# FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Condition will continue to be warm and dry, expect to see active interior burning. The fire continues to be fuels driven. 1000 and 10,000hr fuel moistures are in the single digits and they will continue to be the primary carrier of fire. Spot fires from rollout will continue to be a possibility. If fire were to get established outside of containment lines expect Rates of spread of 1 to 15 chains per hour with flame lengths 3-16 feet in the timber. Brush R.O.S. 15-60 chains per hour and F.L. 15-45feet.

Probability of ignition will be 80% to 90%

## **SPECIFIC:**

# South End

No forward fire progression expected. Heavier fuels will continue to burnout. Expect to see some interior islands continue to burn, well inside the lines. Watch for rollout.

### Branch II

No forward progression is expected. Heavy interior fuels continue to burn out. Some unburned interior islands can be expected to torch out.

<u>Air Operations:</u> Smoke from our fire has the potential to limit air ops. Inversion will usually lift by 1100hrs

- Accountability of your crew members is a good habit to get into.
- Monitor Coffee Creek Rd between DP-1 and DP-2 for rolling debris.
- Review and know your procedures if a medical incident should occur including evacuation options.
- We continue to have snake and bear sightings, let others know if seen., know your mitigation/clean up plan.
- Travel at safe speeds, be aware of the public, be a defensive driver.
- Initial attack activities will pick up. The local unit is counting on help. Pay attention to the basics and remember any new start has potential to get large fast. Keep Operations informed!
- Lightning activity is still a factor, be prepared to take shelter when needed, the 30/30 rule is a good guideline.
- ERC's are at record high, adjust normal strategies and tactics.

# Rights and Responsibilities While On Assignment

# You have a right to:

- A safe work environment
- Adequate information, food, sleep, equipment, and transportation
- Answers to your questions

But, it's not one-sided. Your help, cooperation and commitment are needed. In order for all fire personnel to be effective, here is an outline of your responsibilities:

# Promote and Maintain Good Communications

Adequate and accurate communications and information flow are essential for efficient fire suppression efforts and effective interpersonal relations.

❖ Maintain an Attitude of Respect and Concern for your Colleagues. Fire suppression efforts can only be accomplished by accessing the skills and abilities of a wide variety of people. An attitude of mutual respect and appropriate behavior is essential for all personnel. Civil Rights violations will be dealt with promptly. If you have a concern, please report it to the Human Resource Specialist, your supervisor, or any member of the Management Team.

Fire camp will be a Drug and Alcohol Free workplace. Here are the rules:

From the Fire line Handbook, Chapter 6 – Common Responsibilities: Non-prescription unlawful drugs and alcohol are not permitted at the incident. Possession or use of these substances will result in disciplinary action.

Remember, YOU are responsible for your conduct and behavior.
