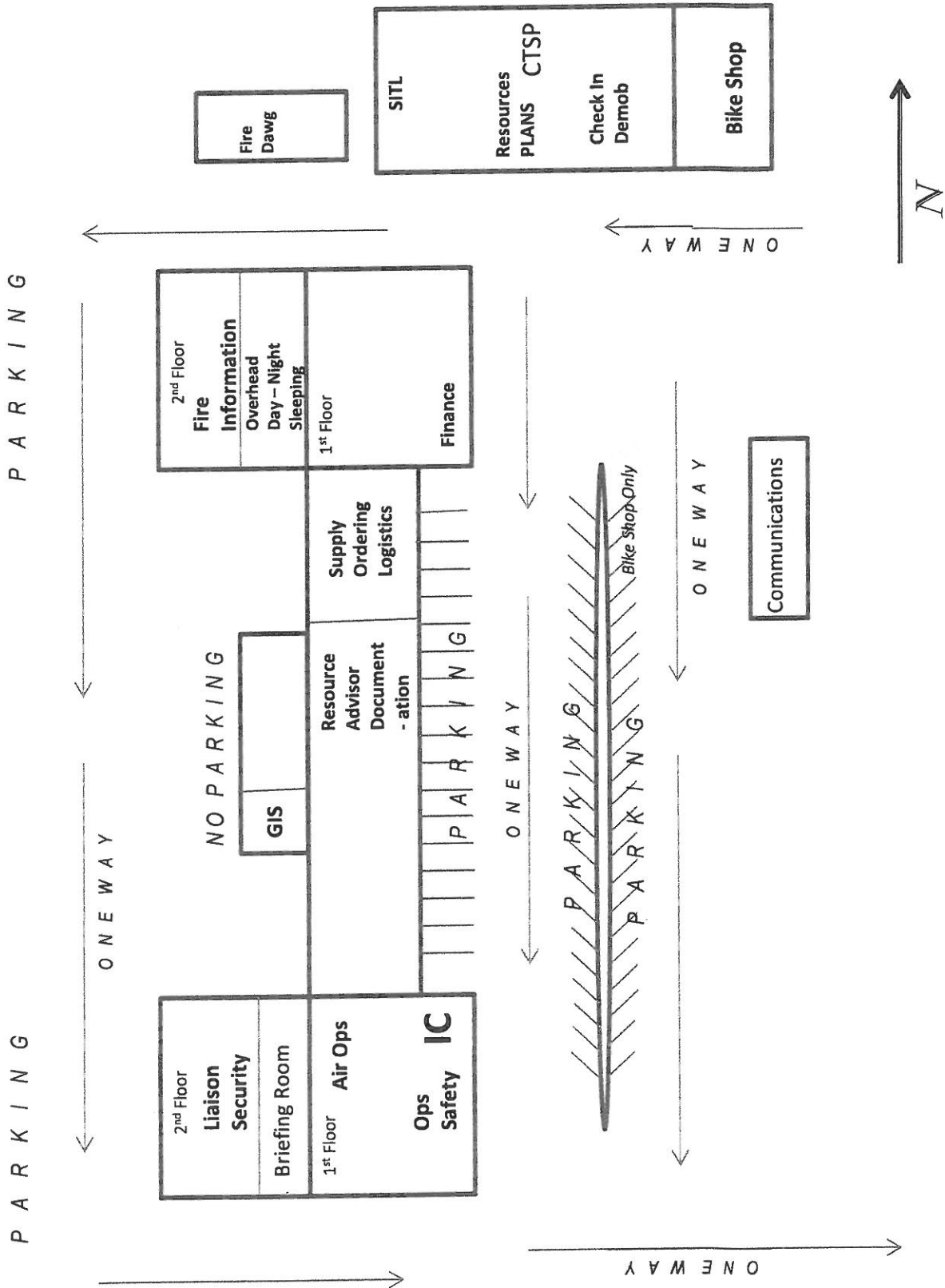
