

MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES:

- -Provide for firefighter and public safety by utilizing the risk management process.
- -Minimize damage to natural and cultural resources by using resource advisers and cultural resource specialists.
- -Protect and minimize fire effects to residential structures, communities, infrastructure, private property and timber lands.
- -Provide timely and accurate fire information to key stakeholders, the public, and cooperators.
- -Support and coordinate initial attack within the TFR.
- -Manage costs commensurate with values at risk.

CONTROL OBJECTIVES:

-Hold fire within existing containment lines and keep fire:

South of the O'Neil Ridge west to Seiad Creek

East of Elk Creek

West of Scott River and Baldy Lookout South to Scott Bar Mtns

North and West of Box Camp Mtns.

6. General Weather

Smoke settling into valleys...otherwise mostly clear.

7. Resource Protection Guidelines

- -Use MIST to minimize impacts to wilderness characteristics.
- Avoid aerial retardant within 300 feet of wet areas and in areas with threatened, endangered, proposed, candidate or sensitive species.
- -Use screens on all drafting equipment.
- -Track and map daily all tactical burning operations and turn into DIVS/ SIT unit.

Another day with column pushing over toward the Southeast Afternoon and Evening

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Again a little cooler with a minimal increase in humidity. Expect stubborn smoke and little column potential until early afternoon. Continue to expect dry and moderately unstable conditions promoting column development. Northwest winds again have potential to bend the column and test the Southeast flank of the fire. Moderate humidity recoveries tonight along the upper elevations. Ridge winds look to become East on Wednesday as the thermal trough builds back up the coast. Variable winds and moderately unstable Thursday and Northwest winds Friday as it crosses the area. No rain expected for the next several days.

Weather Forecast For Today (Tuesday):

WEATHER: A mix of Sun and Smoke shadowed skies. Some afternoon shallow cumulus in the area.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Valleys (1,200 ft) 83-88 °F, Ridges (5,000 ft) 73-78 °F

MIN HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 20-24%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 25-30%

WINDS (20 foot):

Lower Slope/Canyons - Variable winds 0-2 mph becoming terrain driven 3-7 mph in the afternoon.

NW/SE aligned canyon speeds could reach 9 gust 15 mph after 1500.

Upper Slope/Ridgetop – Variable 0-5 mph becoming Northwest 10-13 gusts to 23 mph near 1400.

HAINES INDEX (High Level, afternoon): 4 (stability=2; moisture=3)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderately unstable where sun breaks through with inversion lifting 1200 to 1400.

Afternoon Mixing Height 11,000 feet MSL.

SMOKE TRANSPORT: North 3-6 mph becoming Northwest 15 mph around 1400.

Weather Forecast For Tonight (Tuesday Night):

WEATHER: Smoke settling into valleys...otherwise mostly clear.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 45-62 F...upper slopes and ridges warmest. MAX HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 68-72%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 35-40%

WINDS (20 foot):

Vallevs – Terrain Driven 4-8 mph becoming drainage 3-6 mph around 2100.

NW/SE aligned canyon speeds could reach 12 gust 23 mph until 2100.

Ridgetop -Northwest 11-14 gusts to 23 mph becoming Variable 0-4 around 2100.

HAINES INDEX (High Level, evening): 4 (stability=2; moisture=2)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Radiation inversions developing around sunset. Thermal belt around 4000 feet.

SMOKE TRANSPORT: Northwest 12 becoming variable 0-3 mph around 2300.

Outlook For Wednesday 9/10: Warming and drying. Weak afternoon instability. Max Temps: 83 to 94. Min RH: 8-15%. MaxRH: 25-66%. Ridge Wind: Northeast 4-7 mph becoming Southeast 6-10 mph in the afternoon through overnight. Haines 4 (s:1, m:2).

Winds (20'): Day, Ridges becoming northwest 10-13 mph gusts to 20 mph afternoon near 1400. Night, Ridges

northwest 8-12 mph gusts to 20 mph becoming variable 0-4 around 2100.

GENERAL:

POI: 60-80% Predicted ERC: 82 Predicted BI: 85 Live Fuel Moisture Brush: 80%

Smoke will shade the fire most of the day as it has the past three days limiting fire behavior until it lifts around 1500-1600. Fire growth will continue to be fuels and topography driven with potential for large fire growth. As smoke lifts and the fuels become exposed to sunlight, the fire could become extremely active including torching, and active crown fire especially when in alignment with the wind. Large column growth is possible. Expect spot fires 1+ mile.

Night Shift Personnel: Fire behavior could be active tonight as the shift begins especially on ridge tops. Heavy smoke will settle in to the drainages tonight with favorable relative humidity recovery that will reduce fire behavior at the lower elevations and drainages. More favorable relative humidity on the ridgetops should decrease fire activity as it rises above 40%.

SPECIFIC:

Division O, Q, T, Z, D, F, G,H, J: Minimal fire behavior anticipated

Division K: Ridgetop winds will mix with upcanyon /upvalley winds resulting in increased windspeed in the drainage this afternoon as the smoke clears. Watch for spotting again today to the southeast near DP-13.

Division L: Spotfires from yesterday near the northwest ¼ of section 28 are in alignment with the local winds and the ridgetop winds. If not secured by nightshift or early morning fire could continue to move southeast upslope. **ROS could be 5-35 ch/r**.

Division S and M: Northwest ridgetop winds could influence spotting to the southeast. As smoke clears, the spotfire southwest of DP-28 will be sheltered from the ridgetop wind. Local upslope/upvalley winds along with terrain and fuels will influence fire spread. Fire will continue to back off of Cayenne Ridge.

Division O and I: Fire will continue moving south and southeast towards Red Rock. There is the potential to spot to the southeast towards Packers Valley. *Rates of spread could be 1-25 ch/hr*.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke cover could limit air operations throughout the day

SAFETY

Due to the dynamic nature of fire behavior, intensity estimates are often times difficult to make with absolute certainty. It is imperative firefighters consider the worst case fire potential and build contingency actions into their plan to compensate for the unexpected.

Do not use non metered hydrants.

Personnel check-in and out when entering and exiting Divisions.

Use fish screens when drafting.

Identify fire line equipment using track sheet, turn into the Situation Unit daily.

Division Supervisors record all tactical burning, interior handlines, and dozer lines and turn into the Situation Unit at end of shift.

Weather Environment

- Clear air means increased fire behavior, don't get surprised.
- Drop in RHs and increase in winds will increase fire behavior, take weather and pass on to your crews and Div.
- Still hot, hydrate throughout the day, watch out for signs of dehydration in your folks catch it early.

Fireline / Structures:

- Mopping up around structures present lots of hazards, septic tanks, piles of junk that has burned, cars, paint, and garbage.
- Watch out for Power and Phone personnel repairing and inspecting fire damage to power lines and poles.
- Snags, check out your work area before beginning work.
- Suppression Rehab will continue around the fire mostly in the northern parts of the fire, watch for heavy equipment.

Transportation issues:

- Watch for kids and school buses, on Scott River road. Go slow through areas with homes, keep the speeds at 25 mph.
- Speed limit within the road closure on Scott River is 25mph.
- Remove debris off the roads, don't drive around it.
- Watch for firefighters on Scott River, especially in heavy smoke.
