WEATHER SUMMARY

(Refer to Weather Forecast for details) DAY: Mostly clear. Max Temp: 67-83°. Min RH: 30-42%. Slope/Valley – Upslope 3-4 mph, Ridges – Northwest to North 5-7 mph with gusts to 14 mph.

NIGHT: Mostly clear. Min Temp: 52-56° Max RH: 45-90% Winds: N to NE 3-5 mph ridges.

FUELS

Fire is burning within the boundaries of the Megram Fire (1999) and Back Bone Fire (2009). Fuels consist of abundant heavy dead and down, snags and shrubs (snowbrush/ceanothus) in areas that burned with a high severity. Mature timber w/ a lifted canopy in Div. Lima where Megram burned with low severity. Live FMC lower on S/SE/W aspects. Live and dead fuel moistures noticeably higher in the drainages below 4000ft elevation.

Minimum fine fuel moisture: 6-8%, 1000 hour FMC: 9-11%, Live fuel moisture: 80-100%.

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

> Forecasted Indices (Big Hill RAWS) ERC: 49 (Down 2) BI: 46 (Down 6) Thresholds for Active Fire Behavior in the Corral Complex area:

20ft Winds > 7 mph. RH < 31%. Temperature > 82°. 1000hr FMC < 13%. BI > 50. ERC > 47.

- GENERAL: Yesterday's fire spread was minimal as humidities remained above 40% across most of the fire area. Today's fire behavior potential will be greater as a result of the slightly lower relative humidity and clear skies. There is a potential for low to moderate spread rates and fire behavior across the higher elevations and east of the crest after noon. Fire behavior at the lower elevations and west of the crest will be generally low. Most fire behavior will be backing and flanking at 1 ch/hr. or less with smokes showing after noon.
- **DIV F & H (W Flank, Tish Tang Ridge area)** Expect the fire to spread very slowly to the west and back off the ridge to the north and south of the South Fork Tish Tang Ck. Rollout will not likely result in any rapid upslope runs. Heavy fuels continue to smolder and consume.
- **DIV L (NW Flank, Tish Tang Point area)** Expect low spread to the NW towards and around Tish Tang Point. Suppression efforts on the spot fire in the bottom of Tish Tang Ck will keep that fire in check. Rollout will not likely result in any rapid upslope runs. Heavy fuels continue to smolder.
- **DIV M & P (NE Flank, Trinity GS/H-2 area)** This edge is largely cold, especially inside the Backbone Fire footprint from 2009. Spot fire east of the crest is not showing IR heat, but don't bet on that, keep a close eye for this area for signs of heat in the heavy fuels.
- **DIV R & W (E/SE Flank, South of Grizzly Camp)** This is a problematic area with heat and a high potential for rollout at the head of Quinby Creek, however the rest of the Division west of the crest and H-3 looks cold, and can likely be cold trailed. Fire spread potential is fairly low, and both retardant and bucket drops have been effective.
- **DIV X & A (Horse Linto Ck area)** Fire is established at the bottom of Horse Linto Ck. There is a slight potential of the fire making a slope reversal and heading upslope to the ridge top to the south, but rates of spread will stay low, unless torching brush provides a source of spotting.

Maximum Fire Behavior (head fire upslope): Rate of Spread: 5-10 chains/hour (10 ft/min), Flame Length: 4-6 ft. Probability of Ignition: 40-60%. Maximum spotting distance of 1500 feet.

SAFETY MESSAGE CORRAL COMPLEX

August 30, 2013

DRIVING – Slowing down is the best mitigation for numerous safety issues. Learn to recognize and pay attention to the warning signs of fatigue. Take a break if you experience wandering or disconnected thoughts, yawn repeatedly, have difficulty focusing or keeping your eyes open, or find yourself missing traffic signs or tailgating other drivers. **Be alert for trucks, civilian vehicles and wildlife on roads in all areas!**

SNAGS: There are numerous snags throughout the entire incident area. Maintain a strong situational awareness at all times. Look up, look down, and look around and be especially alert when the wind picks up. When falling operations are in progress, keep nonessential personnel at least 2 ½ tree lengths away from the activity.

HAZARDOUS WILDLIFE, INSECTS AND PLANTS: For bears, pick up and remove all trash from fire line. Don't allow storage of food in tents. Manage trash in spike camps to avoid attracting bears

For cougars, travel in pairs, especially at night. If confronted, stand erect, extend arms. Don't crouch. Don't run or assume the prone position. If confronted while with another FF, one FF can crouch to get rocks or limbs to throw at the cougar. If attacked, go to a prone position and protect head/neck.

Incidents of bee/yellow jacket stings/bites are on the rise. Find out whom of your subordinates are allergic and if they carry epi-pens.

Try to avoid contact with poison oak when possible. Emphasize pre-treatment, change clothes frequently, take cool showers, and see medical unit for treatments.

HYDRATION: Encourage your crew to drink plenty of water before, during, and after every shift, up to one and a half gallons a day. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others. Treat for symptoms early by providing rest under shade and continuing to push water consumption.

FATIGUE: Be alert for signs of fatigue in your crew and have them take breaks as often as necessary. Make sure they are maintaining a 2:1 work/rest ratio.

Black Bear Facts

- The only species of bears in California and Nevada are Black Bears. However, they do range in color from blonde to black, with cinnamon brown being the most common color.
- Black Bears will seek to avoid confrontation with humans. If encountered, always leave them an
 escape route.
- Males are much larger than females and can weigh up to 500 pounds, although the average weight is about 300 pounds.
- Black Bears can sprint up to 35 mph and they are strong swimmers and great tree climbers.
- Black Bears are omnivores. A typical wild bear diet consists of berries, plants, nuts, roots, honey, honeycomb, insects, larvae, carrion and small mammals.
- Bears that are accustomed to people can become too bold and lose their fear of humans. To avoid this behavior, do not let bears become habituated to human sources of food.

Spiking or Working Around Bears

- Never leave food, toiletries and/or anything with a scent in your tent, sleeping bag or car.
- Keep sleeping bags, tents and sleeping areas free of food and beverage odors.
- The trunk of your car and coolers are not bear-proof!
- Do not leave out food, stored drinks. The smell will attract bears.
- Clean everything after preparing a meal.
- Dispose of garbage properly.
- Remember, never feed a bear! A fed bear is a dead bear.

Bear Encounters

In Spike Camp: Do not run. Be aggressive and assert your dominance by standing tall and making noise that will scare the bear away. Banging loud objects together and shouting loudly works well.

On The Line: This is the bear's territory, respect that and do not run. Make eye contact cut don't stare, make yourself appear as large as possible, stay calm and quiet, back away. Communicate the information to your supervisor and personnel in the area.

Anywhere: If the bear attempts to get away, do not block the bear's escape route!



When an injury occurs, initiate care with available resources at scene and notify DIVS. The DIVS shall coordinate the incident and direct necessary actions. The following steps shall be taken to mitigate the incident:

- Determine the nature of the emergency.
- If the emergency is a medical injury/illness, determine if the injury/illness is life threatening.
- 3. If the injury is life threatening, then clear designated frequency for emergency traffic.
- 4. Identify the on-scene point of contact by position.
- 5. Ensure that the Medical Unit Leader is contacted immediately.
- 6. Identify number injured, patient assessment(s) and location (geographic and/or GPS coordinates).
- 7. Identify on-scene medical personnel by position and last name (i.e. EMT Jones).
- 8. Identify preferred method of patient transport.
- Determine any additional resources or equipment needed.

The Evacuation Plan should be continually evaluated, and contingencies developed in the event the first plan is not effective.






Corral Incident Base Camp Map 8/26/13 Not to scale
