


Column pushing over toward the Southeast This Afternoon and Evening

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Generally similar to Sunday except a little cooler with a slight tick up in humidity as the thermal trough will be east of the incident today. Another day of stubborn smoke and little column potential until perhaps early afternoon. For the ridges and areas that clear, continue to expect dry and moderately unstable conditions promoting column development. Northwest winds will be at their deepest today bringing the best potential to bend the column and test the Southeast flank of the fire. The thermal trough will drift east this evening and bring several hours of Northwest wind to the ridgetops. Moderate to poor humidity recoveries again tonight along the upper elevations. The thermal trough will be shunted South on Tuesday as a very weak and very dry upper trough crosses the area. Ridge winds look to become North Tuesday and East on Wednesday. No rain expected for the next several days.

Weather Forecast For Today (Monday):

WEATHER: A mix of Sun and Smoke shadowed skies. Some afternoon shallow cumulus in the area.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Valleys (1,200 ft) 87-92 °F, Ridges (5,000 ft) 75-80 °F

MIN HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 13-18%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 17-23%

WINDS (20 foot):

Lower Slope/Canyons – Variable winds 0-2 mph becoming terrain driven 3-7 mph in the afternoon. NW/SE aligned canyon speeds could reach 12 gust 20 mph after 1500.

Upper Slope/Ridgetop – Variable 0-5 mph becoming Northwest 8-12 gusts to 20 mph near 1400.

HAINES INDEX (High Level, afternoon): 4 (stability=2; moisture=2)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderately unstable where sun breaks through with inversion lifting 1200 to 1400. Afternoon Mixing Height 10,000 feet MSL.

SMOKE TRANSPORT: Variable/Light favoring Northeast becoming Northwest 12 mph around 1400.

Weather Forecast For Tonight (Monday Night):

WEATHER: Smoke settling into valleys...otherwise mostly clear.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 48-66 F...upper slopes and ridges warmest.

MAX HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 68-72%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 35-40%

WINDS (20 foot):

Valleys – Terrain Driven 4-8 mph becoming drainage 3-6 mph around 2100.

NW/SE aligned canyon speeds could reach 12 gust 20 mph until 2100.

Ridgetop – Northwest 8-12 gusts to 20 mph becoming Variable 0-4 around 2100.

HAINES INDEX (High Level, evening): 3 (stability=1; moisture=2)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Radiation inversions developing around sunset. Thermal belt around 4000 feet.


SMOKE TRANSPORT: Northwest 12 becoming variable 0-3 mph around 2300.

Outlook For Tuesday 9/9: Slightly cooler, moderately unstable. A few clouds. Max Temps: 78 to 88. Min RH: 14-25%. MaxRH: 34-71%. Ridge Wind: Light/Variable becoming West to Northwest around 9 mph in the afternoon. Haines 4 (s:1, m:3).

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: (Please see attached fire weather forecast)

High Temperature: 75-92° **Minimum temperature:** 48-66 °

Minimum RH: 13-23% **Maximum RH:** 35-40%

Winds (20'): Day, Ridges becoming northwest 8-12 mph gusts to 20 mph afternoon. Night, Ridges northwest 8-12 mph gusts to 20 mph becoming variable 0-4 around 2100.

GENERAL:

POI: 85% **Predicted ERC:** 83 **Predicted BI:** 88 **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80%

Smoke will shade the fire most of the day as it has the past two days limiting fire behavior until it lifts. Fire growth will continue to be fuels and topography driven with moderate potential for large fire growth. Rolling material, falling snags, torching and spotting will be and have been the mechanism for fire spread and will continue to test containment lines. As smoke lifts and the fuels become exposed to sunlight, the fire could become extremely active and large column growth is possible. Expect spot fires 1+ miles.

Night Shift Personnel: Fire behavior could be active tonight as the shift begins especially on ridge tops. Heavy smoke will settle in to the drainages tonight with favorable relative humidity recovery that will reduce fire behavior at the lower elevations and drainages. More favorable relative humidity on the ridgetops should decrease fire activity as it rises above 40%.

SPECIFIC:

Division O, Q, T, Z, D, F, G and H: Minimal fire behavior anticipated

Division J: Scattered heat still present throughout the Division with heat in one of the spots. Fire will continue to burn out throughout the shift.

Division K, L, R: Fire will continue to back down to Scott River Rd. Pay attention as fire backs into McGuffy Ck. as fire behavior could increase. This could result in a large column developing and leaning over Scott River drainage with the northwest ridgetop winds. Spotting could occur up to 1.5 miles. RH's. *ROS on a spot fire east of these Divisions could be 5-30 ch/r.*

Division S: Smoke cover in morning and early afternoon hours and higher RH should reduce residual fire activity from last night's firing operation. However if the smoke on the ridgetop lifts in the afternoon, northwest ridgetop winds could increase the potential for spotting over the line to the southeast.

Division M: Fire will continue to back off of Cayenne Ridge.

Division I: Fire will continue moving south and southeast towards Red Rock. There is the potential to spot to the southeast. *Rates of spread could be 1-12 ch/hr.*

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke cover could limit air operations throughout the day

SAFETY

Ensure lookouts are well placed and are keyed into changes in the weather and increases in fire behavior.

Hazards we face:

- Firing Operations
- Wildland Urban Interface
- Mop Up
- Night Driving
- Power Lines
- Hydration

Some possible mitigation could include:

- Continue to use good communication with Crews, Divisions, and Branch for direction on firing coordination of ignitions group.
- Resources working around structures must have escape routes and safety zones in place.
- Crews working mop up watch for weakened trees, burning stump holes and rolling material on steep terrain. There have been multiple burn injuries from stump holes in California this year.
- Night driving: best to use low beams in smoke. If stopped along a road way, turn off headlights, use parking lights or flashers. This will avoid blinding the on-coming vehicles.
- Always treat power lines as energized, watch for compromised power poles. Report all power line problems to your division.
- Continue to drink fluids in cooler weather and on night shift; don't fall behind in fluid replacements during your shift, the consequences could lead to getting sick.



- Medical Pre-Incident Planning:**
- Identify EMTs and Equipment imbedded in suppression recourses.
 - Review the Incident or Forest Emergency reporting procedures
 - Review the Incident's assigned Medical resources and their location. (note radio call sign)
 - Assure that all assigned supervisors have reviewed and understand the Medical Plan. (if none is available develop a quick plan before engaging)
- Arriving at work site:**
- Assess access and egress for medical ground units.
 - Assure that all resources can clearly articulate their location. (update as they move)
 - GPS potential Drop Points or Landing Zones.
 - Note weather changes and check on availability of air resources.
 - Pre-Position medical supplies

- During Response to a Medical Emergency:**
- Contact Communications and declare a **MEDICAL EMERGENCY!!**
 - Identify the Unit needing help and their location
 - Insure that LCES are maintained.
 - Obtain patient info and severity.
 - Develop a resource list
 - Initial care
 - Sustained care
 - Extrication/evacuation
 - Report the Emergency and request anticipated resources needs
 - Put two plans in place and start both plans clearly identifying the primary and backup plan to resources assigned.
- During the Evacuation (every 15 min.)**
- Reassess the treatment and the patient response (Are they getting better?) Do you have the right level of care?
 - Assess the evacuation plans progress and adjust as needed.
 - Assure that additional personnel are available for relief.
 - Up-date Comm/Disp of the progress of the rescue.

The following are some tips for a slow, safe withdrawal from fireline life.

- Your first evening at home, start a roaring fire in the fireplace, turn off all the lights, and read a comic book by flashlight. Partially shut the flue damper and have a little smoke back up into the house, enough that it stings your eyes a little bit.
- When it's time for bed, turn on all the lights in your room. Leave them on all night. Sprinkle some dirt and pine needles on your sheets. Put some rocks and your dirty socks beneath your pillow. When you get into bed, be sure you've still got your boots or shoes on. Wear the same clothes you've had on all day. If your bed is too comfortable, sleep in an old, dirty sleeping bag near the fireplace and/or as close to the kitchen as possible.
- Have a friend come over, have him use a bullhorn outside your bedroom all night, using phrases such as "will the crew boss from San Carlos #6 report to plans," "ground support report to the Logistics Chief immediately," and the perfunctory "Ops Chief to Communications ASAP." Have him blow into the bullhorn at least two times before making each announcement.
- Have a couple of people who don't know you and have not been in your house before, wander in between 2 and 3 a.m. with huge red packs, pull out their sleeping bags, and sleep on the floor. Have them leave a radio on, switched on to one of the incident's tac channels all night.
- Lock the bathroom door. Arrange to have a porta-potty placed in your driveway. Have it delivered full, after being used by at least a couple of hundred people. Make sure the latch on the door doesn't work. Have someone open the door a couple times while you are using it. Make sure the porta-potty is placed somewhere very dark, and forget to bring your flashlight when you use it.
- Ask the person who delivers your paper to honk the car horn for you as early as possible – preferably around 4 a.m.
- Acquire a taste for half melted 'energy bars', made mostly from sawdust.
- Wear a stuffed backpack all day at work; if it is too comfortable, put some rocks in it.
- At lunch time, take your sandwich outside in drop it in a flower bed. Retrieve it and stand beside a full garbage can while you eat it. Wash it down with a drink that's been in the car trunk all morning.
- Several times during the day, hit yourself in the shins with a hammer.
- During the day take a break by lying down in the dirt outside, if it is too comfortable, lay on a few rocks. Use your hard hat as a pillow by putting it in the crook of your neck, below the back of your head. It is preferable if you find a steep slope in the sun to lie down, steep enough that you have to plant your feet on some downhill boulders to keep from slipping down the slope.
