


**...A Red Flag Warning in effect for Wind and Low Humidity through 2300 Saturday Evening...
20 foot wind speeds are being used**

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The thermal trough will be slow to move east today with east winds likely to affect the fire through midday. Dry and unstable conditions will combine with the wind to bring Red Flag conditions to the incident area. Thermal trough will sit over the incident Saturday night and Sunday for continued dry and unstable conditions with poor upper elevation humidity recovery. Winds for most of Sunday, however, should go light and somewhat variable. Sunday afternoon or evening onshore winds will bring a wind direction reversal and Northwest winds to the ridges. Northwest winds look to continue for most of Monday before possibly becoming North. Wind shift will bring some humidity relief.

Weather Forecast For Today (Saturday):

WEATHER: Clear on the SE flank of the fire...otherwise smoke shadowed.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Valleys (1,200 ft) 90-95 °F, Ridges (5,000 ft) 75-82 °F

MIN HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 5-10%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 7-12%

WINDS (20 foot):

Lower Slope/Canyons – Variable winds 0-2 mph becoming terrain driven 3-7 mph in the afternoon.
(NE to SW oriented drainages 7-11 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the morning)

Upper Slope/Ridgetop – East-southeast 8-13 mph with gusts up to 25 mph becoming variable 0-5 mph late in the shift.

HAINES INDEX (High Level): 5 (from dry air aloft)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversions (strongest at DIVs J, O, Q). Moderately unstable on the SE flank.

SMOKE TRANSPORT: Southeast around 13 mph easing in the afternoon.

Weather Forecast For Tonight (Saturday Night):

WEATHER: Smoke settling into valleys...otherwise mostly clear.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 55-65 F...upper slopes and ridges warmest.

MAX HUMIDITY: Valleys (1,200 ft) 65-70%, Ridges (5,000 ft) 20-25%

WINDS (20 foot):

Valleys – Variable becoming drainage 3 to 6 mph around 2100.

Ridgetop – Variable 2-6 mph.

HAINES INDEX (High Level): 5 (from dry air aloft)

STABILITY/INVERSION: Radiation inversions developing around sunset. Thermal belt around 4500 feet.



Red Flag Warning for Strong Winds, Low Relative Humidity's, and Unstable Conditions Through 2300 Tonight!
High Temperature: 75-95°
Minimum RH: 5-12%
20' Winds: Becoming terrain driven 3-7 mph after noon. Northeast to southwest oriented drainages 7-11 with gusts to 20 Ridgetop winds east to southeast 6-13 with gusts up to 25mph, becoming variable 0-5 mph late in the day.
Tonight:
Minimum temperature: 55-65°
Maximum RH: 20-25% on Ridges and 65-70% in Valleys
Winds (eye level): Variable 2-6 mph on ridges and becoming downslope/downvalley 3-6 mph around 2100.

There is still potential for large column development with long range spotting (up to 2 miles) particularly where slopes are being directly heated by sun. Slopes with a south and east aspect aligned with southeasterly winds could exhibit active surface fire, individual and group torching and active crown fire with higher flame lengths. The remainder of the fire will be fuels and topography driven. At present primary fire spread is from lateral fire movement across slope, and spot fires caused by rolling material and torching.

Night Shift Personnel: Fire behavior could be active on ridgetops and adjacent slopes as the shift begins due to low RH and slow recovery. Fire activity may shift and start backing into the drainages and fire activity should begin to decrease by early morning as the RH begins to rise.

SPECIFIC:

Division O: With the forecast east-southeast winds spotting to the west-northwest is possible from the slopover in Division I.

Division Q, T, Z, D, and F: These Divisions are still indicating isolated heat on the IR, however minimal fire activity is anticipated.

Division G and H: Isolated heat sources are still present; however minimal fire activity is anticipated.

Division J: Long range spotting is possible into Division J and possibly across Hwy 96 as firing continues into Division K.

AIR OPERATIONS

Ridgetop winds could hamper air operations

SAFETY

Ensure lookouts are well placed and are keyed into changes in the weather and increases in fire behavior.





Medical Pre-Incident Planning:

- Identify EMTs and Equipment imbedded in suppression recourses.
- Review the Incident or Forest Emergency reporting procedures
- Review the Incident's assigned Medical resources and their location. (note radio call sign)
- Assure that all assigned supervisors have reviewed and understand the Medical Plan. (if none is available develop a quick plan before engaging)

Arriving at work site:

- Assess access and egress for medical ground units.
- Assure that all resources can clearly articulate their location. (update as they move)
- GPS potential Drop Points or Landing Zones.
- Note weather changes and check on availability of air resources.
- Pre-Position medical supplies

During Response to a Medical Emergency:
EMERGENCY!!

- Contact Communications and declare a **MEDICAL EMERGENCY!!**
- Identify the Unit needing help and their location
- Insure that LCES are maintained.
- Obtain patient info and severity.
- Develop a resource list
 - Initial care
 - Sustained care
 - Extrication/evacuation
- Report the Emergency and request anticipated resources needs
- Put two plans in place and start both plans clearly identifying the primary and backup plan to resources assigned.

During the Evacuation (every 15 min.)

- Reassess the treatment and the patient response (Are they getting better?) Do you have the right level of care?
- Assess the evacuation plans progress and adjust as needed.
- Assure that additional personnel are available for relief.
- Up-date Comm/Disp of the progress of the rescue.
