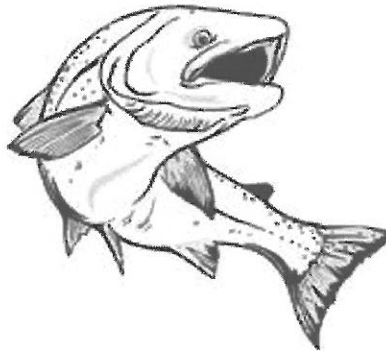



20 foot wind speeds are being used

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Thermal trough will sit over the incident this morning with fairly light winds. Smoke will make it difficult to get ground heating for the bulk of the morning. For the ridges and areas that do clear, continue to expect dry and moderately unstable conditions promoting column development. The thermal trough will drift east this evening and bring several hours of Northwest wind to the ridgetops. Moderate to poor humidity recoveries again tonight along the upper elevations. Somewhat of a repeat Monday afternoon. Winds look to become North Tuesday and back toward some form of East on Wednesday. No rain expected for the next several days.

Weather Forecast For Today (Sunday):

WEATHER: A mix of Sun and Smoke shadowed skies. Depends on where sun reaches the surface. South flank may have best chance at clearing. Some afternoon shallow cumulus in the area.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Valleys (1,200 ft) 90-95 °F, Ridges (5,000 ft) 75-80 °F

MIN HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 11-15%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 15-20%

WINDS (20 foot):

Lower Slope/Canyons – Variable winds 0-2 mph becoming terrain driven 3-7 mph in the afternoon.

Upper Slope/Ridgetop – Variable 0-5 mph becoming Northwest 5-8mph after 1500.

HAINES INDEX (High Level): 4 (stability=2; moisture=2)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderately unstable where sun breaks through with inversion lifting around 1200. Afternoon Mixing Height 11,000 feet MSL.

SMOKE TRANSPORT: South 8 mph becoming Northwest 8 mph around 1600.

Weather Forecast For Tonight (Sunday Night):

WEATHER: Smoke settling into valleys...otherwise mostly clear.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 55-65 F...upper slopes and ridges warmest.

MAX HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 70-80%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 25-30%

WINDS (20 foot):

Valleys – Variable becoming drainage 3-6 mph around 2100.

Ridgetop – West to Northwest 6-9 mph gusts to 15 mph becoming Variable 0-4 around 2300.

HAINES INDEX (High Level): 3 (stability=1; moisture=2)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Radiation inversions developing around sunset. Thermal belt around 4500 feet.



Fire behavior will be fuels and terrain driven with forecasted variable winds. Rolling hot debris, backing fire, isolated and group torching as well as short crown runs could be possible. Spotting up to a mile could occur with torching and ember travel downwind.

Night Shift Personnel: Fire behavior may be active on ridgetops and adjacent slopes as the night shift begins due to low RH recovery.

ROS of less than 5ch/hr and Flame lengths of 1 to 3 ft may develop. After 2300 RH recovery is likely to increase and may be favorable in reducing fire intensity particularly in the lower elevations and valley bottoms

SPECIFIC:

Division O: The slopover in Division I progressed to the south west yesterday, with variable winds be aware if slopes in the area heat up in the sun if the smoke lifts.

Division Q, T, Z, D, and F: Minimal fire activity is anticipated.

Division G and H: Isolated heat sources are still present; however minimal fire activity is anticipated.

Division J: Long range spotting is possible into Division J and possibly across Hwy 96 should torching and crowning develop in Division K.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke around the fire may hamper air operations

SAFETY

Ensure lookouts are well placed and are keyed into changes in the weather and increases in fire behavior.

When comparing the Cramer Fire and South Canyon fires, the fire behavior and fire environment, and human interactions with the fire, are nearly identical. Common features of both fires were:

- Located in steep, narrow canyons conducive to rapid, intense fire spread.
- This carried the fatal fire runs in continuous brush on northerly slopes.
- Persistent droughts for the previous several years; live fuel moistures, especially in brush, were critically low.
- Under-burned foliage in brush fuels, pre-disposing them to explosive fire spread.
- History of extreme fire behavior in that fuel type with a history of previous fatality fires.
- Predicted extreme fire behavior, but unexpected; personnel failed to recognize the fire's potential for high rates of spread and explosive growth. Crews in both cases generally didn't expect anything other than what they had seen in previous days.
- "Routine" operations right up to the point of the blowup.
- Neither fire had adequate lookouts posted at the time of the blowup.
- Weather on both fires had been persistently hot and dry, with the typical diurnal wind patterns each day.
- Critical weather information affecting the fire was not passed on to the firefighters on the scene.
- Safety zones were largely inadequate, and it did not appear the travel time to an adequate safety zone had been determined or discussed.
- Once each of the fires began their fatal runs upslope and up-canyon, the rate of spread easily outpaced the firefighters' ability to get out of harm's way.
- Two helitack personnel on each fire departed H-2 in the same direction of travel, and were overrun in almost exactly the same location relative to the canyon and the approaching fire front.
