5. General Control Objectives for the Incident (include alternatives)

MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES:

- Provide for firefighter and public safety by utilizing the risk management process.
- Minimize damage to natural and cultural resources by using resource advisors and cultural resource specialists.
- Protect and minimize fire effects to residential structures, communities, infrastructure, private property and timber lands.
- Provide timely and accurate fire information to key stakeholders, the public, and cooperators.
- Support and coordinate initial attack within the TFR.
- Manage costs commensurate with values at risk.
- Assess and implement suppression repair.

CONTROL OBJECTIVES:

- Hold fire within existing containment lines and keep fire:
 - South of the O'Neil Ridge west to Seiad Creek
 - East of Independence Creek
 - West of Scott River and Baldy Lookout South to Scott Bar Mountains
 - North of a line East from the North Fork Camp through Anthony Milne Camp to Man Eaten Lake

6. General Weather

- Winds should be strongest in the morning then easing at some point in the afternoon.
- Ridgetop 17-22 mph, gusts 30 mph; easing to 4-9 mph with gusts 20 mph.

7. General Safety Message

- Ensure that every mission has a purpose, and that the potential gains of all tactical operations are commensurate with the risks involved.

8. Resource Protection Guidelines

- Use MIST to minimize impacts to wilderness characteristics.
- Avoid aerial retardant within 300 feet of wet areas and in areas with threatened, endangered, proposed, candidate or sensitive species
- Use screens on all drafting equipment.
- Track and map daily all tactical burning operations and turn into DIVS/ SIT unit.



*** Continued Gusty Winds Today ***

Weather Discussion: Another day of gusty winds as an upper trough moves toward the coast. Winds should be strongest in the morning then easing at some point in the afternoon. These winds should help push any smoke columns over once again. The upper trough moves over the area Wednesday and Wednesday night bringing light rain to the incident area. Expect around 0.12 inches of rain ending Wednesday night. Expect showers will remain in the area Thursday for 0.03 to 0.07 inches additional rain. A ridge builds over the area for the weekend and into early next week for a return to warm and dry weather.



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: (Please see attached fire weather forecast)

High Temperature: 85-92° **Minimum temperature:** 52-55 °

Minimum RH: 17-22% **Maximum RH:** 72-77%

Winds (20'): Day, ridges south to southwest 17-22 mph with gusts to 30 mph. After 1200 easing to 4-9 with gusts to 20. Night, ridges southwest 4-9 with gusts 15-18. Shifting south 8-12 with gusts to 20 around 2300.

GENERAL:

POI: 50-80% **Predicted ERC:** 86 **Predicted BI:** 81 **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80-100% (100% at higher elevations)

The persistent warm and dry trend will continue again today. Localized pockets of smoke in the canyon bottoms will shade fuels and decrease fire behavior until smoke lifts. In the morning backing and surface fire movement in the southerly direction will be possible with predicted south winds. Afternoon as the wind shifts to the southwest fire activity is likely to increase where topography slope and fuels align. Increased rates of surface fire spread, isolated and group torching, and short crown runs will still be possible. Spotting up to a mile may occur with torching and rolling debris still has the potential to cause spotting. In underburned areas accumulations of freshly fallen needle and leaves have the potential to support surface fire spread in areas that were previously considered secure.

Night Shift Personnel: Fuels will continue to burnout within the fire perimeter. The only major fire growth anticipated will be in Division O and N. Low RH recovery on the ridgetops will enable residual fuels to consume.

SPECIFIC:

Branch: I, II, III, and V: Minimal fire behavior anticipated, rolling material across the line and fire creeping through freshly fallen needle and leaf litter still has the potential to compromise the secure fire perimeter.

Branch IV: Fire will continue to move south and southeast further into Toms Valley Ck, and Rainy Valley Ck. pushed by local upslope/upcanyon winds. Fire will also move upslope to the east towards H40 and could come into alignment with southwest-west ridgetop winds in the afternoon. If fire transitions into the canopies long range spotting to the east-northeast over the ridge is likely (+ - 1mi). Fire is currently burning in timber stringers. As fire moves into the Panther Fire burn scar, fire activity should decrease as the brush is fairly immature (6 years old). Live fuel moisture is low, but spread probably would originate from jackpots of fuel, downed logs from previous fire, and make short runs.

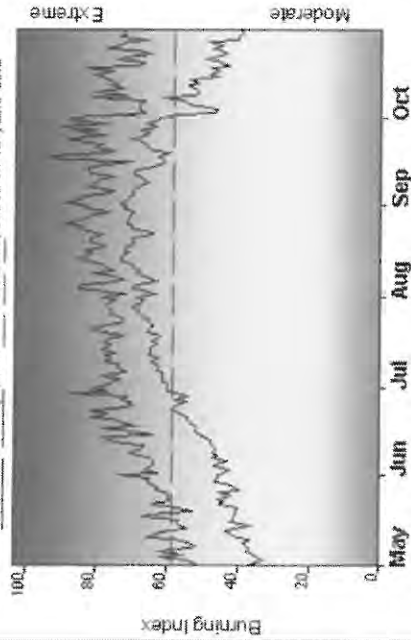

Local Thresholds - Watch out:

Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior:
 20+ Wind Speed over 4 mph, RH less than 40%,
 Temperature over 75, 1000-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 13

Remember what Fire Danger tells you:

- ✓ Burning Index gives day-to-day fluctuations calculated from 2 pm temperature, humidity, wind, daily temperature & rh ranges, and precip duration.
- ✓ Wind is part of BI calculation.
- ✓ Watch local conditions and variations across the landscape -- Fuel, Weather, Topography.
- ✓ Listen to weather forecasts -- especially WIND.

Past Experience:

Large fires (>50ac) occur more frequently when BI exceed 40. Fires 40 acres and larger can readily increase in complexity
 Multiple lightning ignitions can overwhelm suppression resources. 2008 was an active fire year. 2010 was quiet.

GENERAL SAFETY CONCERNS

- ❖ **DRIVING-** Narrow roads: Slow down, watch for wildlife and civilians.
- ❖ **Wildlife-** Encountering rattle snakes, bees and other wildlife is possible.
- ❖ **Stump Holes-** Beware of stump holes.
- ❖ **Dehydration:** Stay healthy, stay hydrated.
- ❖ **Footing-** Lots of steep and unstable terrain.

Fire Order of the Day – Remain in Communication With Crew Members

- **Driving-** Predictable is preventable. Speeding=Accident. Slow down and keep an eye out for wildlife and civilians.
- **Wildlife-** Rattlesnakes have been observed in the Kelsey Creek area. Bees continue to be an issue. Avoid when possible and know the Medical Plan (ICS 206) in the event of an incident.
- **Stump Holes-** Lots of stump holes are out there. Use your tools to probe in front as you walk.
- **DEHYDRATION** - It can take its toll. Drink lots of **WATER**. Strive to drink 2 quarts per hour during heavy exertion.
- **FOOTING-** Lots of steep and unstable terrain. Please take extra time and care out there.

Common Denominators of Fire Behavior On Tragedy Fires

- *Most incidents happen on the smaller fires or on isolated portions of larger fires.
- *Most fires are innocent in appearance before the “flare-ups” or “blow-ups”. In some cases, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.
- *Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels.
- *Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, chutes and on steep slopes.
- *Some suppression tools, such as helicopters or air tankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and air tankers have been known to cause flare-ups.

WORK REST CYCLE

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET a 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don’t exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hrs shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person’s responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

OPERATIONAL SHIFTS

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

DUTY STATUS

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, and/or be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed **at least 8 hours** of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

Personnel time will be reported to the Time Unit and daily once they are signed by the next level supervisor. Local Government Resources hired under CFAA or Local Agreement w/Forest are also required to submit a Crew Time Report daily. OES resources will be monitored by OES Agency Rep (if assigned) for 2/1 Work Rest compliance. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

Private Contracted Equipment time must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily.

Supervisor’s - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). **Until the fire is controlled**, personnel on the fireline **MAY BE** compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel **after control** of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. **If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation. Kitchen closes at 2200 so dinner break is to be shown unless justified as to why you weren’t able to eat dinner.**

1. Waterbars or dips will be constructed on all firelines where surface erosion is a concern according to the fireline waterbar specifications (see below).
2. Do not pull back slash onto containment lines. Pull back slash only on contingency lines or lines inside the burn. Pull back slash to achieve 50% ground cover.
3. Large woody material and stumps shall be piled or used to block access. **Outside of Wilderness:** Consider bucking whole trees or logs to reduce the length and size if they may pose a hazard to operators re-opening lines for future wildfires.
4. Where practical, dozer berms and handline trenches should be pulled back to the natural contour of the slope to reduce channeling water erosion.
5. Where dozers pushed soil or debris into drainages remove it from the channel and place above the slope break to the stream.
6. Where accessible by roads, dozer lines and hand lines will be blocked with berms to prevent motorized access.

In Wilderness

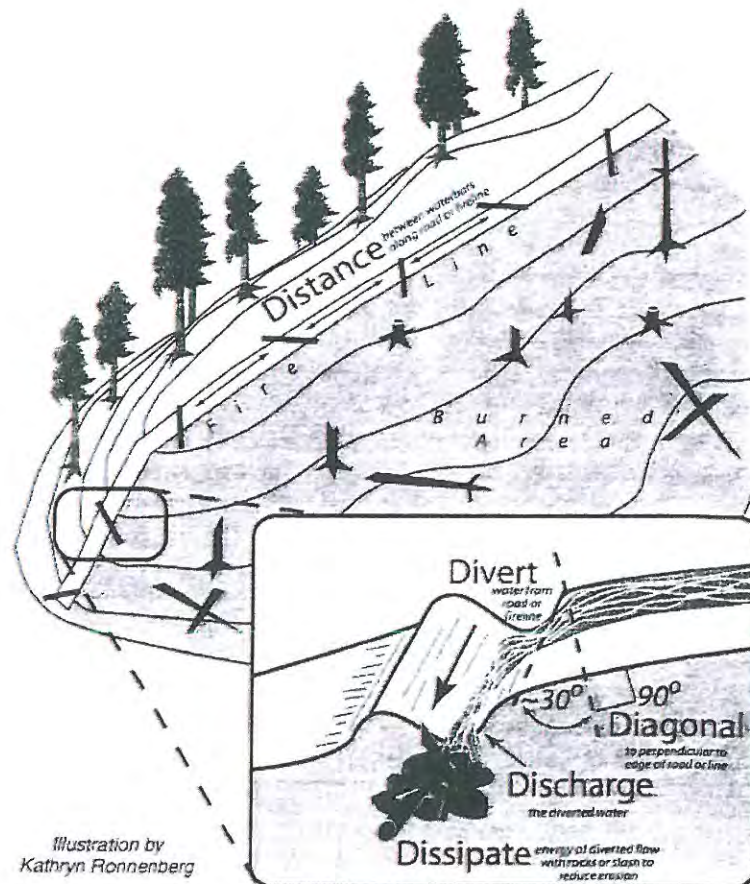
1. Flush cut all stumps created as a result of fire suppression. Dig around stumps if necessary to allow for easier and lower flush cutting. Place duff and soil on stump after cutting. Remove cut material from view of trails or campsites.
2. **DO NOT** cross hatch, waffle cut, or otherwise texture or score stumps or log ends.
3. Only remove hazard trees that are a threat to firefighter safety. **DO NOT** cut trees/snags that may become a potential “hazard” in the future.

Fireline Waterbar Specifications

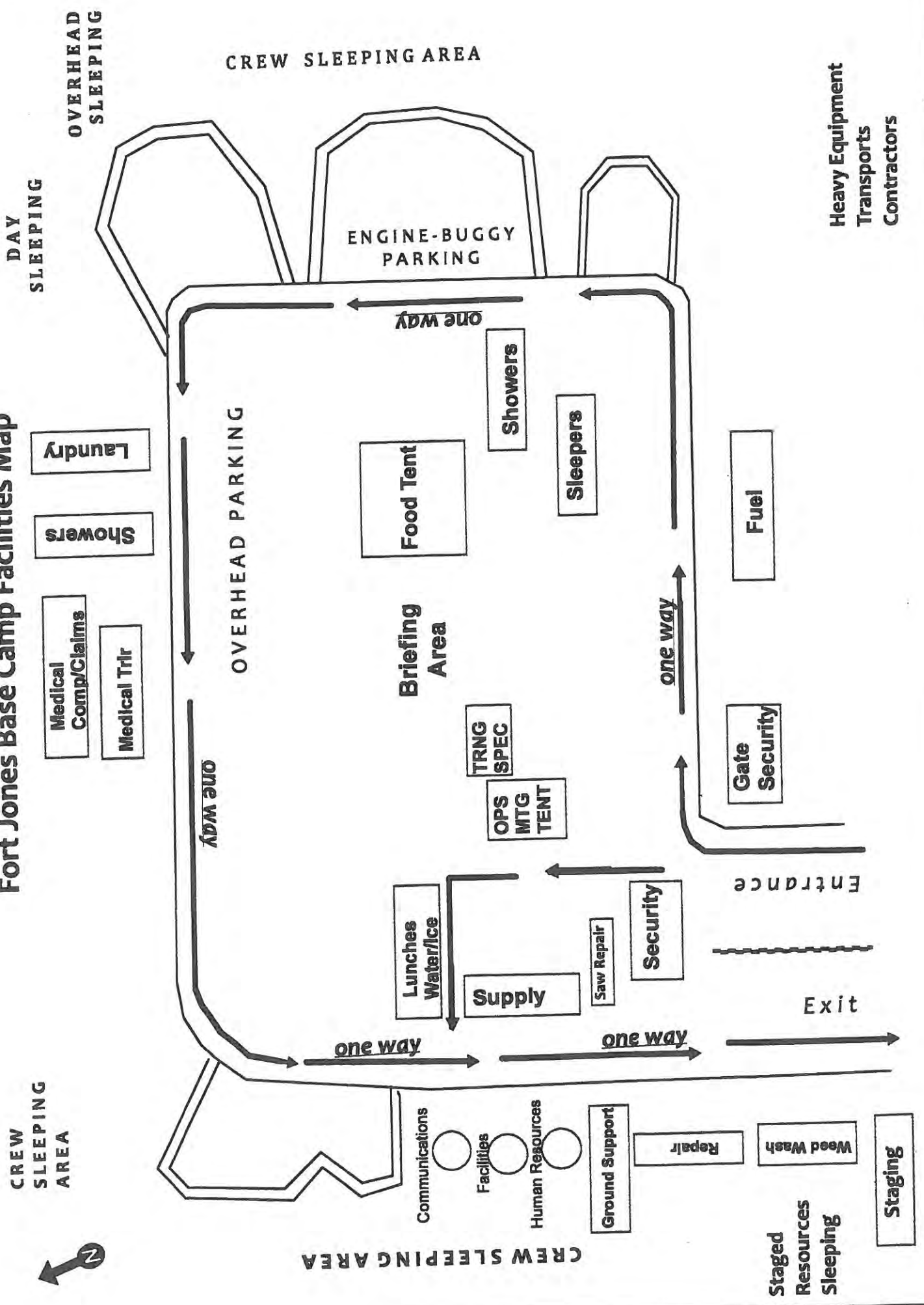
Recommended spacing for waterbars on dozer and hand lines. Spacing may be adjusted to fit local terrain.

| Slope of Fireline | Waterbar Spacing (feet) |
|-------------------|-------------------------|
| 1% - 9% | 100 |
| 10% - 19% | 75 |
| 20% - 39% | 50 |
| >40% | 25 |

Water bars should be constructed at least 30 degrees perpendicular to the fireline. Angle waterbars away from the black to divert water into the green. Take advantage of natural dips or drainages to divert water onto vegetation, rocks, and slash.
