#### MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES:

- Provide for the safety of all responders and the public by utilizing nationally recognized risk management principles.
- Maintain and enhance community and stakeholder relationships through accurate and timely dissemination of incident information, community and stakeholder meetings.
- Minimize damage to natural and cultural resources by using resource advisors and cultural resource specialists.
- Protect and minimize fire effects to residential structures, communities, infrastructure, private property and timber lands.
- Support and coordinate initial attack within the Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR).
- Manage costs commensurate with values at risk.
- Assess and implement suppression repair.

#### **CONTROL OBJECTIVES:**

Hold fire within existing containment lines and keep fire:

- South of the O'Neil Ridge west to Seiad Creek
- East of Independence Creek
- West of Scott River and Baldy Lookout South to Scott Bar Mountains
- North of the line East from the North Fork Camp through Anthony Milne Camp to Man Eaten Lake

#### 6. General Weather

- Weather Forecast for Monday: Partly cloudy. Smoke during the day.
- Weather Forecast for Monday Night: Partly cloudy. Smoke filtering through the canyons overnight.

#### 7. General Safety Message

Use caution while driving on all incident roads. Expect more traffic on Scott River Road.

#### 8 Resource Protection Guidelines

- Use MIST to preserve wilderness characteristics.
- Avoid aerial retardant within 300 feet of wet areas and in areas with threatened, endangered, proposed, candidate or sensitive species
- Use screens on all drafting equipment.
- Track and map daily, all tactical burning operations and turn into DIVS/ SIT unit.

<u>Weather Discussion:</u> An upper low along with the ridge over the Pacific Northwest continue to move out of the area to the east. This will allow for a couple more days of dry weather before a strong cold front moves over the area on Wednesday. Expect a trend of decreasing max temperatures and increasing gusty southwest winds from Monday through Wednesday. Numerous showers are expected Wednesday into Thursday. A chance for rain will remain for Friday and Saturday.

**INPUTS** 

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** <u>Daytime:</u> Partly cloudy with instability. Temps: around 65°-85° depending on elevation. RH: Lower elevations = around 22% Higher elevations = around 33%. Winds (20 foot) = Southwest 8- 14 mph with gusts to 25 at the ridgelines.

Nighttime: Clear with some smokey conditions ... Temps: around 50°.

RH: = around 50% - 65% ....Winds (20 foot) = Southwest 16 mph with gusts to 25...Variable light winds 1-4 mph in the slope/valleys and drainages.

ERC= 70 Today...below the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile.....Yet Today is a High Fire Danger Day!! Local Thresholds are being met today for fire activity to increase.

#### **GENERAL:**

The fire is burning in grass, shrub and intermix timber. Fuel specifics are Ceanothus, Manzanita, Mixed Pine, Cedar and Douglas Fir. Live Fuel Moisture = Timber 125% ...... Shrub 80% (old growth).

The fire to date has been primarily topography driven. The predominant factor of fire spread has been consistently surface fire spread backing, flanking transitioning to headfire alignment. Occasional torching has developed with isolated crownfire runs with slope alignment.. Low dead fuel moisture contents are the driver behind continuous fuel consumption. Past significant runs were with slope and or wind alignment contributing to headfire runs and spotting. Sustained crown fire runs were dependent upon the surface fire and moderate instability.

Routine Rates of spread: headfire = 3-8ch/hr with backing 1-3 ch/hr.

When critical fire weather and fine fuel variables are met anticipate 25-40 ch/hr with headfire with crown involvement.

#### SPECIFIC:

**Branch I and IV**: Due to excellent handline construction and mop-up standards no progression anticipated. Interior torching and flare ups may materialize due to a jackpot.

#### Branch VI:

**Division Z:** No fire growth anticipated .. Interior jackpots and torching will continue with interior consumption.

**Division A:** Backing and flanking fire will continue with fire moving slow to steady. Today is dry with strong winds and will increase fire activity in exposed areas. Spotting has the potential to be up to ½ mile with wind. The fire has the possibility to cross Wooley Creek with embers aloft and rolling material. The fire can realign and run with headfire. Once established the fire has the potential to extend to Hell Hole, Big Meadow Creek and to the Salmon /Scott ridgeline to the division Z break to the East... Due to slope and wind alignment\*\*\* Heads up after 1500 hrs to 1800 hrs in this division...

#### AIR OPERATIONS

May be limited due to smoke impacts at times.

#### **SAFETY**

Today is a day of change in fire behavior anticipate activity to increase.

Larger dead and down fuels are driving this fire. Identify when your fuel type changes and wind exposure.

Identify when your fire has the ability re-position itself to run upslope with headfire.

Monitor fire activity when a well developed column is developed.... instability exists today.

Validate your reaction time to reposition your crew to a safe location.



- Avoid underslung line when possible.

Use a tent, and keep it zipped up. Shake out your sleeping bag before using it, and check under the mattress or foam pads as Black Widow Spiders like dark spaces. Also check under any other gear stored in the tent. It is also best not to leave any gear outside the tent overnight.

#### **Spider Precautions During Demob:**

Use caution while tearing down the tent as spiders like the space between the tent and the fly, and the area under the tent and ground cloth. You should also visually inspect any other gear bags stored in the tent.

#### **Suspected Bites:**

The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

## STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES—FINANCE SECTION "How to Earn an Honest Day's Pay for an Honest Day's Work" 16 HOURS IS NOT A GUARANTEE – IT IS HOURS WORKED!!

#### **WORK REST CYCLE**

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET a 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don't exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hrs shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person's responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

#### **OPERATIONAL SHIFTS**

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

#### **DUTY STATUS**

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, <u>and/or</u> be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed **at least 8 hours** of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

#### PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

<u>Personnel time</u> will be reported to the Time Unit and daily once they are signed by the next level supervisor. Local Government Resources hired under CFAA or Local Agreement w/Forest are also required to submit a Crew Time Report daily. OES resources will be monitored by OES Agency Rep (if assigned) for 2/1 Work Rest compliance. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

Private Contracted Equipment time must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily.

Supervisor's - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

#### MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). Until the fire is controlled, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation. Kitchen closes at 2200 so dinner break is to be shown unless justified as to why you weren't able to eat dinner.

#### CHANGE IN WEED WASH DIRECTION

The Weed Wash Station will remain in operation at Fort Jones Base Camp, although it is relocated to the new Ground Support Inspection Road.

New criteria for washing equipment:

- Masticators
- > Chippers
- Dozers
- > ATV's
- > Engines
- Water Tenders
- > Lowboys, etc.



Any equipment or vehicle that has left an <u>established road surface</u>, whether that surface was paved, gravel, or dirt, should be cleaned of debris that may harbor noxious weed seeds or parts.

#### **Dozer and Hand Line Repair**

- 1. Waterbars or dips will be constructed on all firelines where surface erosion is a concern according to the fireline waterbar specifications (see below).
- 2. Do not pull back slash onto containment lines. Pull back slash only on contingency lines or lines inside the burn. Pull back slash to achieve 50% ground cover.
- 3. Large woody material and stumps shall be piled or used to block access. **Outside of Wilderness**: Consider bucking whole trees or logs to reduce the length and size if they may pose a hazard to operators re-opening lines for future wildfires.
- 4. Where practical, dozer berms and handline trenches should be pulled back to the natural contour of the slope to reduce channeling water erosion.
- 5. Where dozers pushed soil or debris into drainages remove it from the channel and place above the slope break to the stream.
- 6. Where accessible by roads, dozer lines and hand lines will be blocked with berms to prevent motorized access.

#### In Wilderness


- 1. Flush cut all stumps created as a result of fire suppression. Dig around stumps if necessary to allow for easier and lower flush cutting. Place duff and soil on stump after cutting. Remove cut material from view of trails or campsites.
- 2. **DO NOT** cross hatch, waffle cut, or otherwise texture or score stumps or log ends.
- 3. Only remove hazard trees that are a threat to firefighter safety. **DO NOT** cut trees/snags that may become a potential "hazard" in the future.


#### **Fireline Waterbar Specifications**

Recommended spacing for waterbars on dozer and hand lines. Spacing may be adjusted to fit local terrain.

Slope of Fireline	Waterbar Spacing
	(feet)
1% - 9%	100
10% - 19%	75
20% - 39%	50
>40%	25

Water bars should be constructed at least 30 degrees perpendicular to the fireline. Angle waterbars away from the black to divert water into the green. Take advantage of natural dips or drainages to divert water onto vegetation, rocks, and slash.
