

...A RED FLAG WARNING REMAINS IN EFFECT FOR GUSTY EAST TO NORTHEAST WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITIES THROUGH 11 PM FRIDAY NIGHT...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The thermal pressure trough that has been impacting the fire will continue to remain mostly stationary once again today, resulting in continued warm, unstable and dry conditions in addition to continued gusty East to Northeast winds. These winds will start the day strong...but will slowly diminish through the day. Afternoon high temperatures will continue to increase both today and Saturday and, as such, minimum RH values are expected to remain in the single digits. Overnight RH recoveries will remain poor in higher elevations as well. A shift in the thermal trough will allow for very weak onshore flow, slightly decreasing temperatures on Sunday.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY (FRIDAY):

WEATHER: Continued very dry conditions with gusty winds. Areas of smoke.
MAX TEMPERATURES: Valleys (1,200 ft) 86 – 91 F, Ridges (4,000 ft) 75 – 82 F
MIN HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 5 – 10%, Ridges (4,000 ft) 7 – 12%
WINDS (EYE LEVEL):
Lower Slopes/Drainages – Downslope/downcanyon 2–5 mph in the morning, becoming upslope/upcanyon 3–7 mph in the afternoon. (NE to SW oriented drainages 7-11 mph with gusts to 17 mph)
Ridgetop – East-Northeast 8 – 13 mph with gusts up to 20 mph.

GENERAL:

POI: 60-90% Afternoon southerly aspects **ERC:** 90th percentile **Live Fuel Moisture Brush:** 80%
Today atmospheric stability will be similar to yesterday, there is still potential for large column development with long range spotting (up to 2 miles). Slopes with a south and west component aligned with northeasterly winds could exhibit active surface fire, torching and active crown fire. The remainder of the fire will be fuels and topography driven. At present primary fire spread is from lateral fire movement across slope, and spot fires caused by rolling material and torching.
Night Shift Personnel: Fire behavior could be active on ridgetops and adjacent slopes as the shift begins due to low RH and slow recovery. East to west oriented drainages may experience increased activity and could be active throughout the evening and early morning hours. Fire behavior on the slopes backing into the drainages should decrease by early morning as the RH begins to rise after 2100 hrs.

SPECIFIC:

Division O,I: If slopover is not contained by start of shift, active fire behavior could include torching and spotting where slope and the forecast northeast winds align.
Division Q, T, Z, D, F and I: These Divisions are still indicating scattered and isolated heat on the IR, however minimal fire activity is anticipated.
Division G and H: Isolated heat sources are still present; however minimal fire activity is anticipated.
Division J: Firewill continue to burn out in Kuntz Ck and Mill Ck drainages. Spotting is still possible to the southwest over the ridge. Fire is established in Muck-a-Muck Creek, and could keep moving easterly and southwesterly into China Doctor Ck.

AIR OPERATIONS

Ridgetop winds could hamper air operations

SAFETY

Ensure lookouts are well placed and are keyed into changes in the weather and increases in fire behavior.

Transportation Issues

- Traffic control on Hwy 96 is still ongoing, watch for the public standing outside their vehicles while waiting to go through the controlled area. Fire vehicles please slow down when passing the public waiting at the traffic control stops.
- Deer are frequently on the roads, especially at dusk and throughout the night.

Risk Management

Fire operations risk management is outlined in the NWCG Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG). The five step process provides firefighters and fire managers a simple, universal, and consistent way to practice risk management by:

- Establishing situation awareness by identifying hazards
- Assessing hazard potential.
- Developing hazard controls and making risk management decisions.
- Implementing hazard controls.
- Supervising implementation and evaluating effectiveness. If situation has changed significantly, restart Risk Management Process.

Fireline

- Snags continue to come down and block roads, if the road is your Escape Route monitor constantly to ensure a quick and rapid exit.
- LCES is built on two guidelines: Before safety is threatened, each firefighter must know the LCES system will be used, and LCES must be continuously reevaluated as fire conditions change.




If Declaring an "Incident within the Incident"

The closest DIVS will respond to manage the incident. They are responsible for giving an accurate size up, ensuring scene safety, setting priorities and initiating an appropriate response.

The closest Safety Officer and Line EMS will respond to the scene to assist the Branch Director or DIVS. Secure site and begin initial investigation when situation is stabilized.

Medical Pre-Incident Planning:

- Identify EMTs and Equipment imbedded in suppression recourses.
- Review the Incident or Forest Emergency reporting procedures
- Review the Incident's assigned Medical resources and their location. (note radio call sign)
- Assure that all assigned supervisors have reviewed and understand the Medical Plan. (if none is available develop a quick plan before engaging)

Arriving at work site:

- Assess access and egress for medical ground units.
- Assure that all resources can clearly articulate their location. (update as they move)
- GPS potential Drop Points or Landing Zones.
- Note weather changes and check on availability of air resources.
- Pre-Position medical supplies

During Response to a Medical Emergency:

- Contact Communications and declare a **MEDICAL EMERGENCY!!**
 - Identify the Unit needing help and their location
 - Insure that LCES are maintained.
 - Obtain patient info and severity.
 - Develop a resource list
 - Initial care
 - Sustained care
 - Extrication/evacuation
 - Report the Emergency and request anticipated resources needs
 - Put two plans in place and start both plans clearly identifying the primary and backup plan to resources assigned.
- During the Evacuation (every 15 min.)**
- Reassess the treatment and the patient response (Are they getting better?) Do you have the right level of care?
 - Assess the evacuation plans progress and adjust as needed.
 - Assure that additional personnel are available for relief.
 - Up-date Comm/Disp of the progress of the rescue.
