

**Weather Discussion:** An upper trough moves over the area through early Friday. A cold front crosses the area later tonight with the bulk of rain beginning later this afternoon and continuing tonight. Several hours of light rain will blanket the area followed by showers behind the front most of Thursday. Total rain amounts likely less than 0.25 inches over the 36-hour period with the bulk occurring Wednesday night. A ridge builds over the area for the weekend and into early next week for a return to warmer and drier weather. A thermal trough will build up the coast by Sunday for a return of dry east winds to offset any gains from the rain.



### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** (Please see attached fire weather forecast)

**High Temperature:** 84-88 ° **Minimum temperature:** 49-54 °

**Minimum RH:** 22-27% **Maximum RH:** 71-77%

**Winds (20'):** Day, ridges south 9-13 mph with gusts to 25 Night, ridges south to southwest 4-9 with gusts 15-18.

### GENERAL:

**POI:** 40-70% **Predicted ERC:** 81 **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80-100% (100% at higher elevations)

With predicted cloud cover, slightly cooler temperatures and higher humidity fire behavior should decrease from what we have experienced over the past few days. Direct surface heating will be minimized with the cloud cover. Fire activity should be limited to surface fire spread. Anticipate creeping, backing, and flanking surface fire. Jackpots of fuel may exhibit more intensity but the increased activity will be limited to heavier concentrations of fuels. Spotting could occur where jackpots push fire into the canopy but sustained canopy consumption should be minimal. Spotting distances will also be reduced as embers will not receive as much convective lift. Rolling material from upper slopes still has the potential to cross control features down slope. Probability of Ignition will also be lower today.

### Night Shift Personnel:

Night fire behavior should be further reduced due to lower temperatures and higher humidity.

### SPECIFIC:

**All Branches:** Rolling material and fire creeping through freshly fallen needle litter and leaf litter will have the greatest potential to escape previously secure areas.

### AIR OPERATIONS

Cloud cover could limit air operations throughout the day.

### SAFETY

Keep your guard up and don't become complacent with the temporary change in fire behavior.

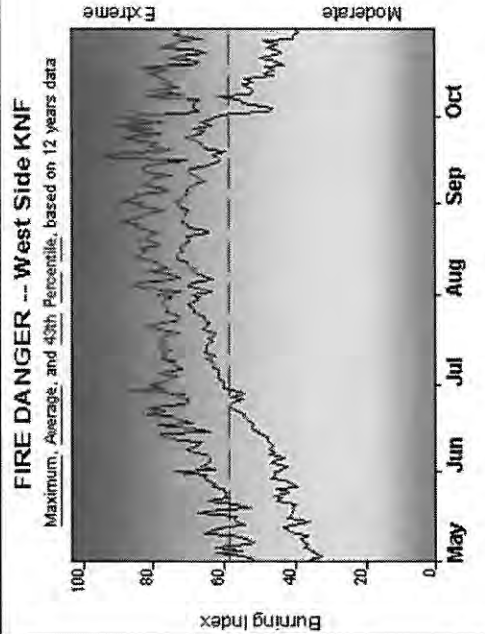

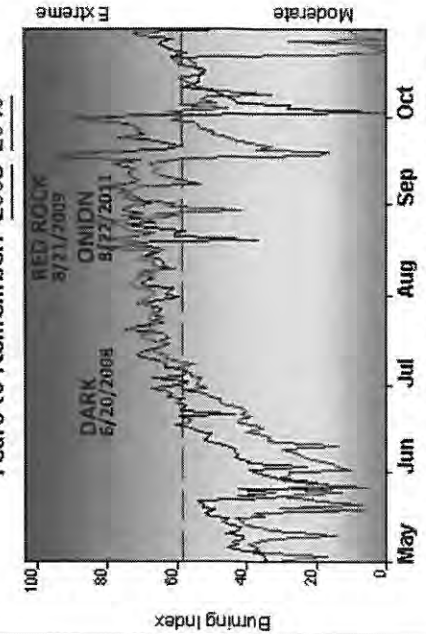


Maximum -- Highest Burning Index by day for 2000 - 2011

 43th Percentile -- Only 43% of the 2204 days from 2000 - 2011 had an Burning Index below 58

**Local Thresholds - Watch out:** Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior:  
 20' Wind Speed over 4 mph, RH less than 40%,  
 Temperature over 75, 1000-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 13

**Remember what Fire Danger tells you:**

- ✓ Burning Index gives day-to-day fluctuations calculated from 2 pm temperature, humidity, wind, daily temperature & rh ranges, and precip duration.
- ✓ Wind is part of BI calculation.
- ✓ Watch local conditions and variations across the landscape -- Fuel, Weather, Topography.
- ✓ Listen to weather forecasts -- especially WIND.

**Past Experience:**

Large fires (>50ac) occur more frequently when BI exceed 58. Fires 50 acres and larger can readily increase in complexity  
 Multiple lightning ignitions can overwhelm suppression resources. 2008 was an active fire year. 2010 was quiet.  
 Sawyers Bar, Somes Bar, Slater Butte, Blue Ridge, Oak Knoll, Slater Butte, Collins Baldy, Quartz Hill, Callahan #2, and Dutch-Indy RAMPIS data was used.

- Treat “hot spots” on feet before they become blisters.

## Fatigue/Smoke Effects

- Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.
- Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio.

- Avoid working in heavy inversions for prolonged periods if possible. Take occasional breaks in clear air to mitigate build up of CO, and CO2.

## Driving

- When driving keep speed at or **below** the posted speed limit and your headlights on.
- **Stay as far to the right of the road as is safely possible.**
- Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve.
- Watch for and anticipate civilian traffic.
- Watch out for debris and wildlife on the roads.
- Don't tail gate.
- Always fasten your seat belt before the vehicle is set into motion.
- Reduce speeds on wet surfaces.

**16 HOURS IS NOT A GUARANTEE – IT IS HOURS WORKED!!**

**WORK REST CYCLE**

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET a 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don’t exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hrs shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person’s responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

**OPERATIONAL SHIFTS**

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

**DUTY STATUS**

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, and/or be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed **at least 8 hours** of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

**PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING**

Personnel time will be reported to the Time Unit and daily once they are signed by the next level supervisor. Local Government Resources hired under CFAA or Local Agreement w/Forest are also required to submit a Crew Time Report daily. OES resources will be monitored by OES Agency Rep (if assigned) for 2/1 Work Rest compliance. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

Private Contracted Equipment time must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily.

Supervisor’s - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

**MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS**

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). **Until the fire is controlled**, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel **after control** of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. **If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation. Kitchen closes at 2200 so dinner break is to be shown unless justified as to why you weren’t able to eat dinner.**

# Dozer and Hand Line Repair

## Happy Complex

### 9/16/2014

1. Waterbars or dips will be constructed on all firelines where surface erosion is a concern according to the fireline waterbar specifications (see below).
2. Do not pull back slash onto containment lines. Pull back slash only on contingency lines or lines inside the burn. Pull back slash to achieve 50% ground cover.
3. Large woody material and stumps shall be piled or used to block access. **Outside of Wilderness:** Consider bucking whole trees or logs to reduce the length and size if they may pose a hazard to operators re-opening lines for future wildfires.
4. Where practical, dozer berms and handline trenches should be pulled back to the natural contour of the slope to reduce channeling water erosion.
5. Where dozers pushed soil or debris into drainages remove it from the channel and place above the slope break to the stream.
6. Where accessible by roads, dozer lines and hand lines will be blocked with berms to prevent motorized access.

## In Wilderness

1. Flush cut all stumps created as a result of fire suppression. Dig around stumps if necessary to allow for easier and lower flush cutting. Place duff and soil on stump after cutting. Remove cut material from view of trails or campsites.
2. **DO NOT** cross hatch, waffle cut, or otherwise texture or score stumps or log ends.
3. Only remove hazard trees that are a threat to firefighter safety. **DO NOT** cut trees/snags that may become a potential "hazard" in the future.

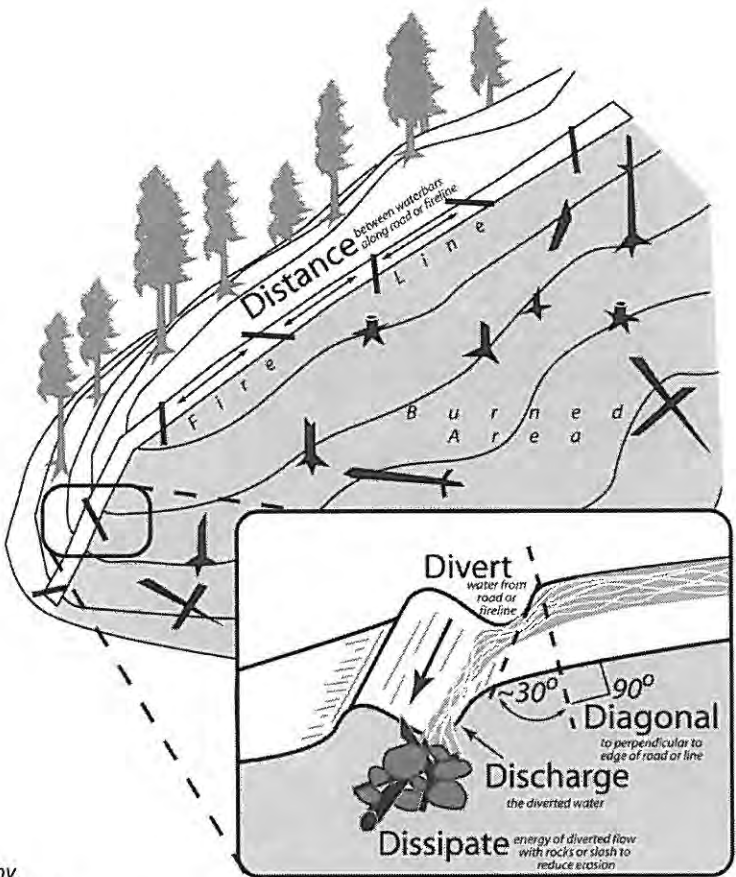
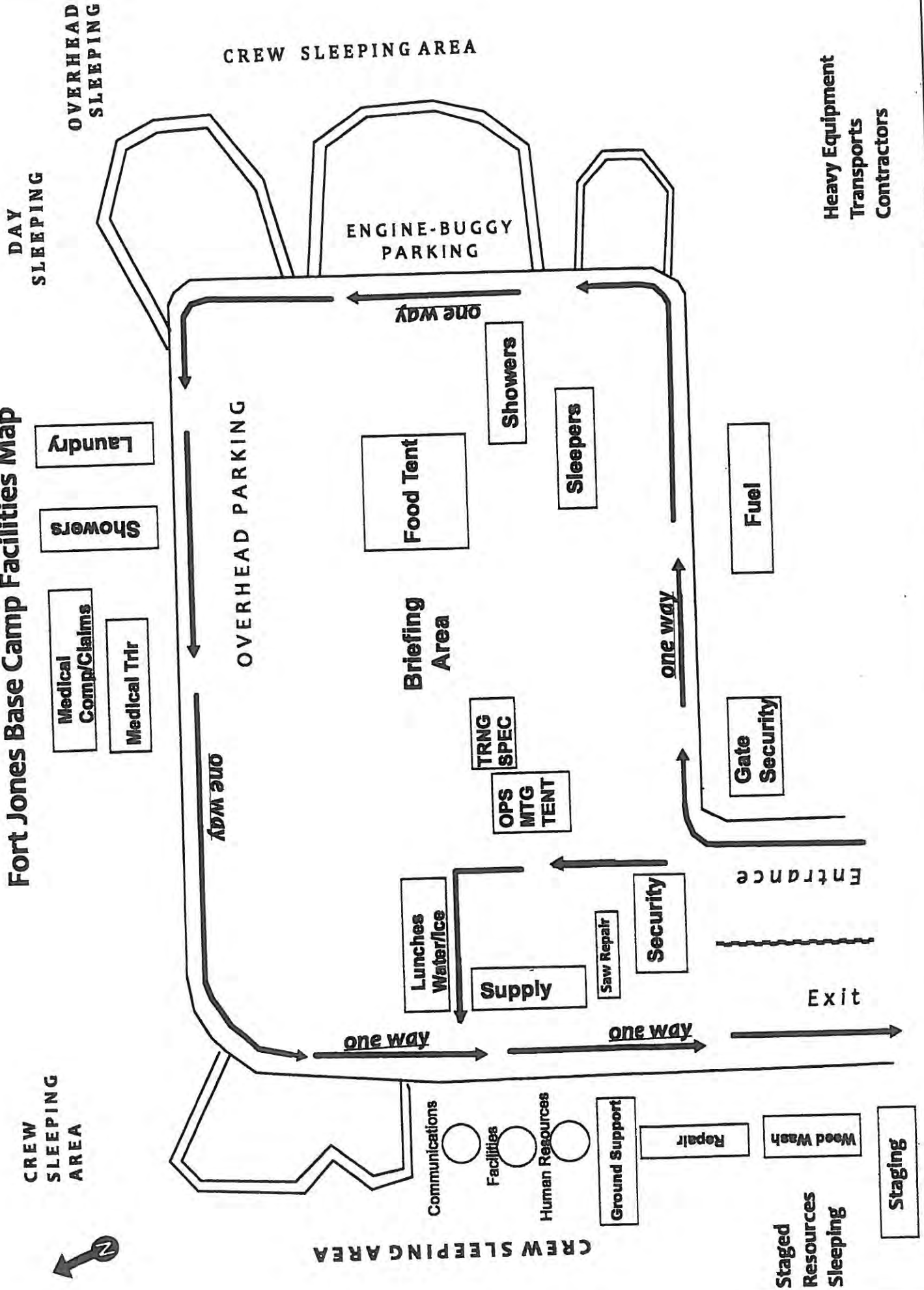


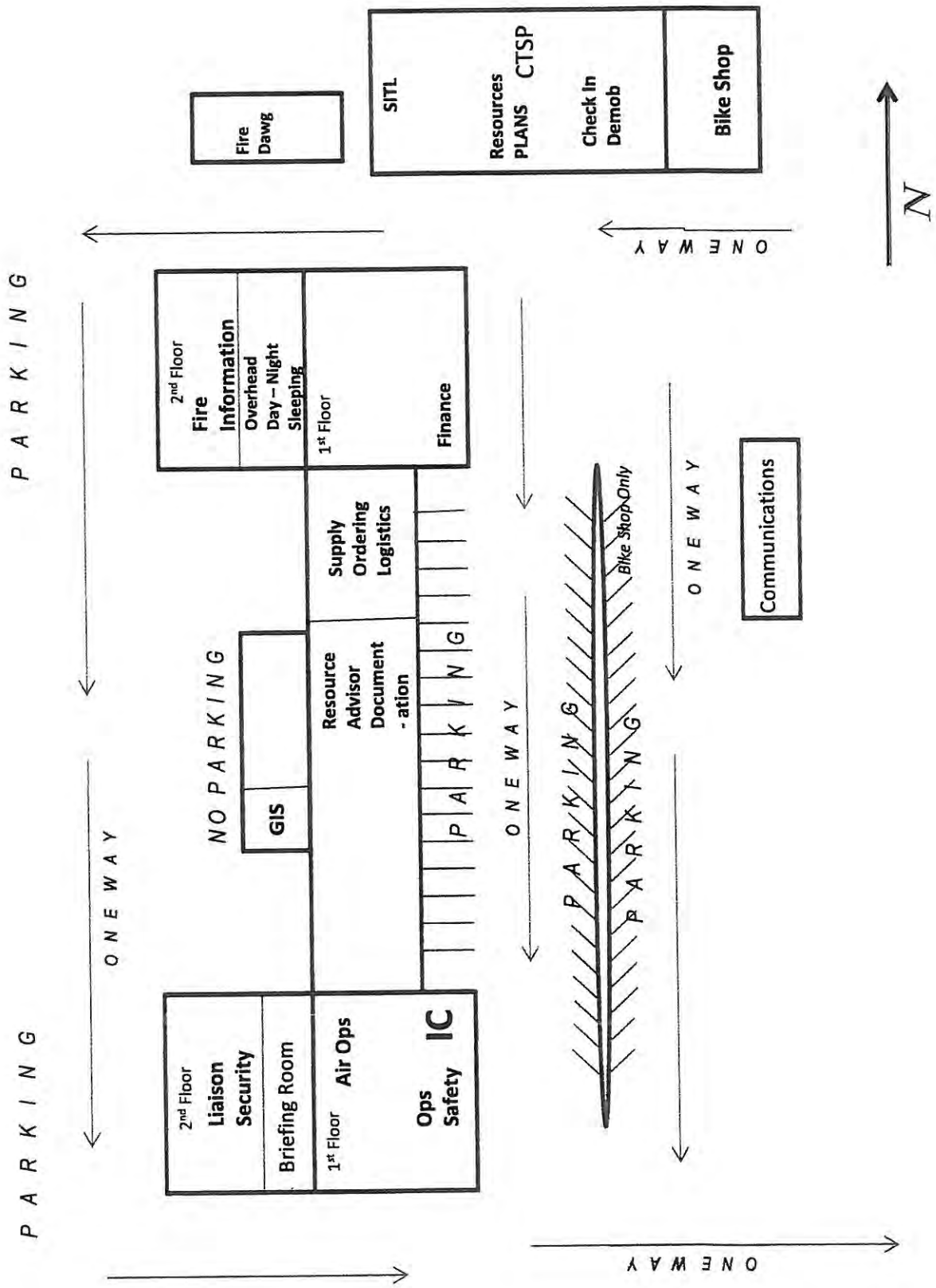
