- Keep the fire within its currently identified perimeter and south of Wentworth Springs Rd, to Mosquito Pass, and road systems N16A, N20A, N08, and N21.
- Keep the fire within its currently identified perimeter and east of County Highway E16 and Fiddletown.
- Keep the fire within its currently identified perimeter and west of the El Dorado County, Alpine County and State Line boundary.



### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Today will be a heads up day as southwest winds begin to increase ahead of an approaching upper trough from the west. Temperatures will be a little lower, and RH a little higher from previous days. Winds increase further Sunday night and Monday as the trough begins to move onshore. Southwest winds gusting as high as 45 mph are possible starting Monday afternoon, continuing through Monday night, leading to critical fire weather conditions. A cold front will move through the fire area late Monday night/early Tuesday morning.

### FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems with Ponderosa, Jeffrey Pine, Incense Cedar, and manzanita in the lower elevations towards the west, transitioning up into an Upper Montane forest of Ponderosa, Lodgepole Pine and Red Fir closer to Lake Tahoe. Anticipate heavy fuel loading, drought stress, overstocked timber stands, and a lack of fire history to both the north and south of the current fire footprint. The El Dorado National Forest is currently classified as 'Extreme to Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components exceeding the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile, not far off all time high levels. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day. Fine dead fuel moisture is calculated at 3% or less.

**General:** Dryness remains with a gradual uptick in SW winds today before tomorrow's frontal passage. Fire Weather Watch is in effect for Monday due to strong winds from the SW. Anticipate north and eastern containment lines to be tested today and especially tomorrow.

### SPECIFIC

**Branch 1** Dry flow will do its best to bring heat sources back to life for the western side of the fire. Potential for increased smoke production from needle cast burning interior to aid fire movement to green island jackpots.

#### **Branch 3**

*Divisions India and Mike including the Smith Fire* have scattered heat that will produce smoke across the interiors, with more persistence in working through rocked out areas adjacent to the Desolation Wilderness. Repopulation in the Highway 50 corridor may bring an increase in service calls; potential for reburn remains in the green islands.

*Divisions Quebec and Romeo* Favorable winds for Romeo, some smoke across lines, isolated single and group tree torching and short-range spotting in the Caples/Strawberry Creek drainages and recent burn ops areas within Quebec with the very low afternoon humidity. Expect more winds across holding lines south of DP69.

*Divisions Oscar and Papa* do have high severity fire areas in the interior, but the edges are more mosaic severity so reburning and flare ups with threats to containment lines and adjacent communities are still possible. Low relative humidity will likely have heavies and root wads burning again, producing smoke visible to residents.

**Night Operations:** Anticipate continuation of service calls with residents back in their homes down Highway 50; interior fire glows will be highly visible from Highway 88 as well. Stay vigilant with the potential for reburn in the dirty burn areas due to drought conditions.

### **AIR OPERATIONS:**

Potential for some turbulence late in the shift due to increasing winds ahead of the frontal passage.

### **SAFETY:**

Heads up for a Fire Weather Watch that is in effect for Monday afternoon into the night. Potential for upgrade to a Red Flag Warning for strong SW winds associated with a frontal passage to the North.

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### Hazards & Risks

**ATV/UTV Safety:** UTV & ATV's are great fireline tools to expedite equipment and personnel movement around more remote areas of the fire, HOWEVER there are regulations that govern the operation and safety of the vehicles. Operators (drivers) must have had the appropriate level of training by their agency. Also, per Forest Service:

*FS – UTV Helmet (for fire use) – must meet the policy within the Safety Handbook (6709.11), Chapter 70, 71.12; Exhibit 01 states "Specialized Equipment, such as ATVs, UTVs, Dirt Bikes, Snowmobiles (Department of Transportation-approved helmet)." **Wearing hardhats while driving or riding on a UTV is not allowed.** Forest Service policy provides no exception to the helmet requirement for low speeds, smooth travel surfaces, or administrative use. UTV Helmet (for fire use) requirements are the same as ATV use. Helmets must meet Snell, or DOT ANSI certification. A 3/4 face model meeting Snell or DOT certification is acceptable for use. Use of half "shorty" helmets requires a JHA/RA for fireline use approved by the Incident Commander or relevant Line Officer and must include justification for its use.*

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

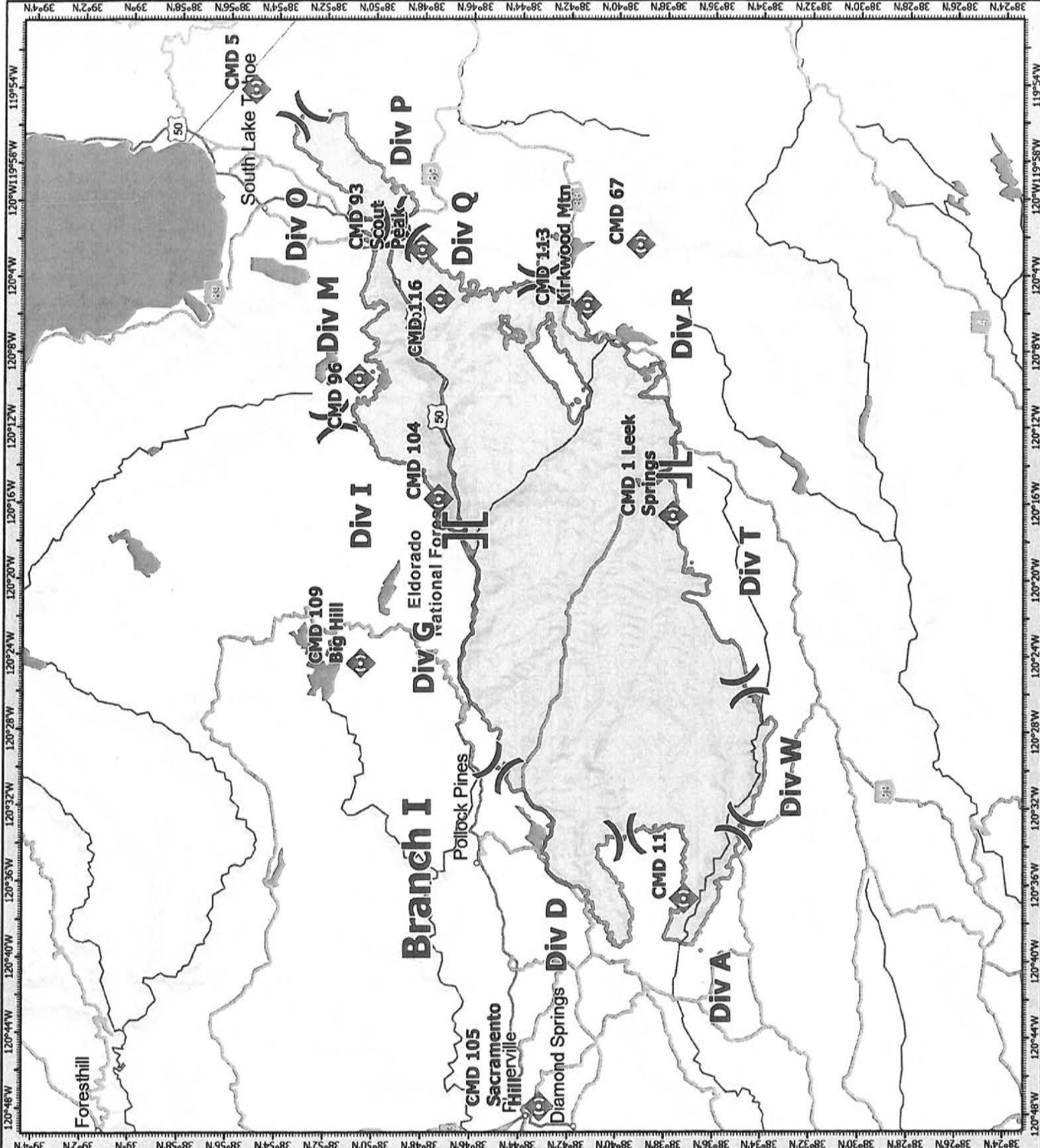

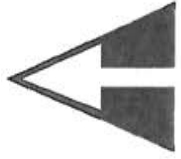

Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority

- **Nov. 22:** Federal employees must be fully vaccinated

In the coming days, Pandemic Coordinators will be following up with their agency or staff office regarding how we will collect this information in a way that maintains privacy while also meeting new federal reporting requirements.

# Hotel Acquisition Process

The Caldor incident has authorized the individual procurement of hotel accommodations. This is for lodging only. The process below discusses financial procedure and documentation:

If you are a **local agency dispatched through CFAA**, you will need to acquire an S# prior to demob. This number will also be entered on your F42 form.

**Federal resources with a travel card** will be processed through your agency's travel reimbursement process. Finance will provide a 213 with approval statement upon demob, if required by your agency.

*All other non-federal resources, or federal resources that do not have purchasing capability, complete the following:*

**AD's who are able to pay** and get reimbursed for travel will need to pay lodging and get reimbursed through your normal reimbursement process. You will be given a 213 with authorization statement from the finance section during demob.

**For AD's and Seasonal Federal Employees who are unable to pay** for lodging, the buying team may be able to assist with purchasing your accommodations. Inquire with the incident Finance Section. Federal resources who have the crew boss card option should use this as a first option.

In accordance with each individual contract, **contractors** shall pay for lodging and submit receipts for additions to your invoice (OF-286). Itemized receipts ARE required by the finance section during demob. Also, please note that double occupancy may be required on many contracts.

The finance section will provide S#'s during your demob or sooner.

If you're not in one of these categories or uncertain, finance can help you check. Please use the hotline number: 530-330-5450 or email [2021.Caldor.finance@firenet.gov](mailto:2021.Caldor.finance@firenet.gov). If emailing include your resource number, type of resource and contact phone number.

### *West side, Branch 1: Accommodations*

Resources working the west side of the incident and briefing at the El Dorado Fairgrounds are expected to be self-sufficient for dinners and hotel accommodations. Breakfast, sack lunches, and hydration products will be provided at briefing. There is no need to return to the fairgrounds until the next briefing unless you need additional support services.

### *East side, Branch 3: All meals provided by the incident. To Acquire lodging:*

Harvey's hotel is associated with Harrah's. They are across the street from each other and are joined by a tunnel under Hwy 50 on the Nevada side at the state line. They have opened the Harvey's hotel specifically for firefighters battling the Caldor fire. No public is staying at that property. **Hotel support and check in for Harvey's Hotel, including front desk services is located at the Harrah's property.** This includes check-in and any maintenance service. Large vehicle parking is at the large parking lot at Harrah's accessible off Lake Parkway. Small vehicles can access the parking structure at Harvey's. At both locations, collect the parking stub to go through the gate. There is no charge for parking. Exit gates will open from 0500 to 0700. You may still use your hotel card or ring for attendant to open the exit gate if needed.

**To reserve a room, scan this code to make your reservation.** Be sure to have your purchase card and crew manifest ready to enter the names of the personnel for each room configuration purchased with that card:



After reserving, go to the Harrah's front desk and complete registration. They are very understaffed, so please make every attempt to use the web link above to reserve, though you may also call the hotel desk at 775-691-0416 to reserve your room under "Caldor Fire".

Once you check in to the hotel on the Harrah's side, you will then proceed to Harvey's either through the underground tunnel or drive to the Harvey's parking structure. Note: the elevator bank closest to the (currently closed) Harvey's front desk is not in service for ascending (Descending works). You will need to use the Mountain Tower elevator bank by the arcade.

The hotel asks that if you would like trash pickup, please place your trash bags in the hallway and call the front desk to let them know where it is. They don't have enough staff to patrol the halls. They are also available to clean rooms and deliver towels and other items, but you will need to call the front desk for that as well.

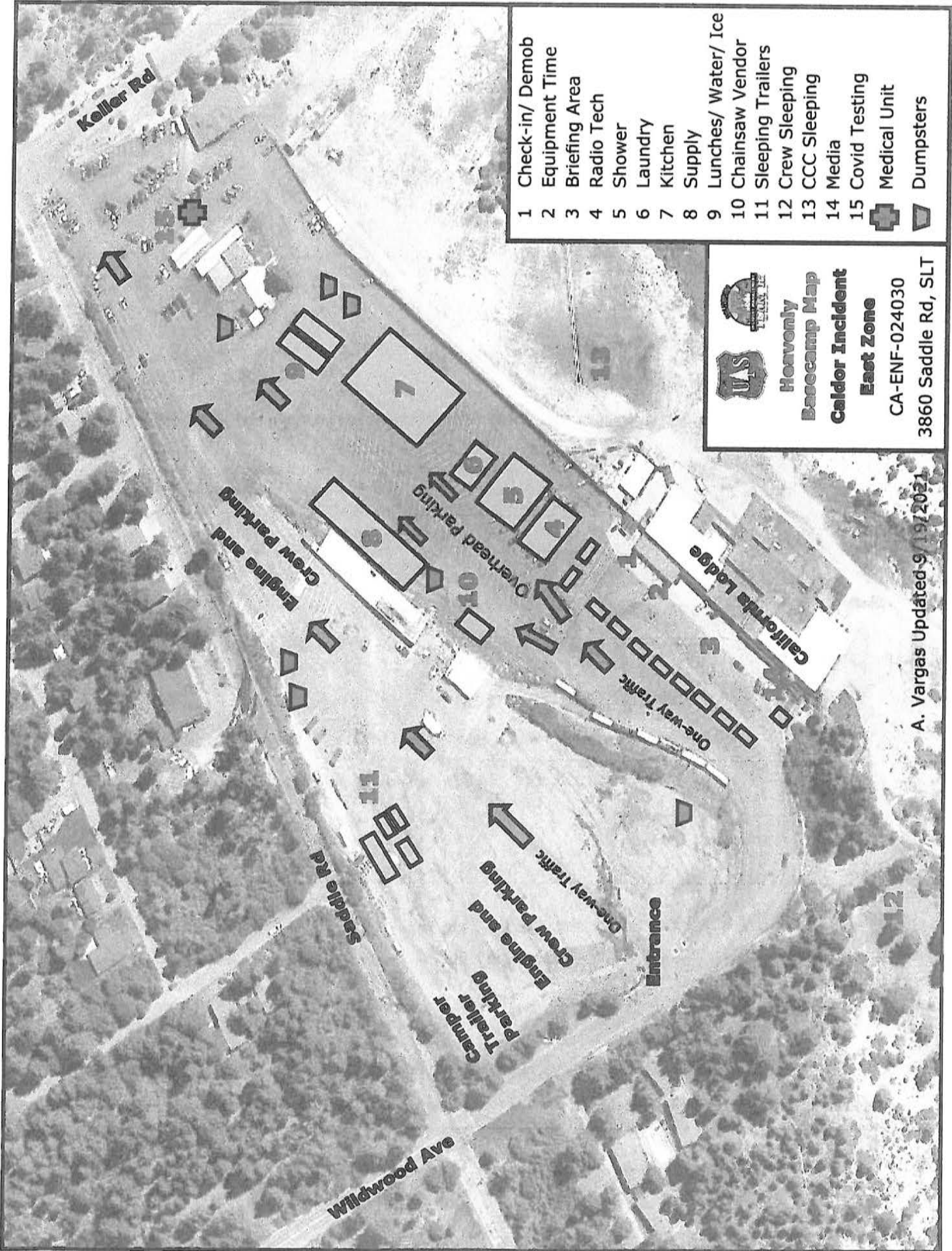

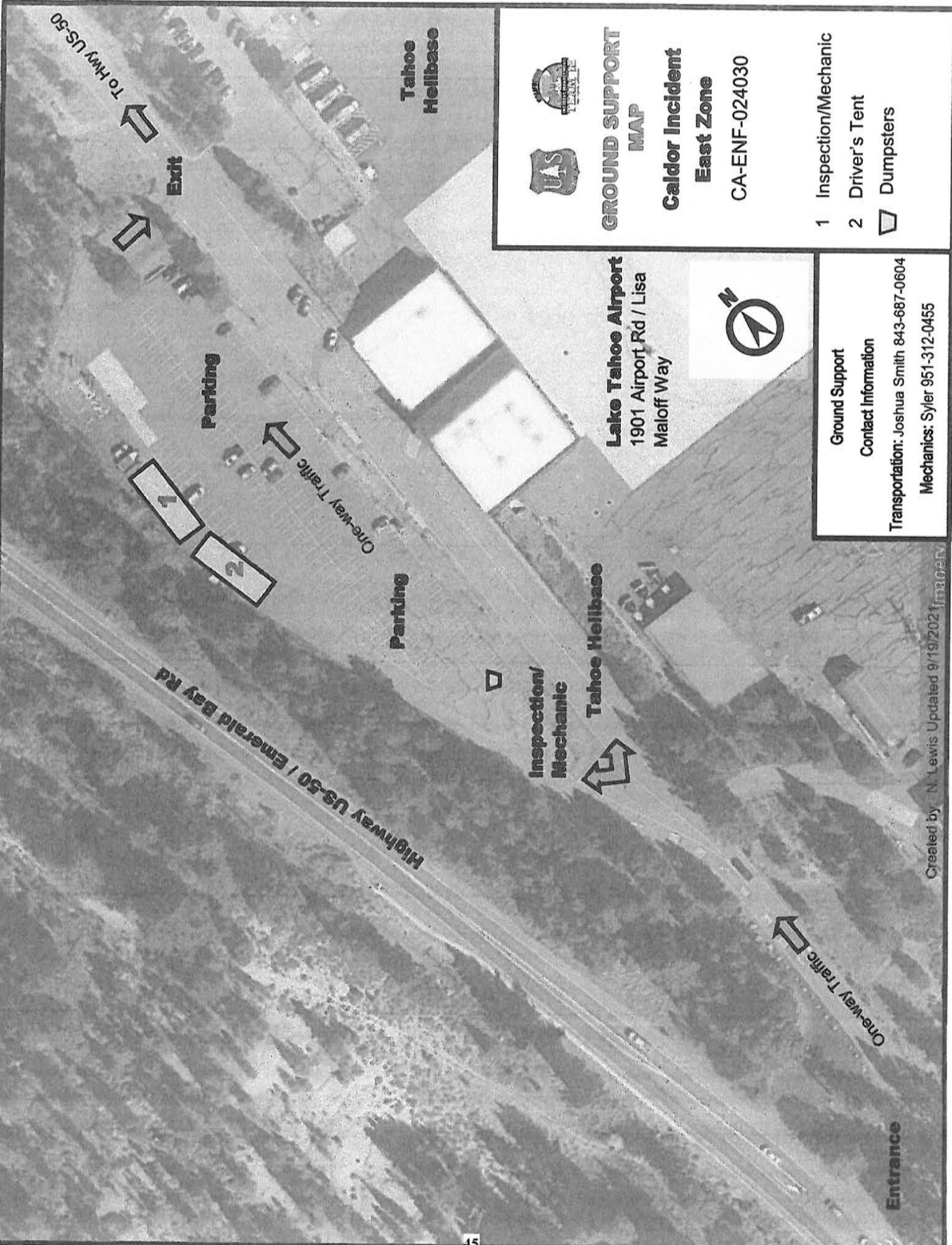

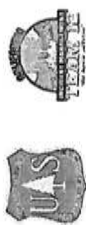
