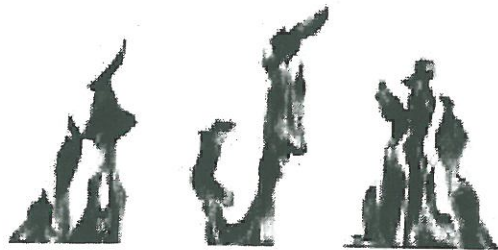

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A ridge of high pressure will build off the north coast of CA gradually shifting east over the fire area on Tuesday. This will bring a warming and drying trend through Friday...along with light east and northeast winds. Expect subtle changes each day in RH with the hottest and driest days being Tuesday and Wednesday. A thermal trough may migrate westward over the west coast which could enhance the easterly wind speeds during the middle of next week.

WEATHER FORECAST TODAY (MONDAY DAY SHIFT):

WEATHER: Smoke...inversions breaking around 1300 PDT on East Perimeter... 1500 West side.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Valleys (1,200 ft) 94 – 98 F, Ridges (4,000 ft) 81 – 86 F

MIN HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 13 – 17%, Ridges (4,000 ft) 16 – 21%

WINDS (EYE LEVEL):

Drainages – Up slope / up valley 2 – 4 mph.

Ridges – East and northeast 6 – 9 mph with gusts to 15 mph until 1000 PDT then diminishing to East and northeast 3 to 6 mph...and maybe light and variable at times through early evening.

LAL: 1 CWR: 0% HAINES: 3-4

STABILITY / INVERSION: Multiple Inversions lifting between 1300 and 1500 PDT.

SMOKE TRANSPORT: Northwest 10-15 mph.

WEATHER FORECAST MONDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Mostly clear, abundant smoke.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Sky: Mostly Sunny...Smoke clearing around 1600 ... Temps Max 90° Min 55°...RH Min 15-20% Max 50%

Daytime Winds...Valley: up slope/up valley 3-6mph...Ridge: NE 4-7mph G-15

Nighttime Winds...Valley: down slope/valley 0-3mph...Ridge: NE 3-6 G10

LAL 1... Haines 3...Inversion lifting between 1300-1500 setting back in at midnight

OUTPUTS

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

The fire environment will be under the influence of a strengthening high pressure system with stable conditions and little wind influence. Surface and ground fire will remain active under the inversion due to the prolonged drying of fuels and continued hot and dry weather. Backing and roll-out under the inversion will position heat into the bottom of drainages. Expect to see a noticeable difference in those areas when the inversions lift.

Local threshold for large growth: 20' winds over 4 mph, RH less than 40%, Temps over 75*, 1000 hr FM less than 13% (refer to Pocket Card in IAP).

Scattered Tree Mortality is under 5%.

Spotting potential is high during the peak of the day(PIG >85%) and low for night operations(PIG <20%)

SPECIFIC

All Divisions:

The Fires will continue to display ability for moderate surface fire ROS and intensity. Fire will move uphill between 10-12ch/hr. if aligned with slope and wind. The potential for single/group tree torching will remain a threat due to ladder fuels. Roll-out of burning material remains a high concern and is a main factor in fire growth..

Frying Pan Fire: Wind conditions are favorable for holding fire along Grider Ridge. The fire spread will continue to slowly push out to the east, burning up to Grider Ridge and continue to NE up into China Creek and Wolf Creek. Easterly winds should limit spread over the ridgeline.

Div. T: Heavy fuels and the influence of a NE wind will allow for persistent backing down to Elk Creek.

Div. O: N/NE winds may be adverse for firing operations. Evening RH and nighttime temps will allow for opportunity for firing up to around midnight.

Falkstein Fire: Expect fire behavior to increase from the limited growth exhibited during the past week. Fire spread should be uphill towards Huckleberry Mnt. and into Clift Valley to the NW.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Light winds will allow for good flying conditions once the inversion breaks. Expect the southern portion of the fire to remain hampered by smoke throughout the day, especially in deep drainages.

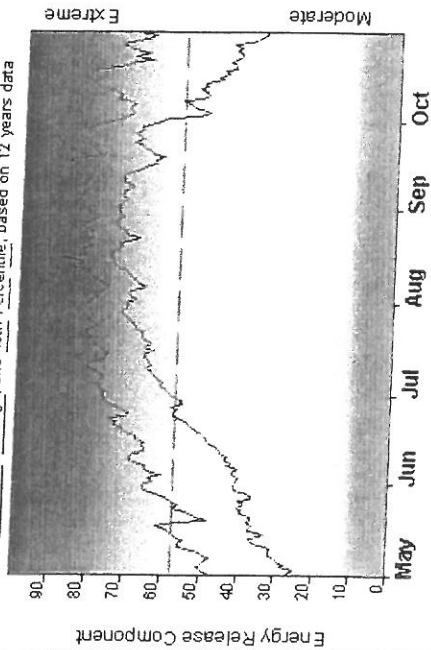
SAFETY

Do not be lulled into complacency. Heavy inversion will mask fire behavior. Be mindful of working in areas with unburned fuel between you and the fire.

Be vigilant to ensure you have lookouts that can maintain visibility of your area.

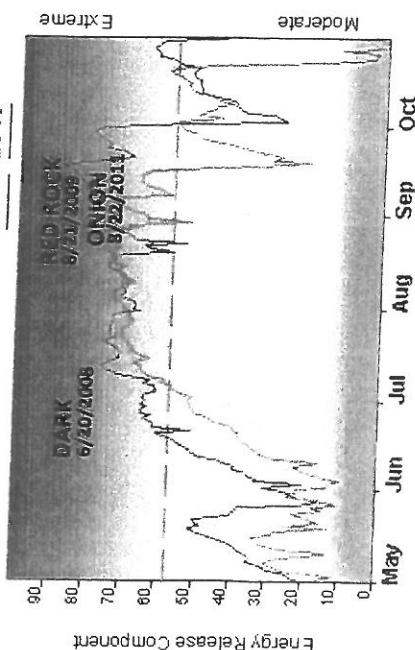
Maximum -- Highest Energy Release Component by day for 2000 - 2011

Average -- shows peak fire season over 12 years (2204 observations)
43th Percentile -- Only 43% of the 2204 days from 2000 - 2011 had an Energy Release Component below 57

Local Thresholds - Watch out:

- of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior:
- 20' Wind Speed over 4 mph, RH less than 40%, Temperature over 75, 1000-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 13

Fuel Model: G - Short-Needle (Heavy Dead)

Remember what Fire Danger tells you:

- ✓ Energy Release Component gives seasonal trends calculated from 2 pm temperature, humidity, daily temperature & rh ranges, and precip duration.
- ✓ Wind is NOT part of ERC calculation.
- ✓ Watch local conditions and variations across the landscape -- Fuel, Weather, Topography.
- ✓ Listen to weather forecasts -- especially WIND.

Past Experience:

Large fires (>50ac) occur more frequently when BI exceed 58. Fires 50 acres and larger can readily increase in complexity. Multiple lightning ignitions can overwhelm suppression resources. 2008 was an active fire year. 2010 was quiet.

Sawyers Bar, Somes Bar, Slater Butte, Blue Ridge, Oak Knoll, Slater Butte, Collins Baldy, Quartz Hill, Callahan #2, and Dutch-Indy RAO's data was used.

HAPPY CAMP COMPLEX SAFETY MESSAGE

8/25/2014 0600 – 08/26/14 0600

Theme for the day: The fire is again in transition. Very shortly there will be additional changes to the fire from a management perspective. The teams are going to do everything possible to make it as seamless as possible for you and your coworkers. Through this transition, there will be personnel reassignments and new overhead. Please be flexible and make sure you understand your new assignment and who you will be reporting to.

PPE's: Continue to remain 100% compliant with the use of your PPE's. We have had several instances on this fire of serious injury being averted through their use. Poison Oak is becoming more of a problem. Make sure you take care of exposed PPE's to prevent additional contamination.

Stumpholes and root systems remain compromised resulting in a greater chance for a fall or burn injury.

Briefings: We need to remain on point with our crew briefings. Many crews are being shifted between divisions as the workflow allows. This is extremely important if you are moving to a piece of line or area you have not worked or are not familiar with.

Hazards: Steep Terrain is the prevalent feature for the area. Heavy fuel continuity and horrible footing provides extra hazards to you.

Danger Trees are everywhere.

Working in or around the roadway is also extremely hazardous. Use markers, roadmarks and signaling devices as necessary to control civilian traffic.

Environmental: There have been several incidents involving wildlife, including a vehicle striking a bear cub. Please slow driving to what is necessary and be alert. In addition, Marijuana groves are possible in the area. If you see something that doesn't fit the area, back out and contact law enforcement through your chain of command.

CACHE ITEM CLAIMS

Individuals responsible for or assigned government property are responsible to document loss or damage on the Property Loss or Damage Report, OF-289. The individual, supervisor and a witness must document facts and circumstances on the form in order to gain approval to repair or replace damaged property.

The Supply Unit Leader (SPUL) or Incident Agency Representative approves replacement requests for expendable cache items. If this equipment or supply is not available at the incident AND the requesting resource is being demobilized, an OF-315 Incident Replacement Requisition is completed and signed by the SPUL. An "S" number will be assigned by the incident to be used by the home unit.

NON CACHE ITEM CLAIMS

All non-cache items available through the cache (e.g. sleeping bags, tents, tools, sleeping pads) will be replaced with cache equivalent items. Replacement for normal wear and tear is through home unit project funds. Specialized equipment (non-cache and non-expendable) shall be documented on a resource order and must be appropriate to the incident position. For replacement with incident funds, the item must have been clearly damaged or destroyed on the incident.

The OF-289 will be used to request consideration for replacement or repair of these items. Once approved, the OF-289 will be used by the incident to issue an "S" number to be used by the home unit.

CLAIMS PROCESSING

The incident agency will review all potential claims for accuracy and completeness and forward to the appropriate adjudicating official. This includes forwarding employee claims to the employee's home unit, if different than the incident agency.

Protocol for Encountering Cultural Resources

Happy Camp Complex
Klamath National Forest
August 25th, 2014

The Happy Camp Complex is located in a part of the Klamath National Forest that contains many types of cultural resources. As a result, there is a high potential that undocumented prehistoric and historic cultural sites will be encountered while fighting fire. Information on how to identify and report such sites will be discussed in the following text:

Prehistoric sites related to Native use and occupation of the land for thousands of years will vary in appearance and location on the landscape.

- The presence of obsidian (volcanic glass), shaped and ground stone tools on the surface, piles of rocks that appear to be out of place, as well as river cobbles located a significant distance from water should all be noted and reported.
- It is important to remember that sites related to Native occupation and use is culturally sensitive and need to be addressed accordingly.

Historic sites related to mining are cultural resources that also might be encountered.

- Linear ditch features are common across the landscape, but are also important to the history of the area. These usually run horizontally across slopes and sometimes tie into streams nearby.
- Prospecting pits are also another common mining feature and are usually easy to spot.
- Cabins and refuse scatters including rusted cans may also be encountered and need to be reported.
- Large cut bank scars that look like stream bank erosion are historic features from the gold rush era and must be considered during suppression tactics.

Sensitive Cultural Areas will be difficult to identify so consultation with the resource advisors and Karuk heritage consultants is critical.

- Proposed areas of activity need to be discussed with resource advisors.
- Resource damage is usually caused by a critical failure in communication.
- Just because you do not observe any cultural resources does not mean that they are not present in the area. Many sacred areas are not quantifiable.

It is important when a potential cultural resource is encountered that they are not disturbed in any manner.

- Artifacts are not to be touched or collected; leave them in place.
- If at all possible record their location with a GPS device and take an overview photo.

- When reporting a cultural resource the chain of command is as follows: All encounters with a potential cultural resource are to be personally communicated to the resource advisor in the field and not via radio communication. The resource advisor will then notify the heritage resource advisor and a plan will be implemented to address the potential resource.
- Known resources will be flagged with orange and white striped flagging tape with the date, initials, and the term "Resource Avoidance" clearly labeled for visibility.
- Please note that the Karuk Heritage Consultants will be communicating any Karuk heritage resource concerns to the Heritage Resource Advisor for guidance.
- **Any decisions** regarding relevance or significance of any cultural site is the sole responsibility of the Heritage Resource Advisor. Please collect any pertinent data and relay it to the resource advisors.

Backcountry Spike/Coyote Camps for the Klamath

- Making a functional camp will help contain impacts to the camp area. Get it right the first time to avoid wasting time and energy, and damaging resources.
- When there is a small group (a single crew), disperse use. In the case of larger camps (more than one crew), concentrate, mitigate, and rehabilitate.
- Consider utilizing pack animals to bring in supplies. They don't require the kind of visibility that aircraft do.

Campsites

- Use already-impacted sites whenever practical. If existing campsites are unavailable, select impact-resistant sites like rocky or sandy soil, or duff. Avoid camping in meadows and along streams or shores.
- Do not level uneven ground, avoid moving rocks or disturbing vegetation.
- Avoid building campfires.

Washing up

- Designate a common area for hand- and dish-washing. Provide water, biodegradable soap, and a catch basin for waste water.
- Dispose of waste water in a "sump" (i.e., hole sufficiently deep to hold wastewater and allow infiltration) at least 200 feet (i.e., 50 paces or 100 steps) from water sources.

Human Waste

- For less than 30 "user days" (# people x days out) in one place, catholes work best. For 30+ user days, using a portable toilet is more appropriate. All toilet sites should be 200 feet from water sources. Hand sanitizer or a hand wash station should be available at the toilet site.
 - **Portable toilets** (aka "rocket boxes") will accommodate approximately 60 uses per box. They are designed to be packed out.
 - **Cat holes** are small single-use holes. They should be dug 6-8 inches deep and filled back in after use. TP can be packed out – provide all personnel a ziplock for this purpose.

Food, water, and garbage

- Drinking water:
 - For smaller crews, hand pump filters, iodine, or Aquamira water treatment may be sufficient
 - Gravity filtration systems are often practical for larger crews (e.g., Platypus Gravityworks)
 - Cubies can be flown in by helicopter or packed in on stock.
- Store food and any fragrant toiletries so that they are not accessible to wildlife, away from camp, and in **animal resistant containers**. On the Klamath, a lockable cooler, truck box, or ammo can is usually sufficient. A "bear hang" is not practical given the time it takes and the lack of appropriate branches.
- Do not let garbage and food scraps accumulate in camp. Food scraps can be disposed of in a HOT fire or packed out. Garbage should be crushed, stored in the same way as described for food, and packed out.

STEPS TO EFFECTIVE PROBLEM RESOLUTION

Effective interpersonal relationships include the ability to effectively resolve issues, problems, or concerns, either between two individuals or between groups of individuals. There are identifiable steps that, when followed, can lead to effective resolution and improved communications. These include:

- Letting each party involved in the resolution talk and listen
- Staying focused on the present and future, not in the past
- Sticking to the topic at hand
- Avoiding put-downs or cross-complaining
- Looking for and capitalizing on areas of agreement
- Taking a break if needed
- Restating what you have said in different ways if there is misunderstanding, working continuously for mutual understanding, not necessarily agreement.
- Watching what you say and how you say it, so that you don't give mixed messages and create an atmosphere of distrust

The Human Resources Specialist is a trained facilitator and can help the parties achieve effective resolution by helping with these steps.

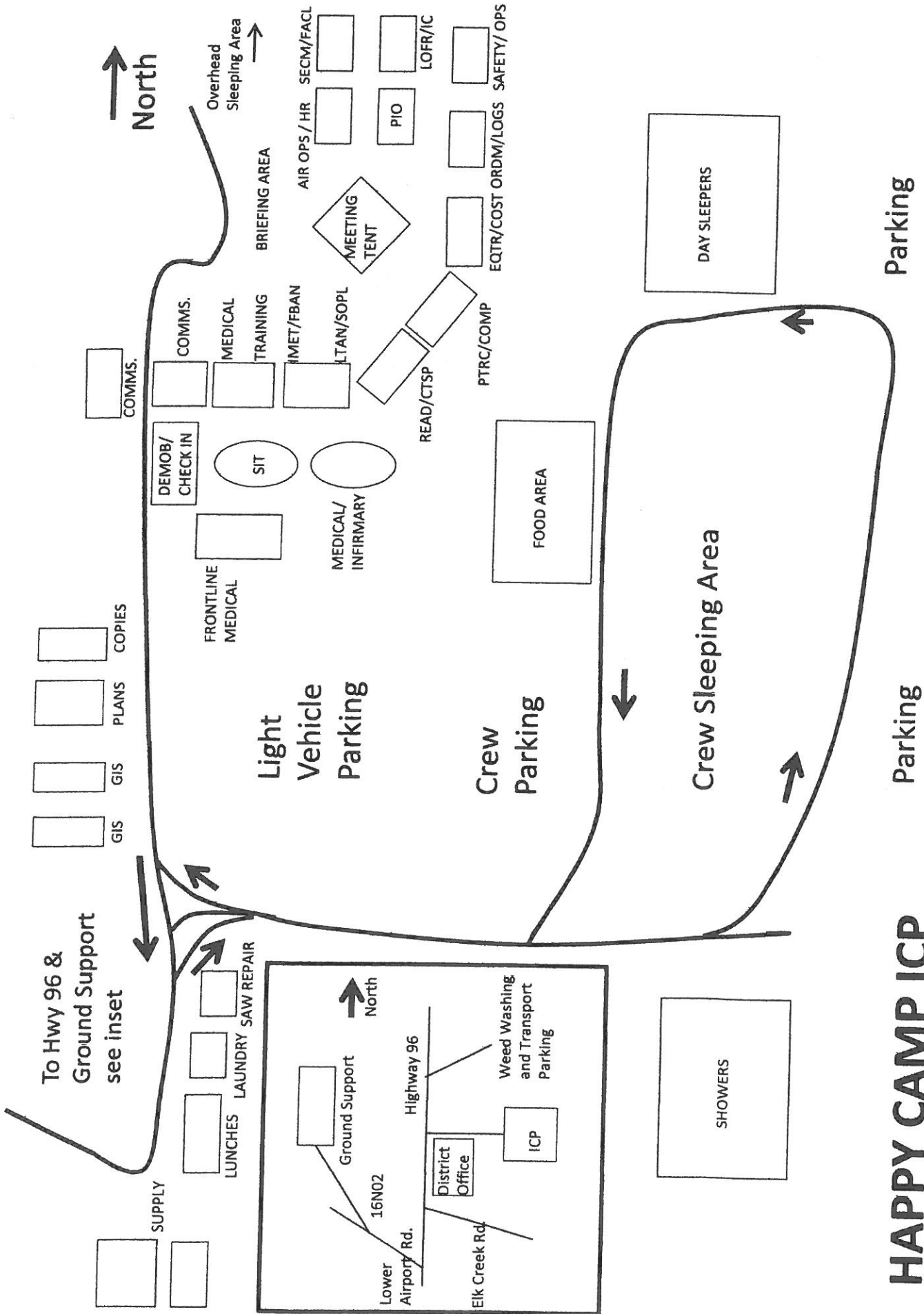
