WEATHER DISCUSSION: A ridge of high pressure will gradually shift eastward over the fire area today and Thursday. This feature will weaken on Friday as a trough of low pressure drops down from the north. The warming drying trend will persist through Thursday along with stronger inversions and abundant smoke. Westerly winds increase on Friday thus some relief from the smoke is expected...accompanied by a decrease in temperature and an increase in relative humidity through Sunday.

WEATHER: Clear but with periods of heavy Smoke....some mixing after 1700.



OUTPUTS

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:
The Fires main influence has been fuel and topography dominated. Critically dry dead and downed fuels are providing persistence in fire behavior. A fuels & fire behavior is in affect for the Region.
Local threshold for large growth: 20' winds over 4 mph, RH less than 40%, Temps over 75*, 1000 hr FM less than 13% (refer to Pocket Card in IAP).
Spotting potential is high during the peak of the day(PIG >85%) and low for night operations(PIG <20%)

SPECIFIC

All Divisions:

The potential for single/group tree torching and short range spotting will remain a threat due to ladder fuels. Roll-out of burning material remains a high concern and is a main factor in fire growth..

Frying Pan Fire: Stable conditions and smoke shielding will limit fire growth today. When the inversion breaks, expect unburned pockets to continue burning up to Grider Ridge. Slop-overs on Grider Ridge will continue to back & roll-out towards Grider Creek.

Div. F: Fire will continue to burn within China and Wolf Creeks and progress up towards Grider Ridge.

Div. T: Heavy fuels will allow for continued backing down to Elk Creek. Rolling materials and snags will pose a threat for the next several days.

Div. O: Fuels within the Doolittle drainage will continue to burnout and up to the established perimeter.

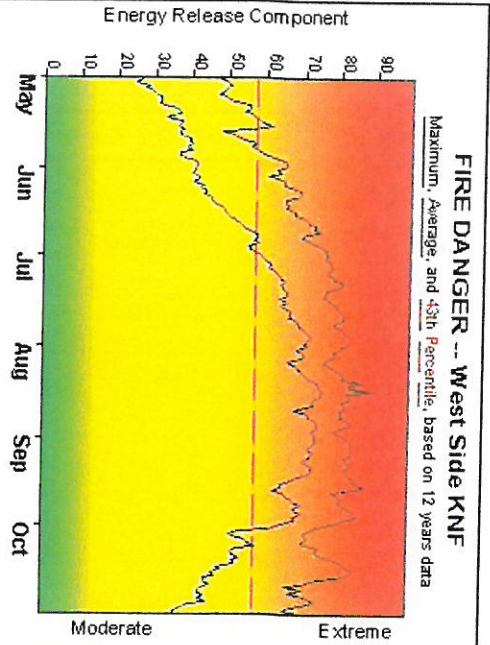
Falkstein Fire: No significant movement expected today. Fire will continue to back to the north and west. Fire progression will be mainly from roll-out and short range spotting. Fire is not expected to impact any of the indirect line construction during today's shift.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Light winds will allow for good flying conditions once the inversion breaks. Expect poor visibility for most of the day, especially in deep drainages.

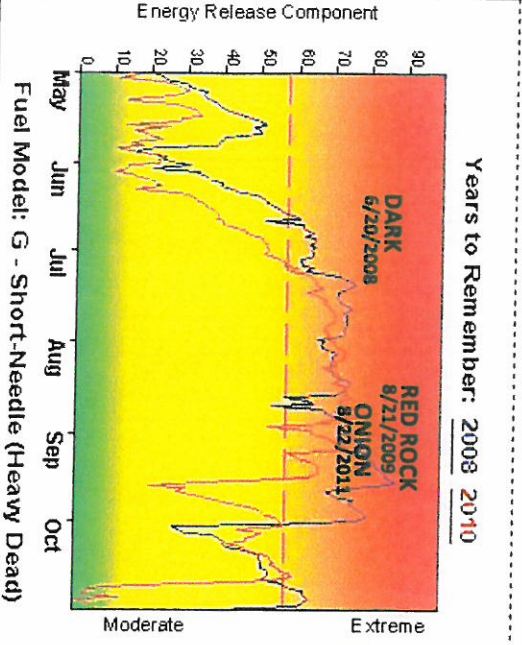
Maximum -- Highest Energy Release Component by day for 2000 - 2011

Average -- show's peak fire season over 12 years (2204 observations)

43th Percentile -- Only 43% of the 2204 days from 2000 - 2011 had an Energy Release Component below 57

Local Thresholds - Watch out: Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior:

- 20' Wind Speed over 4 mph, RH less than 40%, Temperature over 75, 1000-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 13



Remember what Fire Danger tells you:

- ✓ Energy Release Component gives seasonal trends calculated from 2 pm temperature, humidity, daily temperature & in ranges, and precip duration.
- ✓ Wind is NOT part of ERC calculation.
- ✓ Watch local conditions and variations across the landscape -- Fuel, Weather, Topography.
- ✓ Listen to weather forecasts -- especially WIND.

Past Experience:

Large fires (>50ac) occur more frequently when BI exceed 58. Fires 50 acres and larger can readily increase in complexity

Multiple lightning ignitions can overwhelm suppression resources: 2008 was an active fire year. 2010 was quiet.

Sawyers Bar, Somes Bar, Slater Butte, Blue Ridge, Oak Knoll, Slater Butte, Collins Baldy, Quartz Hill, Callahan #2, and Dutch-Indy RAINOS data was used.

7. Control Operations Mop-up and patrol. Construct fire line. Tactical ignition as directed and approved by OBD and OSC. Back haul trash and equipment as needed. When firing, head fire should be considered only when life or property are threatened. Safety Message

August 27, 2014

Hazards we face daily:

- Situational Awareness & Hazard Assessment
- Snags / Rolling material / steep terrain / uneven footing
- Complacency
- Driving habits
- Tactical Firing Operations

Some possible mitigations could include:

Situational Awareness (Typical considerations): *Gather information; what is the objective; good communications; who's in charge; Previous or current fire behavior; Weather now and forecast; Local factors to the work area. =GO/NO DECISION*

Hazard Assessment (Typical considerations): *What are potential fire behavior hazards- Look up/down/ around indicators; identify any tactical hazards-watch outs; what other safety hazards exist in work area for tasks being completed? Consider severity vs. probability? What do I need to control the hazard? GO/NO DECISION*

- Keep flexible; wildland fire incidents are very dynamic. As operations change to mop up, remain vigilant of surroundings. Constantly look around you.
- Scott's Valley Road to Happy Camp is seeing heavy traffic, use headlamps, be aware of blind turns, goes to 1 lane in a few spots and watch speed limit.
- Snags in the fire area are burning through and falling on their own, this tends to bring rocks and material with it. Stage your people, equipment and vehicles safely and post lookouts. Watch out for each other.
- De-hydration still is an issue, other incidents have sent fire fighters to the hospital for treatment, this is nothing to fool with!
- Tactical ignition-Understand your objective; ensure you will not have an adverse affect on other parts of the fire (or zone). Does this operation fit into the big picture? LCES must be in place prior to commencing. Keep Operations informed when commencing and of any immediate needs.

CACHE ITEM CLAIMS

Individuals responsible for or assigned government property are responsible to document loss or damage on the Property Loss or Damage Report, OF-289. The individual, supervisor and a witness must document facts and circumstances on the form in order to gain approval to repair or replace damaged property.

The Supply Unit Leader (SPUL) or Incident Agency Representative approves replacement requests for expendable cache items. If this equipment or supply is not available at the incident AND the requesting resource is being demobilized, an OF-315 Incident Replacement Requisition is completed and signed by the SPUL. An "S" number will be assigned by the incident to be used by the home unit.

NON CACHE ITEM CLAIMS

All non-cache items available through the cache (e.g. sleeping bags, tents, tools, sleeping pads) will be replaced with cache equivalent items. Replacement for normal wear and tear is through home unit project funds. Specialized equipment (non-cache and non-expendable) shall be documented on a resource order and must be appropriate to the incident position. For replacement with incident funds, the item must have been clearly damaged or destroyed on the incident.

The OF-289 will be used to request consideration for replacement or repair of these items. Once approved, the OF-289 will be used by the incident to issue an "S" number to be used by the home unit.

CLAIMS PROCESSING

The incident agency will review all potential claims for accuracy and completeness and forward to the appropriate adjudicating official. This includes forwarding employee claims to the employee's home unit, if different than the incident agency.

HUMAN RESOURCE MESSAGE

The demands expected of the people assigned to incidents are complex, different, exhausting, and exciting. No matter what our particular assignment to the incident may be, there is a common expectation placed on each of us – our readiness to take on the assignment.

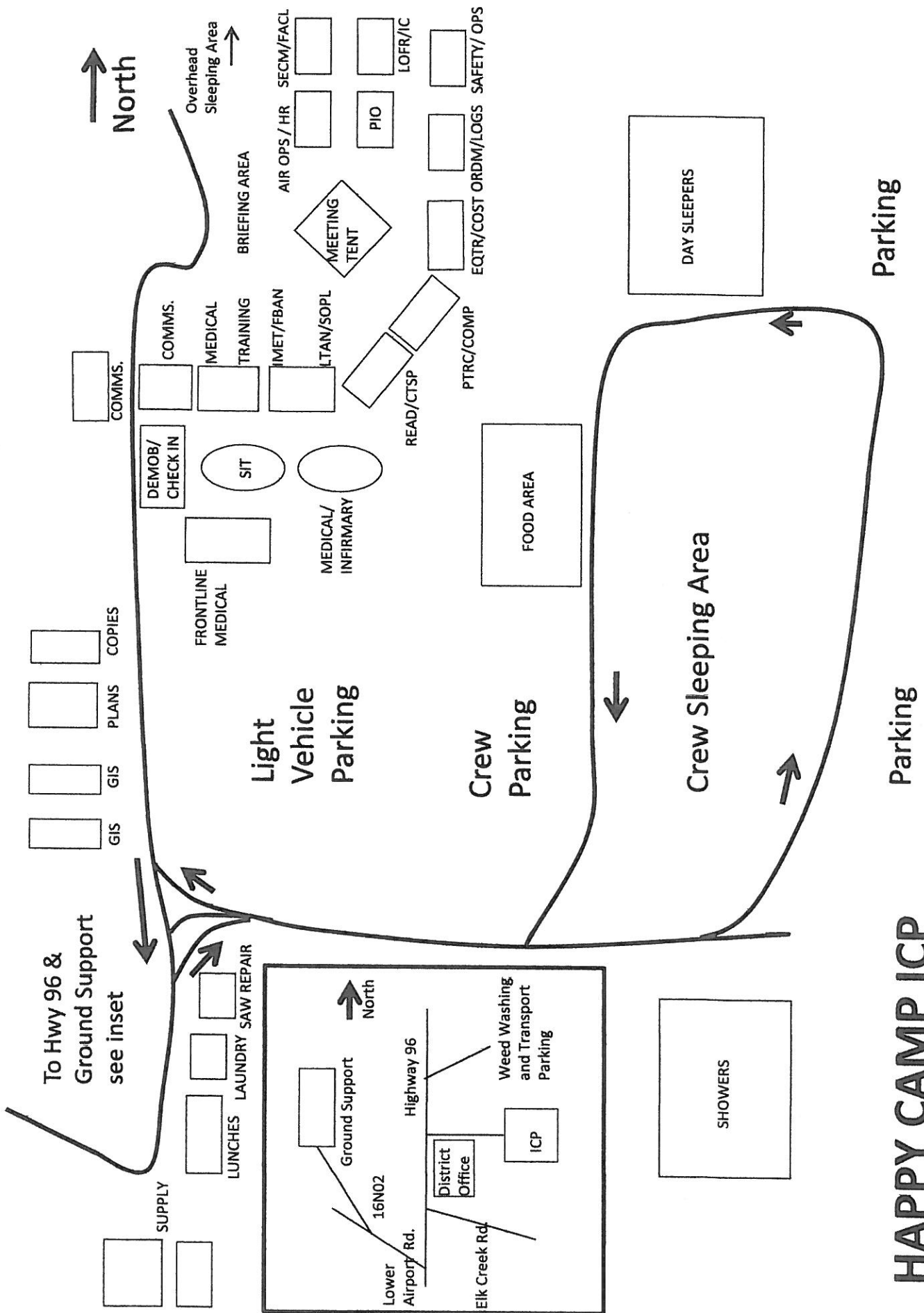
