WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...GETTING HOTTER AND DRIER...

Today, we start to warm and dry over the fire as low pressure pushes east and high pressure starts to build back over Northern California. Residual moisture will still be in place this morning with inversion lifting around 1000. Even though we are starting to dry out, there is still a slight chance of thunderstorms developing over the Trinity Alps this afternoon and early evening. We will be in a warming and drying trend through the weekend. Low pressure approaches the Pacific Northwest on Friday, which will bring increasing Northwest wind to the fire area.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. 10% chance of showers and thunderstorms after 1300.

TEMPERATURES: Canyon bottom...88-91°F; Slope/Ridges...81-87°F. **10° WARMER**

HUMIDITY: Canyon bottom...25-30%; Slope/Ridges...30-35% **20% DRIER**

20-FOOT WIND: ...GUSTY OUTFLOW WINDS UP TO 30 MPH POSSIBLE WITH THUNDERSTORMS...

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope 3 to 6 mph...becoming Upcanyon 4 to 8 mph after 1300. Gusts to 13 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Conditions are becoming warmer and dryer, expect to see more active burning. This means more torching trees and a higher likely hood for spotting. The fire continues to be fuels driven. 1000 and 10,000hr fuel moistures are in the single digits and they will continue to be the primary carrier of fire. Spotting will be mid range (1/4 to 1/2 mile) and from rollouts, watch below you. Rates of spread will be from 1 to 10 chains per hour with flame lengths 3-6 feet in the timber. Short crown runs are probable in the brush and tight canopy timber when the fuels, slope and wind aligns.

Probability of ignition will be 90%.

SPECIFIC:

(Left Flank) Divisions A&B

Fire is in a backing alignment. Expect the fire to continue to move to the south and west with moderate intensity. Short intense uphill runs are possible in drainages with continuous fuels. Rollout will continue to challenge established lines.

(Right Flank) Divisions Y&T

Fire will continue backing into the East fork on the south end. Expect flanking fire to the north along the top of the ridge approaching Doe Flats.

Expect low to moderate fire intensity. Rollout will continue to challenge established lines.

IA

Hold over lightening fire will burn with moderate intensity and a slow to moderate rate of spread. Fires in the brush aligned with wind and slope will spread rapidly through the crowns.

Air Operations: Poor visibility until the inversion lifts approx. 1100hrs.

SAFETY:

Conditions are becoming warmer and dryer.

Rollout will continue to challenge containment, watch below you.

Coffee Fire Safety Message

August 6, 2014

Keep your mind focused on fighting fire safely.

Hazards and Concerns:

- Heat/dehydration
- Situational Awareness
- Driving Hazards
- Pack String
- Working on Steep Terrain

Some possible mitigations could include:

- Heat/dehydration- Drink plenty of fluids along with frequent snacks. Take frequent breaks. Watch your body signs... know Your personal limitations
- Situational Awareness- Stay focused on you assignment. Have a plan for Initial Attack reassignments. Are today's operations satisfying LCES?
- Driving- Remember what we discussed yesterday, when near the Coffee Creek ranch be alert for people on the road along with horse and horse drawn wagons with the narrow road.
- Working in step terrain- Rolling material and poor footing are issues.
- Some basics when working around the pack string:
 - When passing the string stay on the downhill side and keep your crew and equipment together and avoid loud talking.
 - No fast movement or reaching to pet stock on the trail
 - Remove large rocks and stumps from trails to accommodate stock
 - Shut saws off when pack string approaches
 - If near a known bees nest, let packer know
