


***Unstable with thunderstorms possible. Gusty South Winds.***

**Weather Discussion:** Increasing clouds and instability today. Slight chance thunderstorms late morning and afternoon. South winds will increase and become gusty in the afternoon. Drier and more stable air will work into the area Monday night and Tuesday. Upper level low pressure over the area bringing cooler temperatures along with a chance of showers Wednesday and Thursday.

**Weather Forecast For Today (Monday):**

**Weather:** Increasing clouds during the day. A 20% chance of a thunderstorm over the incident. Rainfall amounts up to 0.25" under a storm core. Chance of wetting rain (>0.10"): 5%  
**Max Temperatures:** Canyons (1,200 ft) 85-95 °F, Ridges (7,000 ft) 70-75 °F  
**Min Humidity:** Canyons (1,200 ft) 17-22%, Ridges (7,000 ft) 32-38%



### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** (Please see attached fire weather forecast)

**High Temperature:** 85-95° **Minimum temperature:** 52-62 °

**Minimum RH:** 17-22% **Maximum RH:** 72-77%

**Winds (20'):** Day, ridges south 12-23 mph with gusts to 30-35 mph after 1200. Night, ridges south 13-18 gusts 21-26 mph.

### GENERAL:

**POI:** 50-80% **Predicted ERC:** 86 **Predicted BI:** 81 **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80-100% (100% at higher elevations)

Today the warm and dry trend will continue. Atmospheric instability will be greater than it has been for the last few days, and significant column growth is possible, pyrocumulus may develop. Expect smoke to fill the valley bottoms in the morning and fire behavior should be reduced until winds develop and smoke lifts. If predicted winds develop fire activity will rapidly increase where surface heating aligns with topography and fuels. Surface fire runs, torching, and crown runs will be likely in areas of heavy concentrations of fuels. Spotting will again be possible (up to 1mi).

**Night Shift Personnel:** Fuels will continue to burnout within the fire perimeter. The only major fire growth anticipated will be in Division O and N. Low RH recovery on the ridgetops will enable residual fuels to consume.

### SPECIFIC:

**Division: Q, T, Z, D, F, G,H, J,K, L, M, R and S:** Minimal fire behavior anticipated

**Division N and O:** Fire will continue to move south and southeast further into Toms Valley Ck, and Rainy Valley Ck. pushed by local upslope/upcanyon winds. Fire will also move upslope to the east towards H40 and could come into alignment with southwest-west ridgetop winds in the afternoon. If fire transitions into the canopies long range spotting to the east-northeast over the ridge is likely (+ - 1mi). Fire is currently burning in timber stringers. As fire moves into the Panther Fire burn scar, fire activity should decrease as the brush is fairly immature (6 years old). Live fuel moisture is low, but spread probably would originate from jackpots of fuel, downed logs from previous fire, and make short runs.



## General Safety Concerns:

- Driving: Narrow roads, others driving faster than we do. HEADS UP!!!
- Transition Day: Ensure all know the plan, take extra time for briefings.
- Big trees come from big stumps- watch out for monster stump holes.
- All trees can be dangerous. They don't have to be leaning, dead, burned, or gnarley. Perform adequate assessments, minimize exposure and risk around all trees.
- Thunderstorm predictions: Use the IRPG pg 21 guidelines, don't stay on the "Big Ridge"- seek the best safe refuge in the vehicles at the trailhead.
- Wildlife: Deer are very common, and move quickly and unexpectedly. Use caution driving during the early morning and evening hours.

## **"SEE IT.....SAY IT!"**

If you see a hazard or a dangerous situation developing,  
tell your supervisor and those around you.

## **Make a Safety Difference**

- As a supervisor, provide constant and relentless oversight.
- **Stay focused on the task at hand, all the time!**
- Come up with a safer way to perform a risky assignment.
- Discuss the near miss.
- Never tolerate "hey, watch this".
- Discuss the effects of fatigue, and mitigate the effects of fatigue.
- While in the fire zone, wear your hat when you leave the vehicle.
- Have a purpose in what you do.
- Don't trust other drivers!

## **Dehydration—Did you know...Its important at night also...hydrate.**

1. Caffeine speeds up loss of fluids in your body (limit coffee and cola intake)
2. Thirst always underestimates fluid needs (drink before you feel thirsty)
3. Potassium-rich foods help greatly (add bananas, citrus, tomato juice to your diet)
4. Signs of possible dehydration include rapid heart rate, weakness, excessive fatigue, dizziness, painful urination and dark colored urine
5. Avoid energy drinks.

## Medivac Sites


### If air or ground ambulance is DELAYED:

Package and transport patient to rendezvous with Ambulance. Re-route EMS helicopter to rendezvous point as appropriate.

### If Declaring an "Incident within the Incident"

The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response. The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.



## **STRESS REMINDERS**

- **Don't ignore your stress. Take action.**
- **Stay in touch with team members and communicate**
- **Talk and share feelings**

**Stress is normal and everyone has it. Dangerous occupations like firefighting have additional stress. Learn to deal with it.**
